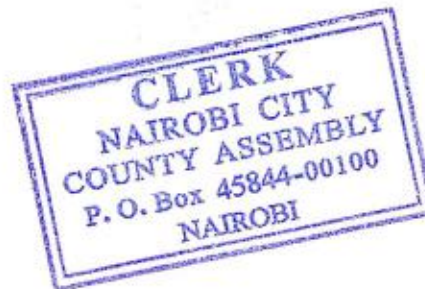

## **PREFACE**

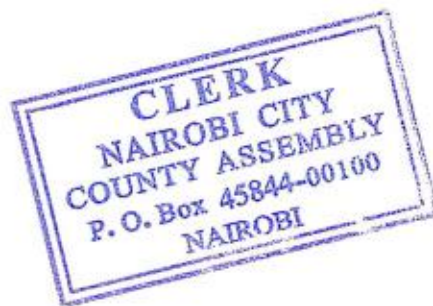

## 1.0 BACKGROUND

The Sectoral Committee on Water and Sanitation is established under the provisions of Standing Order 191 and under the Second Schedule is mandated to consider all matters related to “*water distribution, management, regulation; sewerage and sanitation services*”.

The Committee, resolved to undertake an inspection visit to Ruai Treatment Plant following allegations on human encroachment by the Nairobi City Water and Sewerage Company Limited. The visit was therefore, to enable Members establish the extent of the allegations and to assess the status of the facility, with a view to coming up with amicable resolutions to address the problem.

## 2.0 INTRODUCTION

The issue on encroachment on Ruai Treatment Plant was raised by the Managing Director of Nairobi City Water and Sewerage Company during the Committee's 4<sup>th</sup> quarter retreat held in Naivasha. The Managing Director, while making a presentation on thematic areas of the draft Water and Sanitation Policy, alleged that the plant's expansion prospects was impeded by continuous human encroachment. In view of this, the Committee found it necessary to visit the Ruai treatment Plant in bid to establish the claims and come up with appropriate resolutions for implementation.

## 2.1 FINDINGS

### 2.1.2 RUAI TREATMENT PLANT

The Committee undertook the inspection visit to the Plant on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2016 to among others; establish the alleged human encroachment and assess the status of the facility. The Members met the Environment and Compliance Manager, the Plant Coordinator and Technical Officers of the Nairobi City Water and Sewerage Company who took the Committee around the Treatment Plant.

Ruai Treatment Plant handles sewage wastes of up to 120,000M<sup>3</sup> daily whereas the 9 No. pools constructed by the Athi Water and Services Board have a capacity of 160,000M<sup>3</sup>.

The Committee was informed by the Treatment Coordinator and Environment and Compliance Manager as follows;

- i. The Ruai Treatment Plant sits on a 4,000 hectares but only a meagre 500 acres is under use as a result of human encroachment that has impeded expansion of the plant.
- ii. The fish ponds constructed are phase 1 and 2. Generally, there are a total of 56 pools that serve as first sewerage treatment point. Introduction of fish species such as Tilapia and Cat fish into the pools helps to determine quality of water because of their sensitivity to water pollution.



- iii. Some of the pools have been dried up temporarily to control occasional hyacinth.
- iv. The plant's machines that include cup screen, intermediate screen, course bar and grit remover are hugely overstretched by the amount of solid and liquid waste they handle on daily basis. For instance, on average, a total of five tons of solid waste is screened each day which is against the designed standard of the plant that should deal solely on waste water.
- v. It is believed that commercial waste handlers are discharging solid waste/garbage directly into sewer manholes at various points in the sewer system. The areas around markets, Eastleigh and Dandora areas and zones where trunk sewers are accessible by vehicles are particularly notorious. The staff at the plant spend a lot of time removing this garbage manually while a lot of it passes through and can be seen floating on the ponds. Working during night shifts is particularly difficult.
- vi. There are a total of 66 persons working at the plant to aid in the monitoring purposes. The employees include Technical officers, Support staff and Administration Police.

