VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

THURSDAY, MARCH 17, 2016

1. The Assembly assembled at Thirty Minutes past Two O'clock.
2. The Proceedings were opened with a word of Prayer.
3. **NOTICE OF MOTION - ADJOURNMENT OF THE ASSEMBLY UNDER STANDING ORDER NO.30 TO DISCUSS A MATTER OF DEFINITE COUNTY IMPORTANCE REGARDING CUTTING DOWN OF INDIGENOUS TREES ALONG MAJOR ROADS AND MANY OTHERS ESTATES ACROSS THE CITY**

Rising in his place on a Point of Order, Hon. 6. MOTION – TRANSFERRING OF EMPLOYEES IN THE REVENUE COLLECTION CHAIN WHO HAVE STAYED AT A POSTING FOR AT LEAST THREE YEARS

(Resumption of debate interrupted on Wednesday, 16th March, 2016)

THAT, aware that the Nairobi City County has the potential to collect revenue upwards of Kshs 4 billion per month as demonstrated by

the Governor during a recent breakfast meeting with Members of the County Assembly; noting that the Nairobi County e-payment system, the first cash-light system for a county government in Kenya, is yet to make significant impact due to man-made leakages at collection points; deeply concerned that the continued revenue leakage at various collection points is mostly through theft or inaction by County Employees charged with overseeing collection at those points; recognizing that some employees within the revenue collection chain have overstayed their deployment at specific postings, thus possibly building cartel like networks that protect and promote the leakage and wastage; this Assembly urges the County Executive to transfer with immediate effect employees in the revenue collection chain who have stayed at a posting for at least three years and adopt such practice going forward to prevent the formation of cartel like revenue leakage avenues by County employees.
