#### QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS

##### BUSINESS APPEARING BEFORE THE ASSEMBLY FOR THE WEEK

**Hon. Sospeter Mumbi:** Hon. Speaker, I rise to give a Statement as the designee of the Assembly Business Committee.

Hon. Speaker, pursuant to Standing Order No. 47 (2) (a), on behalf of the Assembly Business Committee, I rise to give the following Statement regarding the Business appearing before the Assembly for the week beginning Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> June 2026.

Hon. Speaker, the Assembly Business Committee met on Tuesday June 23, 2026 to allocate Business for the week for consideration by this Assembly.

In that regard, Hon. Speaker, allow me to brief the Assembly as follows: -

1. Today, Wednesday June 24, 2026, under Orders No.8 and 9, the County Assembly will be considering the following business items: -
  - a) There will be a resumption of debate interrupted on Wednesday June 10, 2026 at 2.30 p.m. on the Motion by the Member for Nairobi West, Hon. John Rex Omolleh, MCA, urging the Nairobi City County Executive, in conjunction with the relevant National Government Agency, to establish monument at a strategic place at Uhuru Park in honor of the late Right Honorable Raila Amolo Odinga, for his contribution in the development and growth of the Kenyan state, including his selfless sacrifice in championing for good governance, democratic space, rule of law, and development of infrastructure for the period of his entire adult life.
  - b) The Committee of the whole County Assembly to consider the Nairobi City County Clean, Renewable and Sustainable Energy Bill, 2025 (Assembly Bill No.4 of 2025), the Bill sponsored by the Member for Kayole Central Ward, Hon. John Karani Themendu, MCA.
2. Further, on Thursday June 25, 2026, under Orders No. 8, 9 and 10, the County Assembly will be considering the following business items: -
  - a) The adoption of the report of the Sectoral Committee on Environment and Natural Resources on the status of waste disposal mechanism of Farmers' Choice, Burma Market and Kiamaiiko Abattoirs, laid on the Table of the Assembly on Tuesday September 23, 2025.
  - b) The Motion by the Member for Lindi Ward, Hon. Samson Jera, MCA, urging the County Executive, in conjunction with the National Land Commission to:
    - i. Conduct a comprehensive audit and investigation on all public land and open spaces in Nairobi City County that have been irregularly allocated, occupied, or developed in the County;
    - ii. Publicly share the outcomes of the investigations and table a comprehensive report with recommendation to the relevant National and County Government institutions, including the County Assembly for further action; and
    - iii. Take appropriate action to reclaim such parcels of land where illegality has been committed, either by the Commission or the courts of law.
3. The Motion by the Majority Leader to adjourn the County Assembly in accordance with the Assembly Calendar (Regular Sessions).

4. Lastly, Hon. Speaker, on Tuesday July 21, 2026, that is when we will be resuming from recess, under Order No.8, 9, 10, and 11, the County Assembly will be considering the following business items: -
- a) The Second Reading of the Nairobi City County Wards Development Program Bill, 2026 (Assembly Bill No. 2 of 2026), by Hon. Dabar Mohamed, MCA, Chairman, Select Committee on Wards Development Fund.
  - b) The Second Reading of the Nairobi City County Alcoholic Drink Control and Licensing Bill, 2026 (Assembly Bill No. 3 of 2026), by Hon. Clarence Munga, MCA, Chairman, Sectoral Committee on Culture and Community Services.
  - c) The Motion by the Member for High Rise Ward, Hon. Kennedy Oyugi, MCA, for the Assembly to resolve that; -
    - i. The County Government, in collaboration with National Government institutions, establishes a clear framework for the identification, development, validation, verification, certification, and registration of carbon credit projects across key sectors including waste management, renewable energy, urban forestry, sustainable transport, and energy efficiency;
    - ii. The County Executive formally partners with National Government agencies such as the Ministry responsible for Environment and Climate Change, the National Environment Management Authority (NEMA), and other relevant bodies to ensure compliance with national laws, international standards, and carbon market protocols;
    - iii. The County Government mobilizes a partnership with private sector actors, development partners, and climate finance institutions to access technical expertise, funding, and market linkages necessary for carbon credit generation and trading; and
    - iv. Revenue generated from carbon credit initiatives by ring-fencing and utilized to finance climate action programs and other priority County development projects that promote sustainable development.
  - d) The Motion by the Member for High Rise Ward, Hon. Kennedy Oyugi, MCA, for the Assembly to resolve that; -
    - i. The County Government of Nairobi collaborates with NACADA and other relevant National Government agencies, non-governmental organizations, and community based organizations to design and implement comprehensive programs aimed sensitizing, promoting preventive education in schools, community centers and informal settlements to the youth on the dangers of drug and substance abuse, and enhancing access and rehabilitation services within the County;
    - ii. The County Government identifies and supports the reformed youth to serve as drug-free youth champions who shall act as peer educators and advocates

