RESUMPTION FROM LONG RECESS

Welcoming from Recess

Hon. Speaker: Hon. Members, kindly take up your seats.

Hon. Members, under Order No. 2 on Communication from the Chair, we have got a communication to relay on the resumption from the long recess. Allow me to greet you this afternoon as I wish you a happy year of 2026 full of blessings and good health.

It is with great pleasure that I warmly welcome you all back to the Assembly after a long and well-deserved recess that afforded you an opportunity to rest, reflect and reconnect with your constituents and families. Indeed, we must thank God for keeping us safe and healthy during the period of break.

Towards enhancing service delivery in the County

Hon Members, as we commence the 5th Session, we come back when the County is facing criticism and praise alike in key areas of our constitutional mandate, including education, health, environment, urban planning, roads and street lighting. I would like to laud the County for positive improvements in these areas, for instance, issuance of bursary to needy and deserving learners, enhancement of water supply and reticulation amongst others. However, significant challenges are being faced in accessing services at our health facilities, enforcement of regulations in the Built

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Environment and missed own source revenue targets, inadequate road network and lack of street and public lighting in parts of the County.

Hon. Members, to address this, required deliberate efforts of the County Executive, including collaboration with National Government and partners; and the County Assembly in terms of oversight and allocation of required budget.

Conduct of Business in the Assembly

Hon Members, here in the Assembly, we have recorded some positive steps in undertaking our roles of oversight, legislation and representation, evidenced by Committee reports, Bills, Motions, Statements and Petitions processed through this Plenary. It is important to note that legislation is at the core of our constitutional mandate against which the Assembly is evaluated by both the public and external institutions and government agencies.

While I congratulate Members for originating numerous legislative proposals during the last four Sessions, the Assembly has been facing cash flow challenges that hampered timely drafting of Bills. My office and that of the Clerk are committed to put in place measures to address these bottlenecks in order to have as many legislations as possible processed and considered during the remainder of our term. Similarly, I call upon leadership of Committees to align committee efforts towards impactful legislative, oversight and representation business.

The Annual Governor's Address to the County Assembly

Hon Members, my office is in receipt of a notification from H.E Johnson Arthur Sakaja, CBS, the Governor of Nairobi City County, expressing his intention to address this County Assembly and the people of Nairobi on Wednesday 11th February 2025 at 2.30 p.m., in accordance with Section 30 (2) (k) of the County Governments Act, 2012 and Standing Order 25 of Assembly Standing Orders.

In compliance with the provisions of Standing Order 25 (2) that requires formal notification to the Members and the public, my office has published a notice vide Gazette Notice 1719 of 9th February 2026.

Hon Members, this address comes at an opportune time to enable the people of Nairobi to be informed of milestones, challenges and proposals related to service delivery in the County. It will give us an opportunity, as an Assembly, to look back and take stock of the impact of our work and a chance to identify areas that we need to improve in order to support enhanced service delivery by the County Executive. All Members are therefore invited to attend and observe the provisions of the Standing Orders related to decorum. It is also important to assure Members that all relevant preparations have been made including invitation of dignitaries and friends of Nairobi City County Assembly.

In addition, there will be some adjustments with respect to traffic management and parking for the convenience of Members of County Assembly and staff. The Clerk, through the Department of Security Services, has put in place specific measures to ensure security and traffic flow around City Hall Buildings. These measures include suspension parking services in slots designated for use by Members and staff. Consequently, necessary arrangements have been made at Sunken Parking along Taifa Road where Members and staff will be required to park their vehicles.

Office imprest for Nominated Members of County Assembly

Hon Members, in my Memo Ref. CASB/SRC/SPK/2023/10(02) dated 18th October 2023 addressed to all nominated Hon. Members, I indicated that at its meeting held on 11th October 2023, the County Assembly Service Board resolved to fully implement the Commission on Revenue Allocation (CRA) Circular Ref. CRA/CSO/CMG/9/VOL.V (43) dated 3rd August 2020 on Ward Offices Operation Costs with respect to nominated Hon. Members' offices.

However, the implementation of the said Circular was pegged on the requirement that all nominated Members proceed to rent offices in accordance with CRA approved rates and the Assembly Office Leasing Policy, pending the acquisition of the Assembly Administrative Block.

