1. The Assembly assembled at thirty minutes past Two O'clock.
2. The Proceedings were opened with Prayer.

**QUORUM OF THE ASSEMBLY**

The presiding Chair (Hon. Evans Otiso, MCA) having confirmed that there was no Quorum caused the Bell to be rung for Ten minutes.

There being no Quorum at the expiry of the ten minutes, the bell was rung for a further five minutes.

There being a Quorum at the expiry of the five minutes, presiding Chair (Hon. Evans Otiso, MCA) called the Assembly to order.

**3. COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR:- GRANT OF EXTENSION OF TIME FOR THE TABLING OF THE PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE'S REPORT**

The Chair issued the following communication: -

**“Hon. Members**, you will recall that during the sitting of Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> September, 2019, the Chair of the Public Accounts Committee rose on a point of order, and sought the Chair's indulgence for the extension of time for the Committee's consideration and tabling of pending Reports before the Committee.

**Hon. Members**, the Chair is in formal receipt of a request from the Select Committee on Public Accounts in compliance with House rules, for the grant of an additional thirty-five days (35) extension period for the consideration of the Reports of the Auditor General and tabling of said pending Reports.

**Honorable Members**, the Committee having complied with the requirements of the House for tabling such request is therefore granted thirty-five days (35) to complete its work and table its report.

The Report should be tabled on or before 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2019. It is so directed.

#### **4. NOTICE OF MOTION – (Hon. James Mwangi)**

**THAT**, aware that Article 43 (1) (d) of the Constitution, 2010 states that every person has a right to clean and safe water in adequate quantities; further aware that paragraph 11 (b) of the Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution stipulates that County Government is to provide County public works and services including water and sanitation services; recognizing the provisions of Paragraph 8 of part two of the Forth Schedule of the Constitution, 2010 which states that county planning and development including housing is a function of the county government; concerned that most parts of the County especially informal settlements lack clean, safe, sufficient and affordable water, which has led to introduction of rationing of water by the Nairobi City Water and Sewerage Company and untreated water supply businesses within the County; acknowledging that the Nairobi City Water and Sewerage Company has continuously rehabilitated various sources of its water to ensure clean and adequate water supply in the County; noting that the increasing population in the County implies increasing demand for basic amenities such as water supply, which the County is unable to meet with the current water supply strategies; further noting that with proper planning, harvesting and storage, rain water can greatly supplement piped water in the County, this Assembly urges the County Executive to develop a policy to compel all owners of buildings in the County to ensure that all buildings are fixed with rainwater collection and storage systems to provide water harvesting and conservation in the County.
