VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 17, 2015 AT 2.30 PM

1. The Assembly assembled at thirty nine minutes past Two O'clock.
2. The Proceedings were opened with Prayer.

QUORUM OF THE ASSEMBLY

The Chairperson of Committees having confirmed that there was no Quorum caused the Bell to be rung for Ten minutes.

There being no Quorum at the expiry of the ten minutes, the bell was rung for further five minutes.

3. COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR:-

The Chairperson of Committees conveyed the following communication;

“Honourable Members, welcome back from the short recess. It is my sincere hope that you had a wonderful and fruitful break. As we commence the last part of the Third Session, I wish to remind you of the business before us.

Hon. Members we will be considering pending business from the First part of the Third Session. These includes Motions, Statements, Bills and Petitions.

Specifically, several bills were pending before the Committees, awaiting the second reading. This includes:-

1. The Nairobi City County Door Control and Welfare Bill 2015;
2. The Nairobi City County Public Participation Bill 2015;
3. The Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities Bill, 2015; and
4. The Nairobi City County Community and Neighborhoods Association Engagement Bill 2015.

Hon. Members you will recall that the Nairobi City County Fire and Rescue Service Bill 2015 was withdrawn for further consultation.

Hon. Members, in order to expedite the disposal of pending business, the chair directs that all the Committees with pending reports move with speed to conclude and forward the same for debate in this Assembly.

Hon. Chairpersons and therefore notified that the Assembly Business Committee will move to allocate the pending Bills time for debate so long as the duration allowed for public participation has elapsed being 20 days whether a report has been presented or not.

Hon. Members I want to encourage you to continue working with the diligence you have exhibited in executing your mandate for the benefit of Nairobi residents.

Once again I warmly welcome you back from recess as we commence the last part of the Third Session directed by the chair.

5. NOTICE OF MOTION – (Hon. Rachel Kamweru)

THAT, aware that every person has the right to freedom and security which includes the right not to be subjected to any form of violence from either public or private sources; further aware that international laws and instruments such as Convention of Elimination of all forms Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), UN resolutions 1325 and 1820 deprecate violence against women as it impedes the advancement of women and maintains their subordinate status; noting that Maputo Protocol on the rights of women which states that parties shall adopt and implement appropriate measures to ensure the protection of every woman’s right to respect for her dignity and protection of women from all forms of violence, particularly sexual and verbal violence; deeply concerned that most survivors of sexual and gender based violence (SGBV) continue to lack post-trauma care due to lack of adequate shelters/safe houses; acknowledging that despite enactment of various laws

addressing Sexual and Gender Based Violence such as the Sexual Offences Act, 2006, Witness Protection Act 2006, Female Genital Mutilation Act, 2011, Victim Protection Act, 2014, Protection of Domestic Violence Act, 2015, there is high rate of sexual and gender based violence crimes with an equal or more number of survivors especially in Nairobi City County, this Assembly urges the County Executive to set aside funds to facilitate the construction of post-trauma care facilities and ensure existing ones are rehabilitated and equipped to offer temporary stay for survivors of Sexual and Gender Based Violence (GBV) in Nairobi City County
