3. <u>NOTICE OF MOTION</u> – (Hon. Andrew Mbao)

THAT, aware that recent years have witnessed increased road accidents with more than three thousand Kenyans dying annually because of road accidents; noting that most accidents in Nairobi City County are caused by handcarts pushed or parked along the roads particularly at night; deeply concerned that most handcarts have no reflectors and often ply on the wrong side of the road which often gets drivers unaware and has been cited as a causation of many avoidable accidents within the County; aware that County transport including traffic, parking, public road transport is the function of a county government under Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution; acknowledging that every individual's life is prudent; this Assembly urges the County Government to move with speed and ensure that handcarts are installed with reflectors and bells and there is set a fixed working hours preferably from 6.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. to reduce the road carnage within the County.
