— DIRECTIONS ON PROCESSING OF THE CIDP

Hon. Members, Standing Order 219 provides that *pursuant to the provisions of Section 126 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, the County Executive Committee Member responsible for Planning shall, at least once in every five years, prepare and submit to the Assembly, the draft County Integrated Development Plan.*

Standing Order 219 (2) further provides that the Speaker shall cause the draft County Integrated Development Plan to be laid before the County Assembly, upon which it shall be deemed to have been committed to each Sectoral Committee without question put.

Hon. Members, upon such laying and committal, each committee shall deliberate upon the County Integrated Development Plan according to its respective mandate and, within **twenty one days**, submit their views to the County Finance, Budget and Appropriations Committee.

Hon. Members, the County Finance, Budget and Appropriations Committee shall then consider and review the County Integrated Development Plan and make recommendations to the Assembly, taking into account the views of the Sectoral Committees, the Executive Committee Member in charge of Planning and the views from the public.

Hon. Members, Standing Order 219 (6) in keeping with the strict timelines for consideration of the CIDP provides that *within ninety days following the submission of the County Integrated Development Plan by the Executive Committee Member in charge of Planning, the Assembly shall consider and may, by resolution, adopt the County Integrated Development Plan with or without amendments.*

Hon. Members, the CIDP now stands committed to the various Sectoral Committees per their mandates for consideration and timely Reporting.

It is so directed.
