\*MOTION – HON. PATRICIAH MUTHEU MUSYIMI, MCA

Subject: Measures to equip Informal Settlements with firefighting facilities

**THAT**, aware that Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provides for firefighting services and disaster management as a function of the County Governments: **DEEPLY CONCERNED** that there is increasingly numerous cases of fire outbreaks, particularly affecting markets and informal settlements across the county; NOTING that these fire outbreaks have caused heavy losses for residents, some of whom have had these incidents affect them repeatedly; **RECOGNIZING** that if the County Executive were to take measures to ensure fire safety precautions are taken in all markets and informal settlements it would help curb the scope of damage caused by the repetitive fires since the response will be timely; **REALIZING** that these measures ought to include mapping out hot spots across informal settlements and markets where the repetitive fire outbreaks are notorious; CONVINCED that the County can do this by equipping Nyumba Kumi and select volunteers under it, with the necessary facilities such as fire extinguishers to act as first responders in case of fire or other emergency outbreaks; this Assembly urges the County Executive to urgently take measures to identify, train and equip Nyumba Kumi members and such volunteers under them with the necessary skills and equipment as appropriate to enable them to respond faster to fire and emergencies in Nairobi City County especially the informal settlements where rescue services take longer to respond.

#### \*Motion – HON. JOHN MUTHIGA KAMAU, MCA

Subject: Notice prohibiting public transport PSVs from using roundabouts as termini, laybys and/or parking areas in contravention of the law

**THAT**, aware that Article 46 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides that consumers of goods and services have a right to protection, health, safety and economic interests, the Constitution in Part II of the Fourth Schedule apportions the parking and traffic aspects of transport functions to county governments; **COGNIZANCE** that Section 27 of the Nairobi City County Traffic Act 2020 prohibits PSVs from picking and dropping passengers at undesignated bus stops and Sections 46 and 47 of the Act prohibits persons from parking on public roads in a manner that impends traffic flow and strictly restricts parking to the designated areas, the sections particularly prohibits PSVs from using undesignated areas as parking prior to obtaining authority from the County; NOTING that in pursuit of the county beautification initiatives, the county has for years allocated and appropriated funds towards rehabilitation, greening and decoration of roundabouts including entering into maintenance agreements with private companies for the purpose of environmental ethics; **DEEPLY CONCERNED** that the persistent use of roundabouts by PSVs as termini has contributed to cause heavy gridlocks of traffic on key roads such as Outer Ring road on a daily basis leading to loss of productive time and loss of value for public money and investments; this assembly urges the County Executive and the Nairobi Metropolitan Services to:-

- 1. Issue a public notice prohibiting public transport PSVs from using roundabouts as termini, laybys and/or parking areas in contravention of the law;
- 2. Continuously enforce the foregoing prohibition notice using enforcement officers and the county and sub-county measures; and
- 3. Formulate the Nairobi City County Transport Act 2020 forthwith to provide for punitive measures to operators who illegally use roundabouts as termini, lay byes or parking.