- against drug abuse, participate in mentorship and outreach programs and share live experiences to inspire behavior change among fellow youths;
- iii. The County Government develops a sustainable framework for integration of rehabilitated youth into society through skills development, vocational training and access to employment and entrepreneurship opportunities; and
  - iv. The County Executive submits an annual report to the County Assembly detailing the progress made in combating drug and substance abuse, and the number of youth reached through sensitization programs and outcomes of rehabilitation and reintegration initiatives.

Hon. Speaker, the Assembly Business Committee urges Members of this Assembly to familiarize with the aforementioned Bills, Motions and Reports, and prepare accordingly for debate, through the help of our Research department. Details of the Bill and Report can be obtained in the Notice Paper, being the last page of the day's Order Paper and on the County Assembly Website.

Hon. Speaker, the Assembly Business Committee shall be informing this Assembly, through its designee, the allotted business every Wednesday during the Statement Hour, for timely preparation.

Finally, Hon. Speaker, the Assembly Business Committee will again meet on Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> July 2026, at the rise of the County Assembly, to ballot business for the subsequent week. Hon. Speaker, I now wish to lay the Statement on the Table of the County Assembly. Thank you.

### ESTABLISHMENT OF A MONUMENT IN HONOUR OF THE LATE RT. HON. RAILA ODINGA

*(Resumption of debate interrupted on 10.6.2026)*

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** Hon. Members, we are on resumption of debate interrupted on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> June 2026 at 2:30 p.m., moved and seconded, and debate ongoing. Hon. Rex Omolleh to move the amendments.

**Hon. Rex Omolleh:** Thank you, Madam Speaker. I stand under Order No.6 (1) to propose amendment to the Motion on establishment of a monument in honor of the late Right Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga.

The above matter refers: This is to propose the following amendment for the Motion on establishment of a monument in honor of the late Right Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga;

By deleting the words, 'Strategic place at Uhuru Park' and substituting it therefor with the words, 'Supreme Court Roundabout'.

Sorry, Madam Speaker, my paper is not clearly... I would like to approach your Chair.

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** Hon. Member, call for a seconder. You have already proposed with amendment.

**Hon. Rex Omolleh:** Thank you, Madam Speaker, for the guidance. I request Hon. Sospeter Mumbi to second the amendment

**Hon. Sospeter Mumbi:** Thank you, Hon. Speaker. First of all, I would like to take this opportunity to appreciate Hon. Rex for this thoughtful idea of acknowledging the late Right Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga. History of this country can never be completed without the mention of Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga. I second it because it is a good move to acknowledge and appreciate the role played by Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga.

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** You second with amendment, right?

**Hon. Sospeter Mumbi:** Yes, I second with amendment to have it done at the roundabout next to the Supreme Court. Thank you.

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Sospeter.

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** Hon. Members, you may now debate. The screen is clear. May be by show of hands? Hon. Musango, as the screen indicates?

**Hon. Anthony Maragu:** Thank you, Hon. Speaker, for your understanding. I stand to support the Motion by my brother and colleague, Hon. Rex Omolleh, with amendments, as has been proposed and seconded by Hon. Sospeter Mumbi.

Hon. Speaker, the late Right Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga was many things to many of us. To us, he was a father, both at a personal capacity and also the father of the nation and democracy. Hon. Speaker, the proposal...

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** Hon. Member, we are only debating on the amendments, so that we pass it as a House before going to the actual debate.

**Hon. Anthony Maragu:** I propose that all Members join Hon. Rex Omolleh in passing it with amendments, and I hope that we get an opportunity to put forward debate. Thank you.

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** Thank you. Any other Member proposing or opposing the amendments? By show of hands? Hon. Lily Kidenda.

**Hon. Lily Kidenda:** Thank you, Hon. Speaker. I would like to propose and endorse my support for the amendment of the Motion. Thank you.

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** Thank you so much. The mover?

**Hon. Rex Omolleh:** Thank you, Madam Speaker. I would like to thank Members for their support to the amendment of this Motion. Thank you.

*(Debate on the amended Motion resumed)*

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** Hon. Members, resumption of debate interrupted on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> June 2026. You may now debate. Hon. Musango?

**Hon. Anthony Maragu:** Thank you Hon. Speaker for your understanding. For the record, my name is Anthony Maragu wa Muthoni from Karen, but nonetheless, I will proceed to speak.

