QUORUM OF THE ASSEMBLY

The Speaker having confirmed that there was no Quorum caused the Bell to be rung for Ten minutes.

3. STATEMENTS PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER 41(2)(c)

Pursuant to Standing Order 41 (2) (c) the following Member requested for a Statement:-

i. Hon. Samuel Nyang'wara requested for a statement from the Chairperson of the Select Committee on Implementation regarding the implementation of the resolutions of the Select Committee on Public Accounts on the report of the Auditor General on Financial Statements of the Nairobi City County for the FY 2012/13

Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 41 (2) (c) the following responses to Statements were issued:-

- 4. MOTION ESTABLISHMENT OF A GENDER BASED VIOLENCE DESK AND A WELL TRAINED STAFF AT CITY HALL TO MAKE USE OF ITS CENTRAL LOCATION AND SIGNIFICANCE WITHIN THE COUNTY

Motion made and Question proposed;

THAT, aware that Article 28 of the Constitution specifies that every person has inherent dignity and the right to have that dignity respected and protected; further aware that Article 25 (a) of the Constitution provides for freedom from torture and cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment; concerned that there has been an increase in incidences of Gender Based Violence and Sexual Gender Based Violence and there is a need for a Gender Based Violence Desk for reporting such cases and to also have trained staff able to deal with such delicate cases; noting that since several Police Stations established these desks many Gender Based Violence victims have come out and reported such cases and justice prevailed; this Assembly urges the County Executive to establish a Gender Based Violence Desk and a well trained staff at City Hall to make use of its central location and significance within the County.
