**8. \*PROCEDURAL MOTION – (The Leader of the Majority Party)**

**Subject: Limitation of Debate on Reports**

**THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, a Sessional Paper or any other Report submitted to the Assembly, be limited as follows: - A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.

**9. \*MOTION – (Hon. Maurice Gari, MCA – Member of the County Assembly Service Board)****Subject: Adoption of the Report of the County Assembly Service Board**

**THAT**, pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 4 of the First schedule to the County Assemblies Service Act, 2017 and Standing Order 47 (3), this Assembly approves the **REPORT OF THE COUNTY ASSEMBLY SERVICE BOARD ON THE VETTING AND APPOINTMENT OF FATUMA ADEN AFFEY(DR) AND WILLIS OKELO OLUOCH AS FOURTH AND FIFTH MEMBERS OF THE NAIROBI CITY COUNTY ASSEMBLY SERVICE BOARD RESPECTIVELY**, laid on Table of the Assembly on Wednesday, 19<sup>th</sup> February, 2020.

**10. \*PROCEDURAL MOTION – (The Leader of the Majority Party)****Subject: Adoption of the County Assembly Calendar – Fourth Session**

**THAT**, pursuant to the provision of Standing Order 29(1), this Assembly approves the Calendar of the Assembly (Regular Sessions) for the Fourth Session of the Assembly, as contained in the Schedule attached to the Order Paper.

**11. \*PROCEDURAL MOTION – (The Leader of the Majority Party)****Subject: Limitation of Debate on Bills Sponsored by Parties or Committees**

**THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on **Bills** sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

**12. \*PROCEDURAL MOTION – (The Leader of the Majority Party)****Subject: Limitation of Debate on Individual Members' Bills**

**THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on **Bills NOT** sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party be limited as follows: - A maximum of three hours and thirty minutes, with not more than thirty (30) minutes for the Mover, in moving and ten (10) minutes in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee and a maximum of ten (10)

minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

**13. \*PROCEDURAL MOTION – (The Leader of the Majority Party)**

**Subject: Limitation of Debate on Motions**

**THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:-A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

**14. \*PROCEDURAL MOTION – (The Leader of the Majority Party)**

**Subject: Limitation of Debate on the Motion on the Address by the Governor**

**THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4) and in furtherance to the provisions of Standing Order 25(5), this Assembly orders that debate on the **Motion on the Address by the Governor** be limited to no more than five (5) minutes for each Member Speaking, thirty (30) minutes for the Mover in moving and replying and twenty (20) minutes for the Leader of Minority Party.

**15. \*PROCEDURAL MOTION – (The Leader of the Majority Party)**

**Subject: Limitation of Debate on the Adjournment Motion**

**THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, the debate on **any Motion for the Adjournment** of the Assembly to a day other than the next normal Sitting Day in accordance with the Calendar of the Assembly, be limited to a maximum of three (3) hours with not more than five (5) minutes for each Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader

of the Minority Party, in that order. Provided that, when the period of Recess proposed by any such motion does not exceed ten (10) days, the debate shall be limited to a maximum of thirty minutes (30), and shall be strictly confined to the question of the adjournment.

# **NOTICE PAPER I**

## **Tentative business for Thursday, 20<sup>th</sup> February, 2020**

*(Published pursuant to Standing Order 39(1))*

IT IS NOTIFIED that the Select Committee on Assembly Business, at its last meeting, approved the following ***tentative*** business to appear in the Order Paper for Thursday, 20<sup>th</sup> February, 2020: -

### **A. \*MOTION – HON. JAMES MWANGI WAMBUI, MCA**

*Subject: Policy for buildings to have rainwater collection and storage systems*

**THAT**, aware that Article 43 (1) (d) of the Constitution, 2010 states that every person has a right to clean and safe water in adequate quantities; further aware that paragraph 11 (b) of the Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution stipulates that County Government is to provide County public works and services including water and sanitation services; recognizing the provisions of Paragraph 8 of part two of the Forth Schedule of the Constitution, 2010 which states that county planning and development including housing is a function of the county government; concerned that most parts of the County especially informal settlements lack clean, safe, sufficient and affordable water, which has led to introduction of rationing of water by the Nairobi City Water and Sewerage Company and untreated water supply businesses within the County; acknowledging that the Nairobi City Water and Sewerage Company has continuously rehabilitated various sources of its water to ensure clean and adequate water supply in the County; noting that the increasing population in the County implies increasing demand for basic amenities such as water supply, which the County is unable to meet with the current water supply strategies; further noting that with proper planning, harvesting and storage, rain water can greatly supplement piped water in the County, this Assembly urges the County Executive to develop a policy to compel all owners of buildings in the County to ensure that all buildings are fixed with rainwater collection and storage systems to provide water harvesting and conservation in the County.
