8. *MOTION – MOTION – HON. SILAS MATARA, MCA

Subject: Development of regulations & policy for civic education prior to any public participation

AWARE that Article 35 (1) (a) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides that every citizen has the right of access to information held by the state; **FURTHER AWARE THAT** Section 7(2)(d) & (e) of the Nairobi City County Public Participation Act, 2015 provides that the County Government shall establish appropriate mechanism, process and procedures to enable the public participate in the affairs of the County and shall provide for, but not limited to; consultative sessions with locally recognized communities, organizations, and where necessary minorities, and report back to the local community in a timely manner; **APPRECIATING THAT** the County Government of Nairobi City has in the past been able to engage members of the general public on key decision making as the case is with budget making process in the County as provided for in Section 125(2) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012; **CONCERNED THAT**, limited Constitutional timelines often hinder the level of engagement with the public and on dissemination of the required information that would facilitate an informed feedback and contribution by the general public on the subject matter in question; **FURTHER CONCERNED** that with the diverse academic background, there is need for the public to be informed on the decisions in question, its significance and effect of such decision in a civic education manner to enable the public to make an informed decision and add value to such process; this **ASSEMBLY URGES** the County Executive to urgently develop policy and regulations that will govern conduct of civic education in line with the Nairobi City County Public Participation Act, 2015 and the County Governments Act, 2012.

Subject: Adoption of the Report on an Inquiry

THAT, This Assembly adopts THE REPORT OF THE SELECT COMMITTEE ON POWERS AND PRIVILEGES ON THE INQUIRY INTO UNETHICAL CONDUCT OF HONORABLE MEMBERS ON 6TH OF NOVEMBER, 2018 WITHIN THE COUNTY ASSEMBLY PRECINCTS, laid on the Table of the Assembly on Tuesday, 30th April, 2019.

<u>NOTICES</u>

I. The Assembly resolved on Wednesday, 13th February, 2019 as follows: -

- a) THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, a Sessional Paper or any other Report submitted to the Assembly, be limited as follows: A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.
- **b) THAT,** notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:-A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

Subject: Care for children with autism in the County

THAT, aware that Article 26 of the Constitution of Kenya (2010) gives the citizen of this Country and residents of Nairobi City County a right to life; further aware that Health Services including County Health facilities and primary health care have been devolved to the County Governments pursuant to paragraph 2 of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution; acknowledging that autism is development disorder of neurobiological origin that can have a lifelong effect on social interaction, ability to communicate ideas and feelings, imagination and establishment of relationships; recognizing that autism is one of the categories of special education and is a serious, lifelong and disabling condition and without the right support it can have a profound effect to individuals and families; concerned that many children with special needs such as those with autism in the County Early Childhood Education Centres drop out school due to unconducive environment occasioned by lack of equipment and facilities; observing that one of the functions of the County Persons with disabilities Board is to provide to the maximum extent possible assistive devices, appliances and other equipment to persons with disabilities; and access to available information and technical assistance to all institutions and organizations concerned with the welfare and rehabilitation of persons with disabilities; this Assembly urges the County Executive to:-

- i. Establish, construct, and equip specific classrooms for children with special needs in order to accommodate autistic learners;
- ii. Provide early and accurate diagnosis of autism; and
- iii. Establish a Committee to address non-compliance and violation with the primary objective being of mastering academic goals to ensure that interventions are accessible and effective so as to guarantee the success of include education for learners diagnosed with autism.
