8. \*<u>MOTION</u> – <u>HON. EMMY KHATEMESHI ISALAMBO, MCA</u> Subject: *provision of medical services for County contract service/casual workers* 

**AWARE THAT,** the County Public Service Board often approves Sectors such as Mobility and Works to engage contract services/casual employees to provide support to the County; their services cuts across Sectors and include clearing of drainage systems, gardening, landscaping and doing road works oftenly for a period of more than one month; **Concerned that** the workers are usually hired to provide such services over a period of time and as a result of the nature of the work they do, they are likely to pose risks to their wellbeing and health; **Acknowledging that** for the period that the County engages the workers, the County and workers are deemed to have entered in an employer-employee engagement in the definitions contained in Section 2 of the Employment Act, 2007; **Appreciating that** Article 43 (1) (a) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 entitles every person to the highest attainable standard of health, which includes the right to health care services; **Noting That**, Section 34 of the Employment Act, 2007 requires of employers to provide sufficient and proper medicine during illness except when the employee is covered by a medical scheme provided by Government; ..../8\*.Cont. **Concerned that** in the definition of Article 260 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and Public Service Human Resource Policies, such employees are not in the categories of public or civil servants and leaves them vulnerable in terms of benefits related to wellbeing. This Assembly urges the County Executive to put in place structures, measures and guidelines on attendance to the medical needs of staff on short-term contracts/casual workers.

#### 9. \*<u>MOTION</u> – <u>HON. BRIAN ITENYA, MCA</u> Subject: *Building Plans to have adequate parkings for tenants*

**THAT,** aware that Article 186 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, and paragraph 5 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provide for the functions and powers of County Government on County transport including regulation of county roads, street lighting, public road transport traffic and parking; further aware that Paragraph 8 of part two of the Forth Schedule of the Constitution, 2010 provides for county planning and development including housing as a County function; acknowledging that recent years have witnessed increased development of residential apartments within the County and more so in informal areas; concerned that most residential buildings were built with inadequate parking spaces for the tenants; further concerned that most tenants have opted to parking their vehicles on the road reserves and pavements thus blocking other motorists, this has contributed to increased traffic snarl up in some residential areas in the County especially during rush hours, this Assembly urges the County Executive to develop regulations to provide for all building plans for residential buildings to have adequate parking spaces for tenants.

IT IS NOTIFIED that the Select Committee on Assembly Business, at its last meeting, approved the following <u>tentative</u> business to appear in the Order Paper for Tuesday, 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2023 at 2.30 p.m.: -

#### A. \*<u>MOTION</u> – <u>HON. SOSPETER MUMBI, MCA</u> Subject: *Installation of Speed limit signs and Increase Pedestrian Cross on the County Roads*

**THAT,** aware that under Article 186 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya, and paragraph 5 of the Second Part of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution, the functions and powers of County Government, among others, include County transport which includes county roads, street lighting, public road transport traffic and parking; **further aware that** the City has designated preferential zebra crossing throughout the City County roads; **noting that** recent years have witnessed a marked increase in the number of vehicles plying various routes in the County as well as increased pedestrian population; **concerned that** most county roads have limited marked speed limits and zebra crossing which has led to increased traffic congestion and accidents including deaths to pedestrians caused by speeding motorists; **further noting that** the few available legal speed limits and zebra crossing points were done long time ago when the City had few vehicles and pedestrians population, this Assembly urges the County Executive to:-

- 1. undertake an audit of County Roads with a view to redesignate more speed limit areas and increase designated pedestrian cross where necessary and rehabilitate the existing ones with visible signs to ease traffic flow and minimize road carnage across all County Roads; and
- 2. enforce the speed limits and other traffic rules with the aid of modern technology.
