REQUEST FOR STATEMENT REGARDING OWNERSHIP
OF PARCEL OF LAND LR NO. B1/ 179 IN KAYOLE CENTRAL WARD

Hon. Jeremiah Themendu: Thank you, Hon. Speaker. Pursuant to Standing Order 47 2(c), I wish to request for a statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Lands, Planning and Housing regarding ownership parcel of land LR Number B1/ 179 in Kayole Central Ward.

Article 62, (2) of the Constitution of Kenya, provides that public land shall be vested in and be held up by the County Government in trust for the people residing in that County.

(Loud consultations)

Hon. Speaker: Hon. Members, we are in the Assembly. Kindly switch off your phones.

Hon. Jeremiah Themendu: Sorry for that Hon. Speaker.

Available records indicate that the parcel of land LR number B1/ 179 in Kayole Central Ward is public land held in trust by the County Government, which is meant for development of essential public amenities for the betterment of the residents of Kayole Central Ward and the County at large.

The County Government had previously approved for a section of the land for temporary use by the National Police Service for security purposes, pending utilization by the county for public facilities.

Recently the County Government approved and tendered for the construction of a level- 3 health facility on the said parcel of land. The contractor had taken over the site with the commencement of the construction of a perimeter wall. However, officers from the National Police Service have thwarted the ongoing construction of perimeter wall and level- 3 health facility, thus denying the residents of Kayole Central and the county at large their constitutional right to the highest attainable standards of health services.

Hon. Speaker, in the statement the Chairperson should inquire into and report on;

1. Current legal ownership of the land LR number B1/179 in Kayole Central Ward
2. Reasons for the obstruction of the ongoing construction on the said parcel of land by the National Police Service officers
3. Measures the County Executive is taking to ensure the National Police Service always siege from interfering with the ongoing construction on the said parcel of land.

Thank you, Honourable Speaker.

Hon. Speaker: Okay, the Chairperson of the Liaison Committee, kindly give an undertaking.

Hon. Paul Kados: Can we be given two weeks, please? After the reconstitution of all Chairmen?

Hon. Speaker: After the reconstitution of the committees?

Hon. Paul Kados: Reconstitution of the committees. Yes.

Hon. Speaker: Thank you. Hon. Themedu, I hope you understand the status of the Committees which are yet to be constituted. So, you will bear with the Chairperson of the Liaison Committee. He will communicate to the relevant Committee, that is a Planning Committee at the appropriate time.

Hon. Jeremiah Themendu: Honourable Speaker, I think on the ground, it is different. Although we don't have a substantive Chairperson of the Committee, the other day I mentioned here in the Assembly that land in question, when the President visited the Assembly and we went to the State House, the President withdrew the policemen that were there and after that, tendering was done at the executive side and the constructor went to the ground.

Now as we are speaking, Honourable Speaker, those policemen have occupied the space. They are in large numbers, like 70 of them and Honourable Speaker, you know very well the land belongs to the County of Nairobi. The National Police Service who are there, particularly Administrative Police, do not have even a single paper to show that the land belongs to them. So they are using unorthodox means. They are even threatening the lives of the people who are surrounding there because they do not want anybody near that premise or that land. They do not want anybody. They are threatening some members of the public in my ward. It is not a matter to be put off, Honourable Speaker. It needs urgency and not two weeks. Thank you.

Hon. Speaker: Thank you. You know your issue can only be handled by an active Standing Committee and currently the House does not have. Even the Liaison which is chaired by the Deputy Speaker is currently a shell. He is just a single person maintaining that position of the chair of the Liaison Committee until such a time the Committee shall be properly in place. But that does not deny the Assembly from compelling the Executive to move with speed and find out what is happening and what necessarily they can do to restore the dignity of the County. Now that you have said the land belongs to the County Government. We will communicate in the due course before we retreat for the recess. Thank you.

REQUEST FOR STATEMENT REGARDING LAND OWNERSHIP AND ONGOING CONSTRUCTION ALONG KIAMBU ROAD

Hon. Redson Otieno: Thank you. Hon. Speaker, Pursuant to Standing Order 47 (2)(c). I wish to request for a statement from the Chairperson of the Committee on Lands, Planning and Housing regarding land ownership and ongoing construction along Kiambu Road.