Hon. Speaker, as I had started mentioning, the Right Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga EGH was many things to many Kenyans, and moreso to many of the Members of this Assembly. I stand to support the Motion noting that I called him 'Baba'. I call on my colleagues to support us in this Motion to join the country to ensure that the history of Baba is mentioned somewhere during the proceedings of their relevant assemblies.

I also want to thank my colleague Hon. Rex Omolleh for amending the Motion to have the monument placed at the Supreme Court roundabout facing the County Assembly. Hon. Speaker, this is significant for the reason that Raila Amolo Odinga was a known defender of democracy and justice for our citizens. And therefore, placing this monument right outside the apex court of the country, that is the Supreme Court, is significant. Because where it not for the Right Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga, we would not have devolution in this Country.

I invite my colleagues to support us to have this monument, so that the history and the legacy of our late hero, Raila Odinga, joins the other heroes of this country who have their monuments proudly standing within the City; the likes of Tom Mboya. In 2011, we saw our late hero, Raila Odinga, accompany the then president, His Excellency Mwai Kibaki, to unveil a monument of one impactful Kenyan, a hero of his time, Tom Mboya.

Hon. Speaker, I want to one day walk my daughter to a monument of Raila Odinga within the City to show her a hero of my time. This monument will help us in preserving the collective memory of the achievements of the Right Honorable Raila Amolo Odinga. It will help us embody the shared values that he impacted on us. It will serve as a fostering community identity for the great citizens of this country who still celebrate the impact and the legacy of Raila Odinga.

This is monument, for the current generations and those to come, will serve for educational purposes. Hon. Speaker, I want to join and ask my colleagues to support us to have that monument placed right outside Supreme Court, in honor of our fallen hero. I thank you.

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** Thank you, Member for Karen Ward. Hon. Lily Kidenda.

**Hon Lily Kidenda:** Thank you, Madam Speaker. I would like to start off by thanking the young politician, Hon. Rex Omolleh, and Karen One for their contribution and for this Motion. I count it as historical day that I am alive and in this Assembly to be able to contribute to this Motion. Many children will be born who will hear the name Raila Amolo Odinga and may not be able to hear the history, but for this monument.

As I stand here, I speak about a man who many people called an enigma and Baba. Even in that space of calling him Baba, he was Baba at different levels to different people. He was a true father to those whose lives he touched in a way that only they can explain. He was a father to many because he gave direction in this nation like no other, I dare say. In him, there was an honest, brave but compassionate and selfless.

What intrigues me is the extent to which the Right Hon. Raila Odinga put his life on line for this nation and its people. He was a trailblazer because he dared spaces where other people would not step. He was first to explore uncharted territories. He shook hands across political divides as at individual level, having negotiated but knowing that a number of people were totally against it. Why? Because the life of the Kenyan people meant life to him. He valued lives to a level that many will never be able to understand.

Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga pushed boundaries where the devil would shy from treading. I know people in this nation who would die for him, not like sycophants, but people who understood the heart, the depth to which he loved this country. He was a democrat and a leader of special kind

As I close, I want to say that any sector where the Right Honorable Raila Odinga served stands high above many in this country. People leave legacies but others leave footprints that are cast in stone. That was Raila for you. He was a peacemaker who did not shy away from controversy because he loved this nation of Kenya.

The action to make this a reality should take the shortest time. I pray that my fellow Hon. Members will speak to this Motion and will support it, and today we leave this Assembly knowing that history has been made. Thank you, Hon. Speaker. I support.

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** Hon. Jared Akama?

**Hon. Jared Ondieki:** Thank you very much, Madam Speaker, for giving me this opportunity to support this Motion, and at the same time, congratulate my neighbor, Hon. Rex Omolleh, for this incredible Motion. I just want to inform Hon. Kidenda that Hon. Rex is not a young politician. He has been there for some time. I remember in 2007, he ran for a Member of Parliament and he abducted himself to gain some sympathy. So he has been there for some time.

*(Laughter)*

Hon. Speaker, back to this important Motion, Hon. Speaker, it is good for us to understand the importance of a monument. A monument is there to remind us of history. So, having this monument in honor of Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga will remind us of our history, both the present and the future.

Hon. Speaker, I want to believe that all of us in this Assembly today, are here because we are children of devolution. When history is written, the name of Raila Odinga will always be inscribed in devolution. We all understand what devolution has done in this great nation in terms of development and bringing services close to our people. Therefore, this monument being erected in the capital will always remind the current and the future generation that there was one person who stood strong for us to realize devolution.