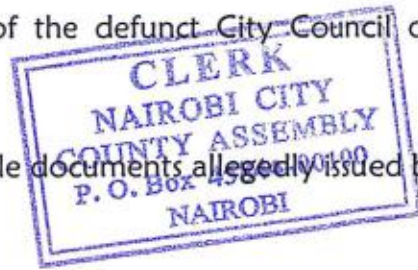
### **1.2.2 MEETING WITH THE RESIDENTS FROM MATHARE AREA 4**

The Mathare 4 A residents were relocated by the Defunct City Council to Ruai to provide space for construction of a Mathare 4 A Primary School. Through a resolution of a Defunct Council General Purpose meeting, the Mathare residents were allocated the piece of land (LR No. 12979/1/R) and allotment letters. The Committee was informed that the Mathare 4 A inhabitants have been paying land rates to the County Government and have stayed for more than five years at the allocated piece of land.

Through their Chairman, the Committee was told that the Mathare 4 A residents were not masqueraders. It was alluded that at one point, the City County Governor, H.E Governor, Dr. Evans Kidero once visited the area with his team and they had the opportunity to scrutinize the approved land documents issued by the Defunct City Council.

In view of the foregoing, the Committee, vide a letter NCCA/WSC/CORR/22 dated 28<sup>th</sup> June, 2016 invited the Chairman, East End Development Properties to a meeting whose objectives were amongst others;

- Brief on the resolutions arrived at a meeting of the defunct City Council on relocation from Mathare Area 4 to Ruai area;
- Tabling of land documents and any other verifiable documents allegedly issued by defunct City Council; and,
- Discussion on the challenges posed by continuous human encroachment of Ruai Treatment Plant.

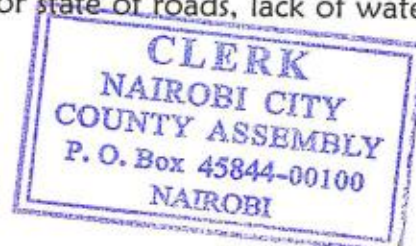


The Committee met the Chairman, Advocate, Patron, Director, Secretary and one Member of the East End Development Properties on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> June, 2016 and Members were informed as follows;

- a) Around 1992, the Defunct City Council went to Mathare 4 to look for available space to construct Mathare 4 A Primary School. The said construction resulted in displacement of families living in the area and destruction of their properties which consisted of semi-permanent and permanent structures. The latter were constructed by an Indian (who used to operate a quarry at independence period) for his employees working at the said quarry that used to supply the then government with construction materials. Therefore, Mathare 4 A residents moved on to occupy and inherit the area (previously inhabited by their siblings) as squatters.
- b) The Council was taken to Court because it had not issued any eviction orders whereby the Court ruled in favor of Mathare 4 A and the Defunct Council accepted to both compensate (for the houses broken down by bulldozers) and resettle/relocate the residents.
- c) The Town Clerk then, Mr. Gakuo John vide letter DTC(L)MNN/234/E/2005 stated that the City Council had identified land for resettlement at Ruai.
- d) The Council had pledged to undertake road grading, provide water supply and basic amenities at Ruai, a pledge that is yet to be realized.

- e) Town Planning Sub- Committee's resolutions on resettlement of Mathare 4 A residents was passed/ adopted on 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2009 by the General Purpose meeting.
- f) The Council issued Allotment letters whereby upon request by Mathare 4 A residents, an account was opened for payment of Land Rates.
- g) Aware that Mathare 4 A Resettlement Scheme – Ruai was a Self-Help Group that legally could not own Land, a request was made and granted that the name 'East End Development Properties' be reserved by the Registrar of Companies and be used.
- h) Currently, the East End Development Properties is making a follow up through ~~correspondences on issuance of final ownership documents~~ by Nairobi City County Government. This would aid in actualization of land sub division to the members.
- i) The Nairobi City Water and Sewerage Company Limited had been advised on the available documents depicting the resettlement resolutions as passed and adopted by the Defunct City Council. The same advice was given to the County's task force on Restoration of Water and Sewerages which had raised allegations on encroachment on Ruai Treatment Plant.
- j) The low development witnessed at Ruai is as a result of immense challenges faced by the inhabitants which range from the poor state of roads, lack of water, social amenities and the like.

