***Subject: Establishment of parkings for motorbikes and bicycles in the C.B.D***

**THAT**, aware that Article 186 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, and paragraph 5 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provide for the functions and powers of County Government on County transport including regulation of county roads, street lighting, public road transport traffic and parking; further aware that the Nairobi City County has designated preferential parking zones and bus termini throughout the City with parking restrictions for each zone; noting that recent years have witnessed a marked increase in the use of motorbikes and bicycles in the County; concerned that the Nairobi City County Government has no designated and cleared marked parking slots for motorbikes and bicycles in the County and especially in the Central Business District (C.B.D); noting that the available parkings are meant for vehicles only yet the County Government collect revenue from motorbikes in the C.B.D, this Assembly urges the County Executive to establish well-marked parking areas for motorbikes and bicycles in the Central Business District to ease the pressure on the available spaces, provide efficient parking services to motorists and boost revenue collection for the County.

## **Tentative business for Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> November, 2019**

IT IS NOTIFIED that the Select Committee on Assembly Business, at its last meeting, approved the following ***tentative*** business to appear in the Order Paper for Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> November 2019: -

**A. \*MOTION – HON. NANCY MUTHAMI, MCA**

***Subject: Maintenance of high standards of sanitation and beautification of hotels in the County***

**THAT**, aware that Article 42 of the Constitution 2010, provides for the right for every person to have a clean and healthy environment including the protection of environment for the benefit of the current and future generations; further aware that Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provides for the functions of the County Government which include amongst others implementation of specific National Government policies on Natural Resources and environmental conservation; recognizing that Section 5 of the Nairobi City County Solid Waste Management Act, 2015 provided that every person within the County is entitled to a clean and healthy environment and has a duty to safeguard and enhance the quality of the environment; concerned that recent months have witnessed increased cases of food contamination leading to deaths and hospitalization of Kenyans which has cast doubts on just how safe the food and foodstuffs are handled in the County, such cases have mostly been reported to emanate from hotels, both high end and outside catering firms serving food at social events; further concerned that environment around some hotels in the County are below the required standards of sanitation and environmental beautification; noting that an optimal clean environment is vital in creating a hotel environment that leaves guests feeling satisfied, pampered and special, thus improving not only the image of the hotel but the City at large, this Assembly urges the County Executive to enforce the existing laws on food handling and environmental beautification by hotels to ensure clean and healthy environment in the County specially during festival period.