Land use in Nairobi is primarily governed by the Constitution of Kenya 2010, the Physical and Land Use Planning Act 2019, and Nairobi City-County policies, among others. Part 2 of the Second Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya provides that the urban planning functions shall be executed by the County Government, specifically, County Governments are responsible for approval of development.

However, cases of building, grabbing public spaces for selfish interests have continued to rise in the recent past.

Hon. Speaker, concerns have been raised that concrete wall has been erected on the plot next to the DCI headquarters on Kiambu Road, next to the Nairobi River Bridge and seemingly, construction appears to be ongoing on the said land.

There have been cases in the city where private land has been acquired in a clandestine manner and buildings erected by unsupervised developers without acquiring the requisite approvals from the County Government Department of Urban Planning.

Hon. Speaker, in the statement, the Chairperson should inquire into and report on;

1. Who are the registered owners of the parcel of land and to avail a copy of the title deed?
2. Details of the ongoing constructions and copies of all relevant approvals.
3. Steps the County is taking to safeguard public land and to ensure that all upcoming constructions comply with building guidelines.

REQUEST FOR STATEMENT REGARDING THE
RECENTLY CONSTRUCTED CONTAINERS, SHEDS AND STALLS ERECTED
AT THE GLOBE ROUNDABOUT, DIRECTLY ADJACENT TO THE KAHAMA HOTEL

Hon. John Kwenya: Thank you, Honourable Speaker, I rise pursuant to Standing Order 42(c) to request for a statement from the Chairperson of the Sector Committee on Trade, Tourism and Cooperatives, the Chairperson of the Sector Committee on Transport and Public Works and the Chairperson of the Sector Committee on Lands and Urban Planning regarding the recently constructed containers, sheds and stalls erected at the Globe Roundabout, directly adjacent to the Kahama Hotel.

Honourable Speaker, land use in Nairobi is governed by the Constitution of Kenya 2010, the Physical Land Use Planning Act 2019 and Nairobi City-County policies among others.

Part two of the Second Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya provides that the urban planning function shall be executed by the County Government. Specifically, County Governments are responsible for approval of developments.

The Nairobi City-County Physical Planning and Land Use Laws, including the Physical and Land Use Planning Act 2019, further requires public participation and approval for development on any public land.

Honourable Speaker, concerns have been raised by the members of the public and businessmen operators within the Central Business District regarding these new emerging structures. Specifically, the structures appear to have been strategically placed directly on the designated pedestrian walks and public road reserves, severely impeding pedestrian movement, compromising non-motorised transport, that is NMT corridors, and posing potential traffic safety hazards around the busy Globe Roundabout interchange.

These structures have been painted in the official Nairobi City-County colours, creating the public impression that they are sanctioned or owned by the county government.

However, persistent allegations on the ground suggest that these container stores may have been irregularly allocated or belonged to private individuals or entities, bypassing proper public participation or planning approvals.

Honourable Speaker, in the statement, the chairpersons should inquire into the report on the following,

1. Whether the land on which the stores have been erected is a designated public road reserve, pedestrian walkway or NMT corridor.
2. The owners or beneficiaries of the containers next to the Kahama Hotel are owned by the government or private investors. If private, state the process through which the land or space was alienated, leased or permitted.
3. Confirm whether the developers, that is the owners of these structures, obtained valid development permissions, change of use approvals, environmental impact assessments, and County Licensing to construct commercial stores on a public utility road reserve.
4. Explain why unauthorized or private structures are painted in official Nairobi City-County colors and what immediate enforcement action the county government is taking to prevent misrepresentation and safeguard County branding.
5. Outline the immediate measures the county executive is taking to reclaim blocked pedestrian walkways and road reserves in the city, specifically Global Roundabout, so as to ensure public safety and smooth traffic flows.

Hon. Speaker, as you are aware in our just concluded request before this House the Whips have to do a lot of balancing and I wish to apologize to the Members of this committee who were ready to go for elections at 12 p.m. this afternoon and it was quickly realized and the committee on Selection advised that we call off the election of the committee.

