

COUNTY GOVERNMENT OF NAIROBI CITY SECOND ASSEMBLY - SECOND SESSION NAIROBI CITY COUNTY ASSEMBLY VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS TUESDAY, MARCH 20, 2018

- **1.** The House assembled at Thirty minutes past Two O'clock.
- **2.** The Proceedings were opened with Prayer.
- 3. NOTICE OF MOTION (Hon. Osman Adow, MCA)

THAT, aware that solid waste management in the County pose a great environmental and health challenge; FURTHER AWARE that Paragraph (2)(g) of part two of the Forth Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides for refuse removal, refuse dumps and solid waste disposal as a County function; CONCERNED that the implementation of solid waste management faces numerous challenge especially from the residential areas due to lack of a proper designated area for holding solid waste; FURTHER CONCERNED that improper solid waste management is an emerging health threat to the residents of Nairobi County, the environment and well-being of the city; ACKNOWLEDGING that solid waste management is a collective responsibility that requires all the generators to ensure the environment free from Health risk; NOTING that most residential Buildings and Estates in the County have no designated waste collection and holding area; this Assembly urges the County Executive to ensure all building plans with more than 4 stories to incorporate solid waste management chutes in their architectural plans and building with less than 4 stories to incorporate a designated solid waste holding area for temporary collection henceforth.

4. STATEMENTS PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER 45(2)(c)

Pursuant to Standing Order 45 (2) (c) the following Member requested for a statement:-

- i. Hon. Osman Adow requested for a statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Culture and Community Services regarding rehabilitation of Social halls in Eastleigh North Ward.
- ii. Hon. June Ndegwa requested for a statement from the Chairperson of the SectoralCommittee onCulture and Community Services regarding perennial flooding and disaster response in the City whenever it rains.

5. MOTION- HON. PIUS MBONO, MCA

THAT AWARE, that Article 175(b) of the Constitution on the principles of devolved government provides that county governments shall have reliable sources of revenue to enable them govern and deliver services effectively; NOTING that street vendors or business people commonly referred to as hawkers have the potential to contribute immensely to the City's revenue streams and create job opportunities if the sector is well managed; DEEPLY CONCERNED that frequent violent confrontations between City askaris and hawkers has not solved the challenges associated with the sector and only worsened the situation; FURTHER NOTING that various back streets and avenues remain underutilized in terms of the potential for street vending e.g. Aru Lane, Gaberone, Taveta and lanes joining Kirinyaga and Lower Kirinyaga roads; this Assembly urges the County Executive to rehabilitate these streets and lanes and utilize them to provide space for street vendors within certain strict parameters per planning requirements and operating timelines for instance from 5.30pm to 5.30am at least two days a week etc.

Debate ensued; Motion interrupted;
