### \*<u>MOTION – HON. MOSES OGETO, MCA</u>

Subject: Development of a coherent and unified framework to integrate climate- smart actions and increase tree cover in the County

THAT, aware that the Climate change Act, 2016 being an Act of Parliament is intended to provide for regulatory framework for enhanced response to Climate change, to provide for mechanism and measures to achieve low carbon; FURTHER AWARE **THAT**; Nairobi in particular is gradually becoming vulnerable to the effects of climate change as a result of increased construction of buildings whose approvals by the County Government do not expressly obligate developers to set aside reasonable amount of space for tree cover; **COGNIZANT THAT**; the existing planning framework and building regulations need to integrate tree cover as key component for all prospective property developers whereby they must comply before constructions are approved and certificates of compliance issued; NOTING THAT; effects of climate change are real and lack of enough tree cover in the City will in the long run result into devastating effects that will impede the future generations from enjoying the benefits accruing from the natural environment; DEEPLY CONCERNED THAT; little or lack of vegetation cover increases air pollution which reduces quality of health and lowers the life expectancy; **OBSERVING THAT**, a clean and healthy environment is a right of every person; this ASSEMBLY URGES the County Executive in conjunction with the Nairobi Metropolitan Services (NMS) to urgently develop a coherent and unified framework that makes it necessary for all property developers and constructions within the City to strictly integrate climate-smart actions and obligatorily set aside reasonable amount of space to be used to enhance tree cover/vegetation in the City.

Subject: Construction, installation and unveiling of a statue in honour of the late Kenneth Matiba

THAT, aware that Article 186 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, and paragraph 5 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provide for the functions and powers of County Government on County transport including county roads, street lighting, public road transport traffic and parking; further aware that the Country has since independence been honouring her eminent citizens who have had remarkable contribution to the development of the Republic by not only naming or renaming facilities or roads after them but also unveiling of statues that offer constant reminiscence and recollection of their unique attributes; observing that by honouring them in such a manner is a national expression of gratitude for their outstanding deeds; appreciating that the County Assembly has in recent times moved to invoke its legislative and representation mandates to pass Motions urging for the recognition of such distinguished and illustrious citizens; Noting that there are heroines and heroes who have not only roads/streets named or renamed after them, but also statues unveiled in an elevated act of honour for instance, Dedan Kimathi, Tom Mboya and most recently, Ronald Ngala; acknowledging that the late Hon. Kenneth Matiba was among conspicuous persons in the second liberation which culminated into Kenya becoming a multiparty state and the commencement the clamour of the current celebrated Constitution 2010 alongside former Rt. Hon. Raila Odinga, the late Charles Rubia, the late Martin Shikuku and SC Paul Muite; further acknowledging that he has a remarkable record in industrial, hospitality and education sectors, and an accomplished public servant having served as the first indigenous African Permanent Secretary for Education in 1963; Permanent

Secretary for Commerce; Chairperson of the Kenya Football Federation from 1974-78; a Member of Parliament for Kiharu constituency; Cabinet Minister for Health; Culture & Social Services; and Transport & Communications; **appreciating that** as a result of his distinguished stature in the society of Kenya, he was in 2021 honoured by Nairobi City County Assembly which passed a Motion to have Accra Road renamed after him; **recognizing** that heroes and heroines in whose honour statues have been installed and unveiled have their personalities, character, outstanding abilities and distinguished deeds more accentuated and memorized locally, this **Assembly urges** the County Executive in conjunction with the Nairobi Metropolitan Services to construct, install and unveil the statue of late Kenneth Matiba along the recently renamed Kenneth Matiba Road as an act of elevated honour of the locally and globally celebrated legend of inspirational of the young generation.