## 2.0 CONCLUSION AND OBSERVATIONS



The Committee notes with deep concern the overwhelming amount of solid wastes that is screened and manually removed at Ruai Treatment Plant. The level of encroachment being witnessed inhibits expansion of the plant whose machines are currently experiencing regular breakdowns. In view of the presentations made by the Chairman and Officials of the East End Development Properties, the Committee, after scrutiny of land documents tabled before it, view the resettlement exercise as being genuine. To further corroborate and authenticate its findings, the Committee unanimously agreed that the land document tabled before it be reexamined further with the view of inviting relevant County Government Officers or witnesses.



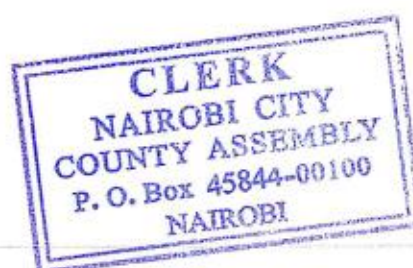
For instance, the actual acreage of the Ruai land need to be proved by documentation of the survey that was allegedly conducted by the defunct City Council of Nairobi. The Committee thus commits itself to meeting with relevant stakeholders including the national government (Ministry of Water and Irrigation) in a bid to find amicable and sustainable solution regarding expansion initiatives with respect to Ruai Treatment Plant.

### 3.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

Following the Site Inspection visit to the Ruai Treatment Plant and the findings and observations made, the Committee urges this Assembly to resolve as follows;

- i) That, the Nairobi City Water and Sewerage Company to undertake vigorous media campaigns to sensitize Nairobians on the need for commercial waste handlers to desist from dumping solid waste into sewer or storm water manholes.
- ii) That, the County Sector on Environment, Energy and Water to institute enforceable punitive measures to arrest any person(s) who haphazardly dumps solid wastes in the NCWSC trunk sewer system.
- iii) That the NCWSC in liaison with the County Government urgently survey the land meant for the Ruai Sewage treatment plant and demarcates the area surrendered for resettlement of the Mathare 4 A residents.
- iv) That, the NCWSC urgently fence off land that was retained for its use after the surrender in order to curtail any encroachment.
- v) That, any residents found to have encroached on land which was not part of the acreage surrendered for resettlement be given adequate notice to vacate, and that upon expiry of the notice, the County Government to reclaim the land.
- vi) That the wastewater from the last ponds/pools needs should be filtered through wetlands so as to meet the NEMA standards for disposal into the river.

It is worth noting that currently, the plant does not meet the Chemical Oxygen Demand, Biochemical Oxygen Demand and Total Suspended Solid parameters owing to the huge amount of solid wastes that affect the intended design of the Plant.



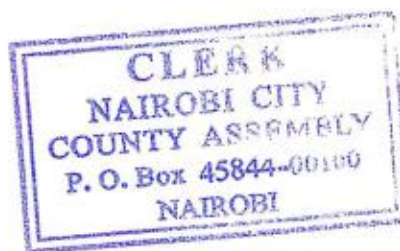
vii) That, the County Government moves with speed to honor its pledges to provide electricity, water, roads and other social amenities to already resettled residents in Ruai as assured by the Defunct City Council. The County Government should also expedite full regularization of deed plans and title.



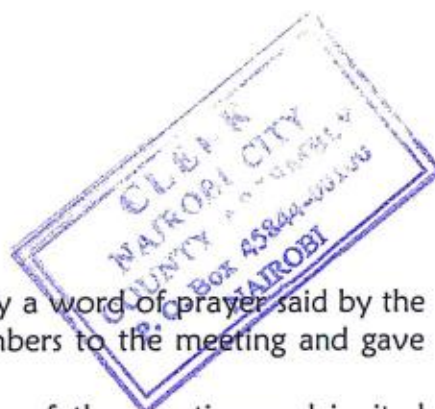

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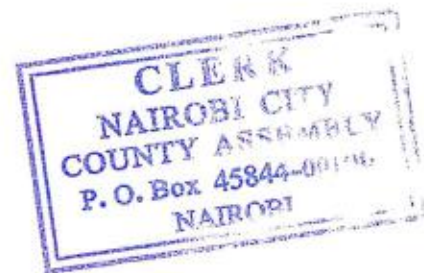
