**5. MOTION: MOTION OF ADJOURNMENT ON A MATTER OF DEFINITE COUNTY IMPORTANCE (PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER 34)**

Motion moved

**THAT AWARE** that the County Assembly is established under Article 174 of the Constitution, with the power to make law, oversight and represent; **NOTING** that that the County Assembly depends on the Exchequer for the running of its operations, where the County Assembly relies on an appropriated annual Budget for the same; **RECOGNIZING** that the expenditure of sums voted by this House is the preserve of the Accounting officer who in the case of the County Assembly is the Office of the Clerk of the county Assembly; **DEEPLY CONCERNED** that the affairs of the County Assembly have ground to a halt due to the Accounting Officer's inability to operate the Assembly's finances as held at the Central Bank of Kenya because of actions by Officers of the County Assembly who have refused to hand over despite being out of office; **REGRETTING** that the Assembly now risks shutting down since Members are suffering, being unable to access monies for Ward rents, imprests and per diems; **AND WHEREAS** the Assembly cannot be held at ransom and Members suffer because of actions of officers, this Assembly adjourns pursuant to Standing Order 34 to discuss the imminent collapse of the County Assembly for its inability to fund its operations.

**6. MOTION: - MEASURES TO IDENTIFY, TRAIN AND EQUIP NYUMBA KUMI MEMBERS ON HANDLING FIRE OUTBREAKS AND EMERGENCIES**

Motion moved and Question proposed -

**THAT**, aware that Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provides for firefighting services and disaster management as a function of the County Governments: **DEEPLY CONCERNED** that there is increasingly numerous cases of fire outbreaks, particularly affecting markets and informal settlements across the county; **NOTING** that these fire outbreaks have caused heavy losses for residents, some of whom have had these incidents affect them repeatedly; **RECOGNIZING** that if the County Executive were to take measures to ensure fire safety precautions are taken in all markets and informal settlements it would help curb the scope of damage caused by the repetitive fires since the response will be timely; **REALIZING** that these measures ought to include mapping out hot spots across informal settlements and markets where the repetitive fire outbreaks are notorious; **CONVINCED** that the County can do this by equipping Nyumba Kumi and select volunteers under it, with the necessary facilities such as fire extinguishers to act as first responders in case of fire or other emergency outbreaks; this Assembly urges the County Executive to urgently take measures to identify, train and equip Nyumba Kumi members and such volunteers under them with the necessary skills and equipment as appropriate to enable them to respond faster to fire and emergencies in Nairobi City County especially the informal settlements where rescue services take longer to respond.