Hon. Speaker, I want to congratulate again Hon. Rex Omolleh because of bringing this amendment to ensure that the monument is close to the Supreme Court. Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga stood for justice in this country. Therefore, I believe that the Supreme Court signifies justice for the people, for the oppressed and all that. For us to ensure that this monument is erected next to the Supreme Court will be a great honor for Raila Odinga for what he stood for; justice for all.



Hon. Speaker, when this monument will stand high in the middle of the capital city, Hon. Speaker, it will be an inspiration to the young generation as well to continue standing for what Hon. Raila Amolo Odinga stood for. I want to believe that this House will support this motion with the support it deserves. With those few remarks, I strongly support. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

**Hon. Temporary Speaker:** My screen is still clear. Any other Hon. Member by a show of hands? Hon. Fathiya.

**Hon. Fathiya Mohamed:** Thank you, Hon. Speaker. I would also like to add on to what Hon. Members have stated. We have so many other monuments dating back to 15th century, including in the Swahili and Portuguese coastal settlements. I believe that this monument for an enigma, Baba, is timely. It is historical. I also know that the National Government has put some budget to put one monument in Kango Ka Jaramogi, and Siaya.

Baba has touched my life in a way, and I would love to support this Motion and say that it is historical and it is indeed needed. Thank you.

**Hon. Rex Omolleh:** Thank you, Madam Speaker. I would like to thank all the Members for their contribution, starting with the Hon. It was not the year 2007 but 2013 that I was kidnapped. But I thank God I am today here as a Member of the County Assembly, safe and sound. I also wish to thank Madam Lily Kidenda and all the Hon. Members who supported this Motion. There are many Members who really wanted to speak about this Motion, but they are not here today. Even the Majority Leader and Minority Leader were supporting this Motion.

Madam Speaker, we thank you very much for this time. I beg to reply.

  - 11 (c) Undertake periodic and comprehensive market analysis and studies to assess the local market for building scale and distributed clean renewable and sustainable energy.

11 (d) Identify investment gaps and barriers and determine appropriate policy responses and publish the findings.

- vi) That Sub-Clause e is deleted in its entirety.

- vii) That Sub-Clause f is deleted in its entirety.

- viii) That Sub-Clause 11 (g) is amended by inserting the words ‘interested stakeholders including civil society organisations, communities and’ immediately after the words ‘work with’

- ix) Sub-clause 11(h) is amended by deleting the word certain immediately after the words ‘below a certain size’.

- x) Sub-clause 11(h) is amended inserting the words as will be prescribed in regulations immediately after the word ‘size’.

- xi) Sub-clause 11(j) is deleted in its entirety and replacing it with a new clause 11(j) to read;

11(j) Mandate the integration of building scale renewable energy systems through green building codes by requiring new developments, residential and commercial buildings and major roof replacements to install or be designed to accommodate building scale renewable energy technologies such as solar Photovoltaic (PV) systems and solar water heating systems to provide a sustainable roofing zone covering at least 50% of the roof area in accordance with the prescribed building standards as a condition for development approval or compliance with applicable building codes.

## **SCHEDULE**

### **THE CONDUCT OF BUSINESS AND AFFAIRS OF THE BOARD**

#### **1. Meetings.**

The Board shall meet as often as may be necessary for the dispatch of its business but there shall be at least four meetings of the Board in any financial year.

#### **2. Election of Vice Chairperson.**

At the first meeting, the Board shall elect a vice-chairperson amongst their number and regard shall be taken to ensure that the chairperson and vice-chairperson shall be of opposite gender.

#### **3. Time and place of meetings.**

A meeting of the Board shall be held on such date and at such time and place as the Board may determine.

#### **4. Special meetings.**

The chairperson shall, on the written application of one-third of the members, convene a special meeting of the Board.

**5. Quorum.**

The quorum for the conduct of business at a meeting of the Board shall be any three members excluding ex-officio members of the Board.

**6. Voting.**

The Chairperson shall preside at every meeting of the Board at which he or she is present and in the absence of the chairperson at a meeting, the vice-chairperson, shall preside and in the absence of both the chairperson and the vice-chairperson, the members present shall elect one of their number who shall, with respect to that meeting and the business transacted in that meeting, have all the powers of the chairperson.

**7. Decisions of the Board**

Unless a unanimous decision is reached, a decision on any matter before the Board shall be by concurrence of a majority of all the members present and voting at the meeting.

**8. Validity of proceedings.**

Subject to paragraph 5, no proceedings of the Board shall be invalid by reason only of a vacancy among the members thereof.

**9. Signification of instruments and decisions of the Board**

Unless otherwise provided by or under any law, all instruments made by and decisions of the Board shall be signified under the hand of the Chairperson.
