


1.0 PREFACE

Mr. Speaker Sir, on behalf of the Members of the Sectoral Committee on Transport, Roads and Public Works it is my pleasure and privilege to present to the Assembly, the Committee's 2017 2nd Report on inspection site visit to Baba Dogo Ward on Tuesday 18th October 2016 to assess the construction works of a bus stage meant to serve the area residents.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

Baba Dogo Ward is an electoral ward in Nairobi City County. It is one of the wards in Ruaraka constituency in Nairobi County approximately eight kilometres from the City Centre. It encompasses an area of approximately 1.95Km square. It is bordered by Mathare North, Lucky Summer & Korogocho Wards as shown in the map below.

The Transport, Roads and Public Works Committee during its meeting held on 29th September 2016, while considering a response to a statement requested by Hon. Shadrack Juma regarding the construction of a bus stop in Baba Dogo Ward, resolved to visit the site on Tuesday 18th October, 2016 to see firsthand the project status before further inquiring into the reasons for its stalling. The Member who had requested for the statement was not content with the response from the County Executive thus prompting the Speaker to direct the Transport Committee to conduct an inspection site visit on the Baba Dogo bus stop construction site and table its findings before the House.

2.1 Committee Mandate

Mr. Speaker Sir, the Sectoral Committee on Transport, Roads and Public Works is established under Standing Order 191, and its mandate amongst others, as outlined under Standing Order 191 (5) is to:-

- a) investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;
- study the programme and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
- c) study and review all county legislation referred to it;
- d) study, assess and analyze the relative success of the departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with its stated objectives;
- e) investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;
- f) vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 185(Committee on Appointments): and

g) Make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

2.3.1 STATEMENT REQUEST

Pursuant to Standing Order 41 (2) (c) ,on Wednesday 8th June, 2016, Hon Shadrack Juma requested the Chairperson of the Transport and Public works Committee for a Statement regarding the construction of a bus stop in Baba Dogo Ward.

According to the Hon Shadrack Juma, the construction of the bus stop was given an allocation in budget estimates of the financial year 2013/2014. The construction was then stopped by the County Executive while in progress.

The Member further asked the Chairperson to inquire into and report on;-

- Clarification of why the construction of the bus stop was approved on a road reserve, a contractor given the contract and later the construction stopped when it was halfway done; and
- Measures being taken by the County Executive to ensure that projects approved by the Assembly are implemented.

2.3.2 STATEMENT RESPONSE

On 4th July 2016, the Transport sector Chief Officer responded to the above statement As follows:-

- On why the construction of the bus stop was approved on a road reserve, a contractor given the contract and later the construction stopped when it was halfway done.
 - a. The construction was approved on the road reserve since it was the only available public space that could accommodate the stage and looking at the functionality of the facility, it would only serve its purpose if it is situated next to the carriage way.
 - b. The construction of the facility has not stopped but the contractor had temporarily been suspended due to objections by the property owners on the

siting of the laybys. This resulted in numerous consultations between the stakeholders that included the County Executives, the Member of County Assembly for Baba Dogo Ward and representation from the Baba Dogo Business Association which has resulted in delay in giving the contractor possession of some sites. The issue on the terminus being located outside Premier Food Industries is still pending as an agreement on the way forward has not been reached. Work has been ongoing on other areas where objections have not been raised and are now over 50% complete on the areas the contractor has possession of and it is hoped that the works will be completed.

- On measures being taken by the County Executive to ensure that projects approved by the Assembly are implemented.
 - a. The County Executive will ensure strict adherence to the budget and procurement plan.
 - b. The County Executive will ensure that during planning and procurement stages of the project, all stakeholders will be consulted to avoid delays during the implementation process.
 - c. The County Executive will ensure that contractors are paid on time to avoid delays due to non-payment.

3.0 INSPECTION OF BABA DOGO 25 BUS STOP CONSTRUCTION

The Committee delegation visited the designated site where a bus stop is to be constructed on Baba dogo road on Tuesday 18th October, 2016. The proposed bus stop site is situated on the front of Premier Foods Ltd which is a food processing company.

The delegation was received by the operations manager, Premier Foods Industries Ltd and was led into the premises of the company. Premier Foods Industries Ltd is the party that has objected the construction of a bus stop on a road reserve outside their premises. A meeting was held in the company's boardroom between The Committee and Officers from the company. The deliberations of the meeting are thus highlighted in this report.

MEETING BETWEEN PREMIER FOODS INDUSTRY AND THE TRANSPORT COMMITTEE

The Operations Manager Premier Foods Industries (PFIL), informed the Committee that the matter on the bus stop construction outside their premises had been a matter of discussion for some time between the Company and the County Transport, Health, Lands and Environment sectors. He further cited that while considering the construction of a bus stop outside their premises, the County did not consult the Company.

The main reason the company objected to the construction of a bus stop is that the bus stop will expose the factory to smoke emissions and dust from vehicles resulting in pollution that will compromise with the standards of hygiene that a food manufacturing industry is supposed to uphold.

The Company admitted that the piece of land they had fenced off and turned into a private parking was indeed Nairobi City County Land.

4.0 OBSERVATIONS MADE BY THE COMMITTEE

The Committee indeed verified that Premier Food Industries Itd had obstructed the construction of the bus stop by fencing off the road reserve and using it as their private parking.

