8. *<u>MOTION</u> – HON. NANCY MUTHAMI, MCA

Subject: Maintenance of high standards of sanitation and beautification of hotels in the County

THAT, aware that Article 42 of the Constitution 2010, provides for the right for every person to have a clean and healthy environment including the protection of environment for the benefit of the current and future generations; further aware that Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provides for the functions of the County Government which include amongst others implementation of specific National Government policies on Natural Resources and environmental conservation; recognizing that Section 5 of the Nairobi City County Solid Waste Management Act, 2015 provided that every person within the County is entitled to a clean and healthy environment and has a duty to safeguard and enhance the quality of the environment; concerned that recent months have witnessed increased cases of food contamination leading to deaths and hospitalization of Kenyans which has cast doubts on just how safe the food and foodstuffs are handled in the County, such cases have mostly been reported to emanate from hotels, both high end and outside catering firms serving food at social events; further concerned that environment around some hotels in the County are below the required standards of sanitation and environmental beautification; noting that an optimal clean environment is vital in creating a hotel environment that leaves guests feeling satisfied, pampered and special, thus improving not only the image of the hotel but the City at large, this Assembly urges the County Executive to enforce the existing laws on food handling and environmental beautification by hotels to ensure clean and healthy environment in the County specially during festival period.

<u>NOTICES</u>

I. The Assembly resolved on Wednesday, 13th February, 2019 as follows: -

a) THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on any Motion, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:-A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

IT IS NOTIFIED that the Select Committee on Assembly Business, at its last meeting, approved the following <u>tentative</u> business to appear in the Order Paper for Tuesday, 12th November 2019: -

A. *MOTION – HON. KABIRO MBUGUA, MCA.

Subject: A policy on Non-Motorized Transport

THAT, aware that under the Article 186 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya, and Fourth Schedule, the functions and powers of County Government, among others, covers County transport including county roads, street lighting, public road transport traffic and parking; further aware that recent years have witnessed an increase in the population working and residing within the Nairobi City County who use bicycles, handcarts, walking and other non-motorized transport modes; concerned that plans throughout the city for new roads construction and upgrades have only partially provided physical infrastructure for non-motorized users, who are at greater risk of accidents as they share a common right of way with motorized transport; further concerned that encroachment of nonmotorized transport spaces is rampant and vulnerable road users, women and children have difficulties travelling without assistance; noting that non-motorized transport is of significant in the County, more particularly as they can be used as an effective form of mobility for short trips and for last mile connectivity to the proposed mass transportation systems such as the Bus rapid transit systems; further noting that the previous County Government had started developing a policy on non-motorized transport, this Assembly urges the County Executive to move with speed and conclude the development of the proposed County Non-motorized policy to provide the non-motorized users with appropriate space and facilities to enjoy their freedom of safe movement, which is a fundamental human right.
