8. ***. MOTION - HON. SILAS MATARA, MCA**

THAT, aware that the County government is increasingly investing heavily in infrastructural and other major developments, including in its projected development blueprint as detailed in the County Integrated Development Plan; **NOTING** that part of the main focus of these major development projects is the creation of employment opportunities for the youth enabling them to earn a living; **DEEPLY CONCERNED** however that most youths from the localities where these major projects are carried out do not often benefit from the opportunities available with such developments; **RECOGNIZING** that cash-for-work activities and the promotion of youth friendly and income generating micro-projects within such development initiatives carries great potential for alleviating youth unemployment in the City; **OBSERVING** that such major County projects similarly carry the potential for building the capacity of local youths and youth associations to ensure sustainable management of the youth as a resource; **FURTHER OBSERVING** that by such engagement, the local youths are encouraged to continue with maintenance of the community assets beyond the project period; this **ASSEMBLY URGES** the County Executive to put in place measures to ensure local youths within the County's major project areas such as infrastructural developments are prioritized for employment in such projects.

The Assembly resolved on Wednesday, February 14, 2018 as follows:-

- I. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:-A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

The Assembly resolved on Thursday, February 15, 2018 as follows:-

- I. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, a Sessional Paper or any other Report submitted to the Assembly, be limited as follows: - A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.

IT IS NOTIFIED that the Assembly Business Committee, at their last meeting, approved the following *tentative* business to appear in the Order Paper for Thursday, April, 19, 2018:-

A. MOTION – HON. SILAS MATARA, MCA

THAT, aware that the National Government's Youth Volunteer Programme has been instrumental in creating opportunities for young people across the Country and Nairobi County to engage themselves meaningfully in Nation building while earning an income; **NOTING** that whereas the Youth Volunteer Program is changing lives, more needs to be done by other stakeholders such as County Governments to support the National Government initiative to realize its true potential; **DEEPLY CONCERNED** that Nairobi City County has perhaps one of the highest populations of young graduates and that the National Government Program cannot absorb all qualified youths into the Program; **RECOGNIZING** that support from the Nairobi County Government in coordination with the National Government, where the Nairobi County Government similarly identifies and or creates opportunities for internship and volunteering for young people and avails the same to them yearly carries the potential to greatly worsen youth unemployment in the City and its attendant ills over the long run; this **ASSEMBLY URGES** the County Executive to explore mechanisms for the establishment of a Nairobi City County Youth internship and Volunteer Program.
