Subject: Illegal road closures in the Estate

THAT, aware that the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 under Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule provides for roads as a function of the County Governments, whose purview primarily deals with County Roads under the enabling legislation; **NOTING** that the Nairobi Metropolitan Service (NMS) and the County Government, as well as the National Government have provided support which has seen various roads across the County Tarmacked or brought to motorable standards to the great benefit of residents; **DEEPLY** concerned that in some Estates across the City, Residents Associations have instead blocked off access and easements on the newly paved roads, under the pretext of security measures, effectively privatizing public roads and greatly inconveniencing other users; **RECOGNIZING** that some of the Residents Associations are demanding gate passes, or even charging for road use and erecting various barriers preventing some vehicles and pedestrian traffic from accessing the said public roads; **AWARE** that the Assembly in 2014 passed a Resolution requiring that all barriers erected on public roads within residential areas be removed without conditions and the same opened to public use; **REITERATING** that while the County took action to implement this Resolution, seven years have since lapsed and Residents Associations seem to have gone back to business as usual, with every estate currently with public access roads now blocked or barriers erected and passage only possible through gate passes; this Assembly **RESOLVES** that the County Executive

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in conjunction with the Nairobi Metropolitan Services take immediate action to remove any barriers erected on public roads within the residential estates with a view to restoring such roads to public use and to ensure no such barriers are erected in future on public roads without the County's authority.

THAT, pursuant to the provisions of Standing Orders 28 and 29 (3), this Assembly adjourns until **Tuesday, 8th February, 2022**, in accordance with the Calendar of the County Assembly (Regular Sessions).

NOTICES

I. The Assembly resolved on Tuesday, 9th February, 2021 as follows: -

- a) **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:-A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.
- b) **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on **Bills NOT** sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party be limited as follows:- A maximum of three hours and thirty minutes, with not more than thirty (30) minutes for the Mover, in moving and ten (10) minutes in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.
- c) **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, a Sessional Paper or any other Report submitted to the Assembly, be limited as follows: - A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.