Accordingly, to facilitate payment of the Office Imprest and any outstanding arrears, all nominated Members are hereby directed to submit to the Office of the Clerk details of their rented offices, including the physical location and address, landlord/agent particulars, signed lease agreements, rent invoices/receipts and proof of office expenditure. Consequently, I direct the Clerk to provide the necessary administrative support and assistance to the said Members to ensure full compliance.

Hon. Speaker: Thank you, Hon. Leader of Majority.

Hon. Peter Imwatok: Hon. Speaker, as I wind up the tabling of the same, I call upon the Clerk and the secretariat to be very keen on which document is to be tabled where. We agreed in this House that Delegated Legislation is the committee that deals with all Regulations. The Committee can choose the mother committee to attend to see how it is being done, unless there are changes. So, the Public Accounts Committee, you have work to do. I hope I will not see you on Facebook. Committee on Delegated Legislation, you have work to do for this Hon. House, and give us proper reports in due time.

Hon. Speaker, I beg to lay, as I return this back to the Clerk for safe custody until we get the development vote.

Hon. Speaker: Thank you, Hon. Leader of Majority. Hon. Chege, you have something to... Give the Hon. Member the microphone.

Hon. Chege Mwaura: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise and also wish you a good year as well as the other Hon. Members, as this is our first time in the Assembly this year. As Public Accounts Committee, we have received a total of 21 reports that spread between the Executive and the County Assembly.

Mr. Speaker with your guidance, it is important that I mention to the House that we already had a preliminary report with all the officers from the Executive and we agreed on a specific work plan that will help us find a way of tackling this report within the stipulated time. It is the Committee's desire that we finish this hopefully before we go for the long recess in the month of May or thereabout. I rise to acknowledge that we are already on schedule. The team has already met with the Office of the Clerk, the Office of the CEC Member for Finance, the County Secretary, the Liquor Board and all the hospitals, and have agreed on a work plan.

Today, we dispatched a letter with the specific dates for all the required officers to come. We have also agreed that they submit to this Assembly as well as the Office of the Auditor General supportive documents and supplementary documentation that they may require so that we do not take undue time in ensuring that this happens.

I want to thank the House and the secretariat for helping us achieve this. The same kind of reports also came last year, and I am happy to mention that all the reports were tabled here in the beginning of last year. We have about five that are pending to be tabled in this House when we finish. We are hoping that with that work load, Mr. Speaker, seeing the good Chair of the Liaison Committee because he is going to start off meetings with all the committees, it is my desire that they consider us so that we are able to fast track the report writing because there are hearings and also report writing that must follow so that we do a good job. This is the committee that has sanctioned some senior members of the Executive. We are up to the task.

I want to thank this House because you have also put your bit and we were able to pass some reports which are binding to the House. That is the small request that I have and I wish that it is captured on record; that we would like such kind of support. I beg to support Mr. Speaker. Thank you.

Hon. Speaker: Thank you, Hon. Chege for highlighting on such a critical area. The Chair, Liaison Committee, you want to make some remarks?

Hon. Paul Kados: Thank you, Hon. Speaker. First, let me appreciate the whole Assembly, I have seen that all the Members are in good health in 2026. Thank you Hon. Chair of the Public Accounts Committee, your statements have been received by the Liaison Committee, but my expectation is that all Chairs are supposed to come and defend. So, I expect every Chair who is here to come and defend the sentiments you have raised here. This goes to chairpersons of all committees. Thank you, Hon. Speaker.

Hon. Speaker: I think the Chair has highlighted on the magnitude of the reports as presented and laid before the Assembly. You only need to be key on those areas as you proceed to Mombasa on Thursday, then you just find small timelines.

MANDATE OF DELEGATED LEGISLATION COMMITTEE

Hon. Speaker: Hon. Members, allow me to grant the Chair for Delegated Legislation committee to bring to speed the Assembly on the Committee's mandate, because as you know the tradition is normally the Members of that Committee are engaged with the daily running of the

Committee. For that reason, I would like the Chair to outline the mandate of the Committee for the whole Assembly to understand why the Papers laid have been committed to that Committee for consideration. Hon. Nasra?

Hon. Nasra Nanda: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Happy new year to all my fellow Members.

