8. *.MOTION - HON. PIUS MBONO, MCA

THAT AWARE, that Article 175(b) of the Constitution on the principles of devolved government provides that county governments shall have reliable sources of revenue to enable them govern and deliver services effectively; **NOTING** that street vendors or business people commonly referred to as hawkers have the potential to contribute immensely to the City's revenue streams and create job opportunities if the sector is well managed; **DEEPLY CONCERNED** that frequent violent confrontations between City askaris and hawkers has not solved the challenges associated with the sector and only worsened the situation; **FURTHER NOTING** that various back streets and avenues remain underutilized in terms of the potential for street vending e.g. Aru Lane, Gaberone, Taveta and lanes joining Kirinyaga and Lower Kirinyaga roads; this Assembly urges the County Executive to rehabilitate these streets and lanes and utilize them to provide space for street vendors within certain strict parameters per planning requirements and operating timelines for instance from 5.30pm to 5.30am at least two days a week etc.

<u>NOTICES</u>

The Assembly resolved on Thursday, February 15, 2018 as follows:-

I. THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on any Motion, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:- A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

IT IS NOTIFIED that the Assembly Business Committee, at their last meeting, approved the following <u>tentative</u> business to appear in the Order Paper for Tuesday, March 20, 2018:-

A. MOTION - HON. PIUS MBONO, MCA

THAT AWARE, that part of the Nairobi City County Governor's seven (7) point Agenda is the improvement of traffic management within the CBD, promotion of an enabling environment for job creation, business growth and wealth creation; **OBSERVING** that the attainment of the foregoing might prove difficult given the limited parking space in the City centre, a major contributor to traffic snarl ups and gridlock; **NOTING** that the County has several vacant lots, for instance the parking adjacent to the Supreme Court and many others, which remain underutilized; **APPRECIATING** that some of the plots are utilized as temporary markets over the weekend such as Maasai Market; **FURTHER NOTING** that the plots have the potential to greatly help the City ease congestion by creating additional parking and thus new revenue streams; this Assembly urges the County Executive to consider developing multi-storey parking lots through public private partnerships in all available County plots within the greater CBD to create additional parking space and generate additional crucial revenues as well as create job opportunities.
