# NOTICES

#### The Assembly resolved on Thursday, February 15, 2018 as follows:-

- i. THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, the debate on any Motion for the Adjournment of the Assembly to a day other than the next normal Sitting Day in accordance with the Calendar of the Assembly, be limited to a maximum of three (3) hours with not more than five (5) minutes for each Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order. Provided that, when the period of Recess proposed by any such motion does not exceed ten (10) days, the debate shall be limited to a maximum of thirty minutes (30), and shall be strictly confined to the question of the adjournment.
- ii. THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on a Report of a Committee, a Sessional Paper or any other Report submitted to the Assembly, be limited as follows: A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.

IT IS NOTIFIED that the Assembly Business Committee, at their last meeting, approved the following <u>tentative</u> business to appear in the Order Paper for Thursday, 16<sup>th</sup> August 2018:-

#### A. MOTION – KENNEDY OBUYA, MCA

Subjects: Establishment of an Electric Engineering Directorate under the Energy Sector

**AWARE THAT**, Paragraph (8)(e) of Part Two of the Forth Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides for County Planning and Development, particularly on Electricity and Gas Reticulation and Energy Regulation as a County Function; FURTHER AWARE that Section 6 (2) (c) of the County Governments Act, 2012 gives power to the County Governments to delegate any of its functions to its officers, decentralized units or other entities in the County; NOTING that Nairobi County is yet to realize its potential on renewable energy from resources such as Solar, Biogas/Biomass, Wind and by recycling of solid waste; FURTHER that Energy Sub-Sector in the Financial Year 2018/2019 Budgetary allocation had a total budget of Ksh. 360 Million, with an allocation of 340 Million under Development and 20 Million under recurrent to promote use of Clean and Affordable Energy for Nairobi and its visitors; CONCERNED that the Sector lacks sufficient capacity to implement key renewable energy projects such as solar lighting, Biomas technology among others; APPRECIATING that there is need for the County Governments to build the existing capacity of the sector to enable them engage on effective Public Private Partnership where necessary as contemplated in Section 6 (3) of the County Governments Act, 2012; this ASSEMBLY URGES the County Executive to move with speed and establish a fully-fledged Electrical Engineering Directorate under the existing Energy Sector to enable the County maximize on the existing renewable energy projects in the County for cost effective gains
