The nominee appeared before the Sectoral Committee on Environment and Natural Resources on Thursday 19th April, 2018 and was vetted in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, and the County Assembly Standing Orders on his suitability for appointment to the position of County Chief Officer. In total, the Committee held three Sittings in consideration of this matter.

2.0. BACKGROUND

2.1 <u>Establishment of the Sectoral Committee on Environment and Natural Resources</u>

The Sectoral Committee on Environment and Natural Resources is one of the Sectoral Committees established under Standing Order No. 203. Further Standing Order 203 (6) (f) contemplates that one of the functions of a Sectoral Committee shall be

"To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any other law requires that County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 196(Committee on Appointment)"

Section 10(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 (No. 5 of 2017) provides thus:-

"Where the nomination of a candidate is rejected by a County Assembly, the appointing authority may submit to the relevant County Assembly the name of another candidate, and the procedure for approval specified in this Act shall apply accordingly."

2.2 Appointment process of the County Chief Officers Nominees

Section 45(1)(a) and (b) of the County Governments Act, 2012, provides for the Governor's power to nominate County Chief Officers, with the approval of the Assembly, from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board.

A letter from the Office of the Governor dated 5th April, 2018, addressed to the Speaker of the County Assembly indicated that pursuant to section 45 (1) (a) and (b) of the County Governments Act, 2012, H.E. the Governor, Hon. Mbuvi Gideon Kioko Mike Sonko had nominated twenty two (22) nominees to be considered for approval by the County Assembly for appointment as Chief Officers of the ten Sectors.

On Tuesday, 10th April, 2018, the Honourable Speaker in a Message to the Assembly informed the Assembly that her office had received the names of the twenty three (23) nominees, and directed that the names and curriculum vitae of the said nominees be

referred to the various Select and Sectoral Committees for vetting and reporting to the Assembly pursuant to Standing Order 203 (6) (f) and Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017(No. 5 of 2017).

2.3 Notification to the Public

Section 7 (5) and (10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that-, "the committee shall, by notice in at least one newspaper of national circulation, notify the public of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven days prior to the hearing" and "any person may, prior to the approval hearing and by a written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".

Pursuant to the above provisions of the law, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the in the local dailies, specifically the Standard Newspaper and the Daily Nation Newspaper on Wednesday 11th April, 2018 inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (sworn affidavits) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominees. At the close of business on Monday 16th April, 2018, no memoranda contesting the suitability of the nominee for Chief Officer for Environment and Natural Resources had been received from the public.

In accordance with the provisions of Article 196 of the Constitution and section 7(5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, the general public was also notified in the local dailies by the Clerk of the County Assembly of the intention of the Sectoral Committee on Environment and Natural Resources to conduct the vetting and approval hearing of the nominees on Thursday 19th April, 2018.

2.4 <u>Clearance Requirements</u>

To ensure compliance with the provisions of Chapter 6 of the Constitution, the nominees were asked to submit their clearance status with the following institutions for the vetting exercise –

- a) Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA)
- b) Criminal Investigation Department (CID)

- c) Higher Education Loans Board (HELB)
- d) Credit Reference Bureau (CRB) and
- e) The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC)

The clearance by the foregoing institutions was primarily meant to provide information about the nominees on: -

- a) Matters touching on integrity;
- b) Tax compliance;
- c) Loan repayments; and
- d) Presence or absence of criminal records.

3.0 <u>VETTING OF THE COUNTY CHIEF OFFICER NOMINEE</u> RESPONSIBLE FOR ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES

In conducting the approval hearing process, the Sectoral Committee on Environment and Natural Resources examined the nominee against the following criteria, amongst others, as set out in the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 of 2017–

- (i.) Academic qualifications.
- (ii.) Employment record
- (iii.) Professional associations.
- (iv.) Potential conflict of interest.
- (v.)Knowledge of the relevant subject.
- (vi.) Overall suitability for the position.
- (vii.) Tax compliance.
- (viii.) Integrity.

During its Sitting held on Thursday, 19thApril, 2018 at the Chamber Boardroom, Assembly Precincts, City Hall Buildings from 10:00am, the Committee conducted face to face interview of the nominee. The minutes of the vetting proceedings are attached to this report.

