Subject: Adoption of the Report on an Inquiry

THAT, This Assembly adopts THE REPORT OF THE SECTORAL COMMITTEE ON HEALTH SERVICES ON THE INSPECTION VISIT TO QUIVER LOUNGE HELD ON 15TH MARCH, 2021, laid on the Table of the Assembly on, Tuesday, 8th June, 2021.

Subject: Development County Children Welfare Policy

THAT, aware that the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), is the most complete statement of children's rights ever produced and is the most widely-ratified international human rights treaty in history, ratification which Kenya is party to; noting that the Convention has 54 articles that cover all aspects of a child's life and set out the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights that all children everywhere are entitled to and also explains how adults and governments must work together to make sure all children enjoy all their rights; deeply concerned that ensuring child rights in Kenya is still a challenge, 26 years after ratification of the treaty, and efforts by the State to enforce these rights has not been sufficient as evidenced by rampant cases of abuse and neglect; Children Act, 2001 states that it is the duty of local authority, in this case the County Government, to safeguard and promote the right and welfare of children within its jurisdiction; recognizing that if County Governments do not supplement efforts to address Child Rights by National Government the implementation of the UNCRC charter will remain a mirage; Considering the huge mandate that the Nairobi City County has in respect to the Children, this Assembly urges that the County Executive Committee develop of a County Children Welfare Policy to provide for a full-fledged Children's Department to work hand in hand with National Government agencies in ensuring the protection of Child rights, welfare and related concerns within County.

*MOTION - HON. ESTHER WAITHERA CHEGE, MCA

Subject: a policy on Naming of Roads and other County facilities in the County

THAT, aware that Chapter Four of the Constitution 2010 provides for the Bill of Rights which is an integral part of Kenya's Democratic state and is the framework for social, economic and cultural policies; further aware that the purpose of recognising and protecting human rights and fundamental freedoms is to preserve the dignity of individuals and communities and to promote social justice and the realization of the potentials of all human beings; recognizing that several individuals have served the County at various levels with dedication and splendid work towards the betterment of Nairobi City County and its residents; concerned that such individuals have not been recognized for their outstanding performance in the public service in the County; noting that individuals have upheld the rights of others, serving the community above themselves and contributing to nation building through outstanding service and achievements, this Assembly urges the County Executive to develop a policy that provide for criteria to be used in naming of roads and other County facilities in the County in recognition and appreciation of the extraordinary acts of service made by individuals who performed tremendously in their works not only to the County but to the Country at large.

Subject: Establishment of a rehabilitation programs for youth on drugs and substance abuse in liaison with NACADA

AWARE that, Article 55 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides inter-alia that the State shall take measures, including affirmative action programmes to ensure that youth are protected from harmful cultural practice and exploitation; FURTHER AWARE that Article 21 (2) of the same Constitution dictates that all state organs and all public officers have the duty to address the needs of the vulnerable groups within the society including the youths; COGNIZANT that Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, provides for the functions and powers of the County Governments, which includes inter-alia control of drugs and pornography; DEEPLY **CONCERNED** that the rising number of youth indulging in drugs, substance abuse such as cannabis sativa, heroin, cocaine amongst others, with reasons for such ranging from dysfunctional families, peer influence, uncontrolled alcohol trading environment, unemployment, social media influence, stress, depression to mention a few; **DISTURBED** that failure by all the relevant stakeholders to reverse the growing trend of youth involving in alcohol, drugs and substance abuse, would see the County and the Nation lose an entire generation and this would have adverse effects on the moral fabric of the society as seen from the rising case of Sexual and Gender Based Violence, Suicides, Homicide, Femicide, Crime, Hopelessness, unstable marriages; ACKNOWLEDGING that the existence of the National Authority for Campaign Against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA), a State Corporation under the Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government, mandated to undertake public education and awareness against drug abuse; FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGING the need for top-bottom co-ordination approach by the National Government and the County Government as provided for in Article 189 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 in mitigating the young generation from drugs and substance abuse; this **ASSEMBLY RESOLVES** that the County Executive moves with speed and:-



- 1. To partner with the National Authority for Campaign Against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA) in developing programmes and policy for creation of awareness, treatment and rehabilitation of the Persons with Substance use Disorder (SUDs);
- 2. To initiate plans for the establishment of an affordable Rehabilitation and Rescue Centre to be equipped with qualified personnel and offer medical care to those already addicted; and
- 3. Anchor the said program and project in the County's Budget Estimates for the FY 2021/2022 for its timely implementation.
