THE NAIROBI CITY COUNTY APPROPRIATION BILL, 2020 (ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 6 OF 2020)

(First Reading)

10. *MOTION – HON. MOSES OGETO NYANGARESI, MCA***Subject: Guidelines for secondment and/or deployment of public officers***

THAT, aware that Article 187 of the Constitution, 2010 and Section 24 of the Intergovernmental Relations Act, 2012 provides for the transfer of functions and powers from one level of Government to another; **further** aware that on 25th February, 2020, the Governor signed a memorandum transferring some of the County Government functions such as health services, transport services, county planning and development services and public works to the National Government as provided for in the Constitution which took effect from 17th March, 2020 and for twenty-four (24) months subject to renewal; **acknowledging** that in execution of the Transfer Deed, His Excellence the President established the Nairobi Metropolitan Services Office to spearhead the implementation of the transferred functions; **recognizing** that there has been a rift between the County Executive and the Nairobi Metropolitan Services on various issues such as process of secondment and/or deployment of public officers from the County Executive to Nairobi Metropolitan Services; **noting** that Article 187 (2) (b) of the Constitution provides that constitutional responsibility for performance of the function or exercise of power on transferred functions shall remain with the government to which it is assigned by the Fourth Schedule, this Assembly urges the County Executive in conjunction with the Nairobi Metropolitan Services to develop guidelines for approval by the County Assembly on the secondment and/or deployment of officers from the County Government to the Nairobi Metropolitan Service to enhance seamless service delivery to the residents of Nairobi City County.

NOTICES

I. The Assembly resolved on Wednesday, 19th February, 2020 as follows: -

- a) **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:-A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.
- b) **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on **Bills NOT** sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party be limited as follows:- A maximum of three hours and thirty minutes, with not more than thirty (30) minutes for the Mover, in moving and ten (10) minutes in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

IT IS NOTIFIED that the Select Committee on Assembly Business, at its last meeting, approved the following ***tentative*** business to appear in the Order Paper for Tuesday 15th September, 2020 at 2.30 p.m.: -

A. *MOTION – HON. SILAS MATARA ONGWAE, MCA

Subject: Management and sharing Revenue from the Nairobi National Park.

THAT, aware that under the Article 186 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya, and Fourth Schedule, the functions and powers of County Government, among others, covers Cultural activities, public entertainment and public amenities, including county parks and recreation facilities; further aware that paragraph 7 of the Fourth Schedule provides for the function County Government which include regulation of local tourism; acknowledging that the Nairobi National Park has attracted tourists both locally and internationally because of its strategic place and richness in various species of wildlife; concerned that despite the park being located in the County, the management and operations of the park are under the National Government which is against the spirit of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution; further concerned that the County does not share any revenue from the Park; noting that the Intergovernmental Relations Act, 2012 provides for the establishment the National and County Government Co-coordinating Summit which provide forum for consultation and co-operation between the two levels of governments, this Assembly urges the County Executive to engage the National Government with the view to jointly managing the operations of the Nairobi National Park and sharing of revenue from the Park between the National Government and the County Government.