Hon. Moses Ogeto: Hon. Speaker, these are the things which will allow my pen to work because there is no way a chairman cannot be in parliament. If you allow, we will be counting how many times chairmen are going to be in attendance at the Assembly. We will not leave this Assembly without quorum when we have chairmen and vice chairpersons.

Hon. Speaker, that is a clear warning that if we don't get quorum then you will be struck out so that we proceed. That is why I say Hon. Speaker, that the work my counterpart and I do is good and bad at the same time. Today, someone came to me---

Hon. Speaker, a Member approached me and when she realized that things did not go her way then she said that this was personal. I do not know whether I will be walking in these streets and for that I need your protection Hon. Speaker. With those few remarks, I beg to second.

Hon. Speaker: Thank you.

Hon. Speaker: Hon. Mark Mugambi

(Loud consultations)

Hon. Mark Mugambi: I am not the mover, Hon. Speaker, but thank you for catching my eye. I wanted to echo the remarks made by my counterpart and make a humble plea to the leadership of this House that as we finalize reconstituting these committees, we have already seen how these committees have been. Some were in their death beds and it is a high time we resuscitate most of those committees by making sure that we get competent people to lead those committees

(Applause)

Hon. Speaker, there is no way that you will preside over a House that has no quorum. The leadership pronounced itself that it is a must that all the chairpersons and the vice chairpersons be always present, not unless they have expressed authority from your office that shows they are not in this county or they are not in this country, Hon. Speaker.

Therefore, it is high time, I think, the leadership, majority and minority, before we go to the elections, let's go through the HANSARD and check these outgoing chairpersons. How many have been present and for how long? Because there is no need of us being in leadership and not exercising the same leadership authority, because any chairperson is a member of this small cabinet of ours. And therefore, if you are not coming to assist us, let that third quarter be the last time we will be adjourning sessions.

Let's have sessions from Tuesday to Thursday. Let it not be that it is only Tuesdays that we are able to get sessions, Hon. Speaker, or when some of us expect a... Yeah. All said and done, Hon. Speaker, I want to say thank you to the entire Assembly. Thank you for the four years and one day that we served with respect, with dignity to the Constitution. I think this is the only Assembly that has not been taken to court on many occasions.

Hon. Speaker, you sit with me in CAF, you know the many court cases assemblies undergo, and I must accord that to our secretariat, our Clerk, the Deputy Clerks and the secretariat. I think we have the best staff in terms of assemblies. They are so articulate to what they do. *(Applause)* They support us with all the professionalism. Therefore, any chair coming into office, know that you have proper backing in terms of staff and the office of the Speaker.

I wish you the best for campaigning. Those who will be re-elected, let us push on. Those who will not be re-elected, let us go back to election 2027, get re-elected, back to this House and reclaim the seat you have lost or the seat you aspire to get beyond. When I was a Member of the Environment Committee, I aspired to be the chair of Environment. When I joined the Committee of Water, I aspired to be the committee chair of Water. I became the whip.

Now, when I was a whip, I aspired to be the Governor of Nairobi. Now I'm the Majority Leader. So everybody has aspirations. Please aspire. Always aspire to inspire before you expire. I believe all of us have not yet expired.

(Applause)

We are still aspiring to inspire, and let me inspire in one way. Also, you inspire me in another way. May God bless this House. God bless the Speaker. God bless the entire County Assembly staff. God bless the entire membership. I am delighted that I am the only majority of these names twice in this Bunge. Those who know the history of this Parliament, it is a blessing. And I normally tell people, *usicheze na watu wa neema utaumia* some of us, the background we came from is just by the grace of God. From a watchman, from a toilet cleaner, from Teso land to this isle of the greatest Assembly led by one man who was a former DJ. Some of us were here by the grace of God. Some of us were here by the grace of God.

Let us face it as it is. A former thief, Themendu who is now a Member of the County Assembly. Let us face it. Lawi a former organizer of bad things is now a Member of Sarangombe. He is here. Let us face it. Odalo is not a Bishop, he was a goon, is now a Member of the County Assembly, chair of Budget Committee, formally a goon.

Stazo who is behind me used to *okota* people in the City Stadium, putting film rolls in a booklet. *(Applause)* You know; you do not know the history of people.