3.1 APPEARANCE BEFORE THE COMMITTEE BY MR. DAVID MASERETI MAKORI - COUNTY CHIEF OFFICER NOMINEE FOR THE ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES SUBSECTOR

The County Chief Officer nominee for the Environment and Natural Resources Sector, Mr. David Masereti Makori, appeared before the Committee on Thursday, 19th April, 2018 at 10.00am and was informed by the Chairperson that in line with the provisions of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 of 2017 the Committee invited submissions from the Public on his suitability or

otherwise for appointment to Public office, but none had been received by close of business on Monday 16th April, 2018.

While under oath, he proceeded to inform the Committee as follows;

A. Regarding self-introduction, knowledge, experience and qualification, the nominee informed the committee that he was born on 28thNovember 1983 and;

- a) He is currently the Assistant Director of Environment (Infrastructure and Operations), Nairobi City County.
- b) He is currently pursuing a PhD in Remote Sensing from U.K.Z.N.
- c) He holds a Masters in Environmental Planning and Management from Kenyatta University.
- d) The nominee also holds a Bachelor of Science in Ornamental Science and Landscaping from Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology.
- e) He is a part time lecturer in the faculty of Geography (Remote Sensing and Survey) at Mount Kenya University.
- f) The nominee previously worked as an analyst, International Centre of Insect Physiology and Ecology (icipe) between 2014—2016 and as a Geographic Information System (GIS) Specialist with USAID from 2012-2014.

B. In response to questions put to hereby Members of the Committee, Mr. David Masereti Makori stated as follows:-

- I. Suitability for the position nominated and why he applied for the position
 The nominee stated as follows
 - a. That he has done a lot regarding geo-spatial analysis which really assisted in mapping of the Nairobi CBD for solid waste management.
 - b. That he did consultancy with JICA in 2014, a pilot project of waste collection and transportation on slum areas on corporation with CBOs.
 - c. That his current position as an Assistant Director, Solid Waste Management has opened up his mind to be able to hold any leadership position.

- d. That he will work towards improvement of waste collection in the County and adhere to Article 69 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.
- e. That he applied for the position out of the zeal and ambition to make Nairobi clean and green.

II. How he will deal with the in fights in the Sector –

The nominee informed the Committee that he will maintain good working relationships with all the staff in the Sector. He added that the entire Sector has supported him since he joined the County and that he will also give total backing to all the activities the Sector plans to carry out.

III. With regard to the main challenges for this docket within the County and how he will address those challenges if confirmed to this position-

The nominee stated that human resource was the core challenge in the Sector since most of the staff in the Sector lack professional qualifications related to this field. Another challenge was lack of staff motivation and poor communication between the environmental officers and the public. That he will bring in experienced people and encourage on-job training of the staff. The nominee added that he will coordinate with the Human Resource Department to give special medical cover to the Environment staff since they do hazardous jobs.

IV. How he will relate with the County Executive Committee Members (CECs) and the Chief Officers to ensure that the County Government respects its Constitutional mandate and deliver services to Wananchi-The nominee noted that he will strictly implement National policy directions to ensure the County benefits from areas of cooperation between the County and National Government. That he will engage other Chief Officers through quarterly meetings to deliberate on the achievements and priorities in the Sectors.

V. With respect to legislative support he sees as priority in his Sub-Sector which he would want the Assembly to consider going forward-The nominee stated that –

He will earnestly seek support from the Assembly regarding regulations on the management of riparian areas. He will encourage subcontracting of professionals to come up with all relevant Environmental regulations/policies concerning solid waste management.

V. Regarding solving some of the challenges facing implementation of Environmental policies in the City, any clear plans and timelines-

The nominee stated the disconnect between policy formulation and implementation as the foremost challenge. That he will at all times ensure that public participation is done before any policy formulation.

VI. Navigating the relationship between himself and Members of the County Assembly if appointed -

That he will work towards developing a mutual relationship between his Sub-Sector and the County Assembly. That he will maintain constant communication between the Environment and Natural Resources Sub-Sector and the County Assembly.

VII. How will he propose to deal with corruption since it is a major hindrance to proper garbage collection and disposal-

He will;

- a) Improve the equipment and systems at the Dandora dumpsite;
- b) Do away with the analogue systems at the dumpsite by installing of CCTV cameras and drones to monitor the refuse tracks that dump waste at the site and their tonnage;

c) Streamline the procurement processes with an aim of contracting contractors with integrity.

VIII. How he will balance the interests of garbage collectors and the need to develop a proper mechanism for garbage disposal-

That he will push for and maintain prompt payment to the contracted garbage collectors.

IX. Regarding important priorities in terms of the work ahead if appointed-

The Committee sought to find out the nominee's personal priorities in terms of the work ahead – he responded as follows –

- a) Clear the County of garbage/ensuring the City is clean;
- b) Source for financial support to make Nairobi green.

