#### 8. \*<u>PROCEDURAL MOTION</u> – <u>THE LEADER OF THE MAJORITY PARTY</u> Subject: Limitation of Debate on Bills Sponsored by Parties or Committees

**THAT,** pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 106(1), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on **Bills** sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

**THAT,** pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 106(1), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on any Motion, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:-A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

#### 10. \*<u>PROCEDURAL MOTION</u> – <u>THE LEADER OF THE MAJORITY PARTY</u> Subject: Limitation of Debate on Individual Members' Bills

**THAT,** pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 106(1), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on **Bills NOT** sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party be limited as follows:-A maximum of three hours and thirty minutes, with not more than thirty (30) minutes for the Mover, in moving and ten (10) minutes in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

#### 11. \*<u>PROCEDURAL MOTION – THE LEADER OF THE MAJORITY PARTY</u> Subject: Limitation of Debate on Reports

**THAT,** pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 106(1), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, a Sessional Paper or any other Report submitted to the Assembly, be limited as follows: - A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.

#### 12. \*<u>PROCEDURAL MOTION</u> – <u>THE LEADER OF THE MAJORITY PARTY</u> Subject: Limitation of Debate on the Motion on the Address by the Governor

**THAT,** pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 106(1), and in furtherance to the provisions of Standing Order 27(5), this Assembly orders that debate on the **Motion on the Address by the Governor** be limited to no more than five (5) minutes for each Member Speaking, thirty (30) minutes for the Mover in moving and replying and twenty (20) minutes for the Leader of Minority Party.

#### 13. \*<u>PROCEDURAL MOTION</u> – <u>THE LEADER OF THE MAJORITY PARTY</u> Subject: Limitation of Debate on the Adjournment Motion

**THAT,** pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 106(1), this Assembly orders that, the debate on **any Motion for the Adjournment** of the Assembly to a day other than the next normal Sitting Day in accordance with the Calendar of the Assembly, be limited to a maximum of three (3) hours with not more than five (5) minutes for each Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order. Provided that, when the period of Recess proposed by any such motion does not exceed ten (10) days, the debate shall be limited to a maximum of the adjournment.

#### 14. \*<u>MOTION</u> – <u>THE LEADER OF THE MAJORITY PARTY</u> Subject: Approval of the Assembly Calendar for the Third Session

**THAT,** pursuant to the provision of Standing Order 31(1), this Assembly approves the Calendar of the County Assembly (*Regular Sessions*) for the Third Session (2024) as contained in the Schedule.

#### 15. \*<u>MOTION</u> – <u>CHAIRPERSON, AD-HOC COMMITTEE ON INQUIRY INTO</u> THE COUNTY LOCAL REVENUE COLLECTION SYSTEM(S) AND <u>ADMINISTRATION</u>

Subject: To renew the mandate of the Ad Hoc Committee

**THAT, AWARE** that at the sitting of the County Assembly held on **Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> October, 2023,** the County Assembly approved a Motion to establish an *Ad Hoc* Committee to investigate into the performance of Nairobi City County's revenue collection system (s) and administration.

**FURTHER AWARE** that on 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2023, the County Assembly approved a subsequent Motion constituting the said *Ad Hoc* Committee.

**APPRECIATING** that pursuant to Standing Order 211(4) (b) the mandate of the Committee lapsed on **Wednesday, 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2024** while the County Assembly was still on long recess prior to which the Committee had notified the Hon. Speaker on the then impending lapse vide a memo dated **25<sup>th</sup> January, 2024**.

**ACKNOWLEDGING** that the Committee has undertaken a tremendous amount of work in the execution of its mandate;

**NOTING** that circumstances surrounding gaps in revenue collection in the County continue to evolve while the Committee is yet to meet some crucial witnesses and visit various sites whose evidence and findings are critical in the inquiry.

**NOW THEREFORE**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 211 (4) (b), the County Assembly resolves to renew the mandate of the *Ad Hoc* Committee by a further period not exceeding **forty-five (45) days** with effect from **1**<sup>st</sup> **February, 2024**, and to table its final report on or before **Tuesday 19**<sup>th</sup> **March, 2024**.

#### B. <u>MOTION – HON. MWAURA SAMORA, MCA</u> Subject: *Establishment of a Nairobi City County Virtual Artisan Bureau.*

**AWARE** that Article 55(b) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 requires the State take measures, including affirmative action programmes, to ensure that the youth have opportunities to associate, be represented and participate in political, social, economic and other spheres of life; **DISTURBED** that over 60% of youths in the County were recorded to be unemployed as at the 2019 Census Report, with at least 82.7% of the jobs in Kenya being categorized in the informal economy –"*Jua Kali*" according to the Kenya National Bureau of Statistics 2014 Report; **ACKNOWLEDGING** the need for deliberate efforts by the County Government to promote the Small, Micro and Macro Enterprises in the County through provision of a virtual platform that would enable the County residents access Artisan Services **Bureau**, residents in the County will be able to remotely access, inquire and seek artisan services such as Plumbing, Electrical, Carpentry, Welding, Painting among others from the registered and vetted service providers a formal County **Dystem**; this **ASSEMBLY URGES** the County Executive to develop a **Nairobi City County Virtual Artisan Bureau** that will vet, license and link artisans to those who require their services for promotion of economy in the County.