The Committee on the Delegated County Legislation is provided for under Standing Order No. 208, which reads: -

“208. (1) There shall be a select committee to be known as the Committee on Delegated County Legislation.

(2) Whenever a statutory instrument is submitted to the County Assembly pursuant the Constitution, any law or these Standing Orders, the statutory instrument shall, unless a contrary intention appears in the relevant legislation, be laid before the County Assembly by the Chair of the relevant Sectoral Committee, or any other member and shall thereafter stand referred to the Committee on Delegated County Legislation.

(3) The Committee shall consider in respect of any statutory instrument whether it:

(a) Is in accord with the provisions of the Constitution, the Act pursuant to which it is made or other relevant written law;

(b) Infringes on fundamental rights and freedoms of the public;

(c) Contains a matter which in the opinion of the Committee should more properly be dealt with in an Act of the County Assembly;

(d) Contains imposition of taxation;

(e) Directly or indirectly bars the jurisdiction of the Courts;

(f) Gives retrospective effect to any of the provisions in respect of which the Constitution or the Act does not expressly give any such power;

(g) Involves expenditure from the County Revenue Fund or other public revenues;

(h) Is defective in its drafting or for any reason the form or purport of the statutory instrument calls for any elucidation;

(i) Appears to make some unusual or unexpected use of the powers conferred by the Constitution or the Act pursuant to which it is made;

(j) Appears to have had unjustifiable delay in its publication or laying before County Assembly;

(k) Makes rights, liberties or obligations unduly dependent upon non-reviewable decisions;

(l) Makes rights, liberties or obligations unduly dependent insufficiently defined administrative powers;

(m) Inappropriately delegates legislative powers;

(n) Imposes a fine, imprisonment or other penalty without express authority having been provided for in the enabling legislation;

(o) Appears for any reason to infringe on the rule of law;

(p) *Inadequately subjects the exercise of legislative power to County Assembly scrutiny; and,*

(q) *Accords to any other reason that the Committee considers fit to examine.*

(4) *If the Committee:*

(a) *Resolves that the statutory instrument, be acceded to, the Clerk shall convey that resolution to the relevant county department or the authority that published the statutory instrument.*

(b) *Does not accede to the statutory instrument, the Committee may recommend to the County Assembly that the County Assembly resolves that all or any part of the statutory instrument be annulled and if the instrument if a resolution is passed by the County Assembly within twenty days on which it next sits after the instrument laid before it under paragraph (2), that all or part of the statutory instrument be annulled, the instrument or part thereof shall henceforth stand annulled.*

(5) *In this standing order, “statutory instrument” means any rule, order, regulation, direction, form, tariff of costs or fees, letter patent, commission, warrant, proclamation, by-law, resolution, guideline or other instrument issued, made or established in the execution of a power conferred by or under an Act of the County Assembly under which that statutory instrument or subsidiary legislation is expressly authorized to be issued.”*

Hon. Speaker: Are you through?

Hon. Nasra Nanda: Mr. Speaker, I would like to rise on a Point of Order on Privileges.

Hon. Speaker: You may proceed.

Hon. Nasra Nanda: Mr. Speaker, Sir, I rise on a Point of Order on Privileges based on the concern I have as a Member on the continued...

Hon. Speaker: Then that one needs at least a two-hour notice.

Hon. Nasra Nanda: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, I will be guided.

Hon. Speaker: Thank you.

Hon. Peter Imwatok: Hon Speaker, my able Chairperson has not committed to this House as the Chair for Public Accounts Committee has committed. At what speed this Committee is going to work to make sure that all these Regulations that have been Tabled before the House, are available for scrutiny, adoption or rejection by this particular House? Chair, that is the essence of the Speaker giving a chance to commit to this House.

Hon. Nasra Nanda: Thank you, Majority Leader, I am well guided. I commit to presenting and making a report on the same within 21 days. Thank you.

Hon. Speaker: Thank you. I hope the Chairperson on the Implementation Committee will also follow up keenly on the pace of the Public Accounts Committee and the Delegated Legislation Committee so that they submit these reports in a timely manner. You are under watchdog of the Implementation Committee before it lands to the Liaison Committee. So, they will bring you up to speed, Hon Chege. That is what I have said. Thank you.