X. With respect to dealing/coping with the pressures of the political environment-

The nominee informed the Committee that he will always engage the County Executive Committee Member to provide political advice/direction. That he will maintain respect to the County Assembly.

XI. With respect to pressure from family and charitable activities

The Nominee stated that-

He will deal professionally with pressure from friends and family and will dedicate himself to service.

On charitable contributions, the nominee stated that he has done numerous charitable works. He had similarly sponsored a number of children for both primary and secondary school education.

XII. Regarding his integrity and his net worth -

The nominee affirmed that he is of high integrity and upholds professional conduct in his work.

He reiterated that what was forwarded to the Committee reflects a true position of his net worth.

XIII. What Nairobi should expect if he is appointed-

The nominee committed to give the City his best in ensuring the City is clean and green. That he will enlighten the public on the importance of the 3Rs -reduce, reuse and recycle and to crown it all he will give a total dedication to service delivery.

4.0 <u>COMMITTEE'S OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS ON THE SUITABILITY OF MR.DAVID MASERETI MAKORI FOR THE APPOINTMENT AS CHIEF OFFICER, ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES</u>

The Committee having considered the nominee's filled Questionnaire pursuant to Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, his Curricula Vitae and having heard his oral submissions during the vetting exercise made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as Chief Officer for Environment and Natural Resources;

THAT: -

- 1. The nominee satisfies the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya on leadership and integrity in that:
 - a) The nominee has been cleared by the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Credit Reference Bureau (CRB).
 - b) The nominee has not been charged in a Court of Law.
 - c) The nominee does not exhibit a potential conflict of interest.
- 2. The nominee meets the requirements of Section 45(1) (a) of the County Governments Act, 2012 since he:
 - a) He was competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board.
 - b) Exhibited impressive knowledge of topical issues touching on the docket nominated to and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience.

Therefore, the Committee found the nominee suitable for appointment as the County Chief Officer, Environment and Natural Resources Sub-Sector having met both the Constitutional and the statutory requirements. A summary of the Committee's observations for the nominee is highlighted below:-

4.1 MR. DAVD MASERETI MAKORI - NOMINEE FOR THE COUNTY CHIEF OFFICER, ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES SUB-SECTOR.

- a) He is currently the Assistant Director of Environment (Infrastructure and Operations), Nairobi City County.
- b) He is currently pursuing a PhD in Remote Sensing from U.K.Z.N.
- c) He holds a Masters in Environmental Planning and Management from Kenyatta University.
- d) The nominee also holds a Bachelor of Science in Ornamental Science and Landscaping from Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology.
- e) He is a part time lecturer in the faculty of Geography (Remote Sensing and Survey) at Mount Kenya University.
- f) The nominee previously worked as an analyst, International Centre of Insect Physiology and Ecology (icipe) between 2014—2016 and as a Geographic Information System (GIS) Specialist with USAID from 2012-2014.
- g) He has never been charged in a Court of Law, has no potential conflict of interest, and has fully complied with his tax obligation and other relevant clearances from state agencies as required.
- h) He has never been dismissed from office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution which deals with conduct of state officers that are adversely mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament or any Commission of Inquiry.
- i) The Committee found the nominee suitable and qualified for appointment to the position of County Chief Officer, Environment and Natural Resources Sub-Sector.

5.0. RECOMMENDATIONS

Pursuant to Section 45(1)(a) and (b) of the County Governments Act, 2012 and Section 9 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Committee recommends:-

THAT, this Assembly approves Mr. David Masereti Makori for appointment by H.E. the Governor to the position of County Chief Officer, Environment and Natural Resources Sub-Sector

Min. No. 82/e&nw/April/2018: Preliminaries

The Chairperson called the meeting to order at 10.28 am and opened the meeting with a word of prayer. He briefed the Committee members present on the process they had agreed to follow during the vetting. He then invited the nominee to the approval hearing.

