- I. The Assembly resolved on Wednesday, 12th February, 2025 as follows: -
 - Paper or any other Report submitted to the Assembly, be limited as follows:

 A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.
 - b) THAT, each speech in a debate on any Motion for the Adjournment of the Assembly to a day other than the next normal Sitting Day in accordance with the Calendar of the Assembly, be limited to a maximum of three (3) hours with not more than five (5) minutes for each Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order. Provided that, when the period of Recess proposed by any such motion does not exceed ten (10) days, the debate shall be limited to a maximum of thirty minutes (30), and shall be strictly confined to the question of the adjournment.

Subject: Develop a County Local Tourism Policy

THAT, aware that paragraph 4 of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides for the functions of cultural activities and public entertainment including sports, cultural activities, museums and county parks are vested in the County Government; further paragraph 7 of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides for the function of local tourism vested in the County Government; acknowledging that Nairobi City County serves as one of the main travel, diplomatic and cultural hub for Eastern and Central Africa with well-established tourist attraction sites from social, academic to spiritual matters; concerned that the County has not established well-founded cultural activities that can distinguish the uniqueness of the County from others despite having all it takes to be called "the Green City in the Sun"; noting that cultural activities attract tourists from all over the world which is a source of revenue for the County, create job opportunities/employment for the county residents and create a platform for the Nairobi City County Tourism development agenda, this Assembly urges the County Government to develop a comprehensive County local tourism policy to provide for establishment of strategies and programmes to boost local tourism within the County.
