**8. \*MOTION – HON. JOHN MUTHIGA KAMAU, MCA**

***Subject: Prohibition of use of roundabouts as laybys, parking and termini by public service vehicles***

**THAT** aware that Article 46 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides that consumers of goods and services have a right to protection, health, safety and **economic interests**, the Constitution in Part II of the Fourth Schedule apportions the parking and traffic aspects of transport function to County Governments; **COGNIZANCE THAT** Section 27 of the Nairobi City County Traffic Act, 2020 prohibits PSVs from picking and dropping passengers at undesignated bus stops and Sections 46 and 47 of the Act prohibits persons from parking on public roads in a manner that impedes traffic flow and strictly restricts parking to the designated areas, the Sections particularly prohibits PSVs from using undesignated areas as parking prior to obtaining authority from the County; **NOTING THAT** in pursuit of the County beautification initiatives, the County has from year to year allocated and appropriated funds towards rehabilitation, greening and decoration of roundabouts including entering into maintenance agreements with private companies for the purpose of environmental aesthetics; **DEEPLY CONCERNED THAT** the persistent use of roundabouts by PSVs as termini has continued to cause heavy tailbacks of traffic on key roads such as Outer Ring road on a daily basis leading to loss of productive time

and loss of value for public money and investments; this Assembly urges the County Executive and the Nairobi Metropolitan Services to: -

- 1) Issue a public notice prohibiting public transport (PSVs) from using roundabouts as termini, laybys and/or parking areas in contravention of the law;
- 2) Continuously enforce the foregoing prohibition notice using enforcement officers and the County and Sub-County levels; and
- 3) Formulate regulations to the Nairobi City County Transport Act 2020 forthwith to provide for punitive measures for operators who illegally use roundabouts as termini, laybys or parking.

## **NOTICES**

I. **The Assembly resolved on Tuesday, 9<sup>th</sup> February, 2021 as follows: -**

**THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 103(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:-A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

**\*MOTION – HON. PETER WANYOIKE, MCA**

***Subject: Provision of scholarships and subsidies for learners on village polytechnics and home craft centres***

**THAT**, aware that Article 43 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides that every person has a right to education; **FURTHER AWARE THAT** Part 2 of the second schedule of the CoK, 2010 apports the education function of village polytechnics and home craft centres to County Governments; and that the Social Pillar of Kenya's Vision 2030 underscore the importance of education and training to the realization of the objective of realizing a newly industrializing, middle-income country providing a high quality of life to all its citizens by 2030 in a clean and secure environment; **COGNIZANT THAT** technical and training institutions offer a unique opportunity to students who graduate from secondary schools who fail to meet the requisite threshold to join tertiary institutions; **ACKNOWLEDGING THAT** in response to demand for technical and vocational training in Kenya, Parliament passed the Technical and Vocational Education Act, 2013 to that is comprehensive on the overall government objective towards educating its citizens; **OBSERVANT THAT** the national government in its quest to enhance enrolment into primary and secondary schools rolled out a raft of measures including provision of subsidies and whereas this the HELB loans to university students is a repayable advancement, it has helped many student s realize their potentials by eliminating the interruption factor of fee arrears; **CONCERNED THAT** the bursaries given advanced to trainees by the County Government notwithstanding, many students are currently missing out on the training programmes offered by village polytechnics for lack of funding; This Assembly urges the County Executive to domesticate the national government subsidy and scholarship programmes for students being enrolled or already enrolled into village polytechnics and home craft centres that are under the purview of County Government mandate.