Min. No. 83/e&nw/April/2018: Vetting of Mr. David Masereti Makori, County Chief Officer nominee responsible for Environment And Natural Resources

The nominee took the Committee through his curriculum vitae in the order outlined in the questionnaire provided for in the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 explaining as follows:

- i. He is currently the Assistant Director of Environment (Infrastructure and Operations), Nairobi City County.
- ii. He is currently pursuing a PhD in Remote Sensing from U.K.Z.N.
- iii. He holds a Masters in Environmental Planning and Management from Kenyatta University.
- iv. The nominee also holds a Bachelor of Science in Ornamental Science and Landscaping from Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology.
- v. He is a part time lecturer in the faculty of Geography (Remote Sensing and Survey) at Mount Kenya University.
- vi. The nominee previously worked as an analyst, International Centre of Insect Physiology and Ecology (icipe) between 2014 2016 and as a Geographic Information System (GIS) Specialist with USAID from 2012-2014.
- vii. He responded to the questions raised by the Committee as follows:
 - a) His suitability for the position;
 - That he has done a lot regarding geo-spatial analysis which really assisted in mapping of the Nairobi CBD for solid waste management.
 - That he did consultancy with JICA in 2014, a pilot project of waste collection and transportation on slum areas on corporation with CBOs.
 - That his current position as an Assistant Director, Solid Waste Management has opened up his mind to be able to hold any leadership position.
 - That he will work towards improvement of waste collection in the County and adhere to Article 69 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.
 - That he applied for the position out of the zeal and ambition to make Nairobi clean and green.
 - b) How he will deal with the in fights in the Sector;
 - He will maintain good working relationships with all the staff in the Sector.
 - He has the Sector's support since he joined the County.
 - He will give total backing to all the activities the Sector plans to carry out.
 - c) Main challenges for this docket within the County and how he will address those challenges if confirmed to this position;
 - Human resource was the core challenge in the Sector since most of the staff in the Sector lack professional qualifications related to this field.
 - Lack of staff motivation and poor communication between the environmental officers and the public.
 - He will bring in experienced people and encourage on-job training of the staff.
 - He will coordinate with the Human Resource Department to give special medical cover to the Environment staff since they do hazardous jobs.
 - d) How he will relate with the County Executive Committee Members (CECs) and the Chief Officers to ensure that the County Government respects its Constitutional mandate and deliver services to Wananchi-

- He will strictly implement National policy directions to ensure the County benefits from areas of cooperation between the County and National Government.
- He will engage other Chief Officers through quarterly meetings to deliberate on the achievements and priorities in the Sectors.
- e) If there is any legislative support he sees as priority in his docket which he would want the Assembly to consider going forward:-
- -He will respect the role of the County Assembly to oversight, make laws and approve policy and plans.
- -He will earnestly seek support from the Assembly regarding regulations on the management of riparian areas.
- -He will encourage subcontracting of professionals to come up with all relevant Environmental regulations/policies concerning solid waste management.
- f) Challenges he expects to meet in the docket, and how he will address them:-
 - -Disconnect between policy formulation and implementation is the foremost challenge.
 - -He will at all times ensure that public participation is done before any policy formulation.
- g) How he would navigate the relationship between himself and Members of the County Assembly if appointed:-
 - -He will work towards developing a mutual relationship between his Sub-Sector and the County Assembly.
 - -He will maintain constant communication between the Environment and Natural Resources Sub-Sector and the County Assembly.
- h) How he would propose to deal with corruption since it is a major hindrance to proper garbage collection and disposal:-
 - -Improve the equipment and systems at the Dandora dumpsite;
 - Do away with the analogue systems at the dumpsite by installing of CCTV cameras and drones to monitor the refuse tracks that dump waste at the site and their tonnage;
 - -Streamline the procurement processes with an aim of contracting contractors with integrity.
- i) How he will balance the interests of garbage collectors and the need to develop a proper mechanism for garbage disposal:-
 - He will push for and maintain prompt payment to the contracted garbage collectors.
- j) Important priorities in terms of the work ahead if appointed:-
 - -Clear the County of garbage/ensuring the City is clean;
 - -Source for financial support to make Nairobi green.

- k) Coping with the pressures of the political environment:-
 - -He will always engage the County Executive Committee Member to provide political advice/direction and maintain respect to the County Assembly.
- I) Pressure from family and charitable activities:-
- -He will deal professionally with pressure from friends and family and will dedicate himself to service.
- -He has done numerous charitable works. He had similarly sponsored a number of children for both primary and secondary school education.
- m) His integrity and net worth:-
 - -He affirmed that he is of high integrity and upholds professional conduct in his work.
 - -He reiterated that what was forwarded to the Committee reflects a true position of his net worth.
- (n)What Nairobi should expect if he is appointed:-
 - -He committed to give the City his best in ensuring the City is clean and green.
 - -He will enlighten the public on the importance of the 3Rs -reduce, reuse and recycle and to crown it all he will give a total dedication to service delivery.
