### 3. STATEMENTS PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER 41(2)(c)

# Pursuant to Standing Order 41 (2) (c) the following requests to statements were given:-

- i. Hon. Mike Obonyo requested for a statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Planning and Housing regarding revoking of a lease of land LR. No. 27/8/18 located at Ridgeways, Kiambu Road;
- Hon. Ngaruiya Chege requested for a statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Health Services regarding the status of Kamiti Prison Health Center in Kahawa West Ward; and
- iii. Hon. Herman Azangu requested for a statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Labor and Social Services regarding the payment of youths who worked for the City County under Decentralization Department for a month in various Wards.