Premier Food Industries had initially communicated their objection to the construction of the bus stop in writing to the Governor, Chief Officer Lands and The Chief Officer of Public Health. In response to the matter, The Chief Officer Lands wrote a memo to The Chief Officer Transport requesting that the company's plea be considered by stopping the proposed construction of the bus stop.

5.0 RECOMMENDATIONS


Mr. Speaker following the visit, the Committee urges this Assembly to resolve as follows:

- 1. As much as priority should be given to the growing population of Baba dogo for the construction of the bus stop that will ease movement of the rising population in the area, the Committee agrees with the concerns raised by Premier Foods industries. That establishing a bus stop outside their premises will impact negatively on their hygiene standards due to smoke and dust from vehicles. The Committee thus recommends that the Roads, Transport & Public sector relocates the bus stop to a convenient site along the Baba Dogo road.
- The County Executive Committee Member for Lands should immediately bring down the fence that was erected by Premier Foods industries enclosing the proposed bus stop site as it is Nairobi City County Land (Public Land).
- The Roads, Transport & Public Works sector should liaise with the Physical Planning department to identify a viable site in Baba dogo and ensure the construction of the bus stop is done as it had been budgeted for.



After a round of introductions, The Chairperson gave the objective of the Committee's visit. He cited that the Committee as per its mandate, was inquiring into and investigating why the Company was hindering the construction of a bus stop on a road reserve outside its premises. He further stated that upon arrival, the Committee had indeed verified that Premier Food Industries Itd had obstructed the construction of the bus stop by fencing off the road reserve and using it as their private parking.

The Operations Manager (PFIL), recounted that the matter has been on discussions for a while between the Company and the County Transport, Health, Lands and Environment sectors. He further narrated that while considering construction of a bus stop, the County did not consult the Company as a stakeholder. The main reason they have objected to the construction of a bus stop is that the noise and pollution that will emanate from the bus stop will compromise with the standards of hygiene that they should uphold as a food manufacturing industry.

The Company admitted that the piece of land they had fenced off and turned into a private parking was indeed Nairobi City County Land.

A Member of the Committee was of the view that priority should be given to the growing population of Baba dogo and therefore it is only necessary for the company to pave way for the construction of the bus stop that will ease and accommodate movement of the rising population in the area.





RE: REQUEST FOR NOT PERMITTING CONSTRUCTION OF A BUS SHELTER/STOP NEAR THE FACTORY PREMISES OF PREMIER FOOD INDUSTRIES LIMITED LOCATED ON LR 336/25 ALONG BABA DOGO ROAD IN RUARAKA.

Premier Food Industries Limited ("PFIL") is a leading food processing company situated at the above noted location in Ruaraka Industrial area and is engaged in manufacturing over 50 different products, which can be classified under sauces, squashes, jams, juices and other canned products. Our products are manufactured and marketed under the popular brand names "PEPTANG" and "PEP". PFIL engages over 200 employees. These brands have been in existence in the market since 1935 and have become a house hold name in Kenya.

We have been requested by the Nairobi County Council to surrender 12 meters of our frontage land for road development and guided by our civic sense of responsibility we have acceded to the request. However, we have been consistently receiving information from various quarters that there is a plan to build a bus shelter/stop in the surrendered portion of the said parcel of land.

It will be appreciated that being a food processing company, positioning a bus shelter/stop in the surrendered portion of the parcel of land will generate hazardous emissions comprising fumes, smoke and dust, which would result in product contamination. Needless to say this will greatly affect the quality of our products and place our business operations at a great risk from a public health perspective. Additionally, the resultant human traffic would also pause a great security risk to our business operations.

In view of the concerns raised above, we would like to place our humble request to your good offices, to disallow the proposed construction of bus shelter/stop or any other similar structure in the affected area.

On our part, we confirm that PFIL will maintain this area by way of landscaping and gardening pending the formal surrender of the piece of land whenever the road expansion programme is ready for implementation.

We look forward to receiving a positive feedback and direction from your good offices on this matter in due course.



RE: REQUEST FOR YOUR INTERVENTION IN STOPPAGE OF THECUTTING OF TREES AT THE COMPANY'S PREMISES

We would like to bring to your attention that on 17th May 2016, some individuals came to the Company's Premises and demanded to cut down the trees in front of our factory. The said individuals alleged to have received approval from Nairobi City County ("NCC") to clear the trees for purposes of establishing/construction of a bus terminus.

In spite of the questionable validity of the approval documentation, the individuals said that they will be coming to the Company's Premises anytime to cut down the trees. We have on several occasions brought the issue to the attention of NCC who has resolved to stop the establishment of a bus terminus. Despite our communication to the individuals purporting to have permission to cut the trees on our engagement with the NCC as noted above, they still insist on proceeding to cut the trees to build a bus terminus.

We take the view that the act is illegal and if allowed, would be a risk to our business and the public who are consumers of the products we manufacture. Admittedly, the cutting down of trees will expose our manufacturing facility to excessive dust and fumes from automobiles hence jeopardize the quality of our products and pose a danger to public health.

We hereby officially lodge this complaint with your good offices based on the premises noted above and request for your intervention to stop this act
