10. *THE COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE COUNTY ASSEMBLY – TO CONSIDER THE NAIROBI CITY COUNTY WARDS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME BILL, 2026 (ASSEMBLY BILL NO.2 OF 2026)

Subject: *Committee of the Whole County Assembly*

The Nairobi City County Wards Development Programme Bill, 2026 (Assembly Bill No.2 of 2026)

(Hon. Dabar Ahmedqadar Mohamed, MCA – Chairman, Select Committee on Wards Development Fund)

(Committee of the Whole County Assembly)

11. *MOTION – HON. SAMSON OCHIENG' JERA, MCA

Subject: *Investigation of all public and open spaces irregularly developed in the County by the County Executive in conjunction with National Lands Commission*

AWARE THAT Article 67 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 establishes the National Lands Commission with its functions being amongst others to; manage public land on behalf of the National and County Governments; and, to initiate investigations, on its own initiative or on a complaint, into present or historical land injustices, and recommend appropriate redress; **CONCERNED THAT** public land and open spaces reserved for the development of essential public amenities such as schools, hospitals, markets, recreational facilities and other infrastructure critical for public service delivery has been irregularly allocated, illegally occupied, or developed by private individuals and entities, thereby denying residents access to essential services and impeding the County Government's ability to implement critical development projects; **DEEPLY**

CONCERNED that the continued grabbing and encroachment of these parcels of land undermines the urban planning frameworks, violates land use regulations and contributes to the deterioration of service delivery in sectors such as education, healthcare, and sanitation; **NOTING** that the National Land Commission (NLC) is constitutionally mandated to manage public land on behalf of National and County Governments, and is empowered to initiate investigations into historical and current land injustices; **NOW THEREFORE**, this Assembly urges the County Executive in conjunction with National Land Commission to;-

- i) Conduct a comprehensive audit and investigation on all public land and open spaces in Nairobi City County that have been irregularly allocated, occupied, or developed in the County;
- ii) Publicly share the outcomes of the investigations and table a comprehensive report with recommendations to the relevant National and County Government institutions including the County Assembly for further action; and,
- iii) Take appropriate action to reclaim such parcels of land where illegality has been committed either by the Commission or the Courts of Law.

12. *MOTION – HON. KENNEDY OYUGI, MCA

Subject: *Promotion of Road safety in the Nairobi City County*

AWARE that, paragraph 5 of Part 2 of the fourth schedule of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides for County Transport including but not limited to; County roads, street lighting, traffic and parking and public road transportation as a devolved county function; **FURTHER AWARE** that Section 5 (2) of the Nairobi City County Transport Act, 2020 provides that the relevant County Executive Committee Member shall be responsible for *inter-alia*; regulation of an integrated public transport system, and promotion of non-motorized transport in the County; **DISTURBED THAT** road safety remains a critical concern within Nairobi City County, particularly within the Central Business District (CBD), where high human and vehicular traffic creates increased risk for accidents and conflicts among road users; **DEEPLY CONCERNED THAT** the rapid growth of *boda boda* motorcycle transport and Public Service Vehicles (PSVs), especially *matatus*, has significantly contributed to congestion, disorderly movement, and frequent violations of traffic regulations within the CBD, with the highest violators of lane discipline and use of walkways being the *boda boda* operators; **COGNIZANT THAT**, pedestrians and other users of non-motorized transport continue to face unsafe conditions due to encroachment on footpaths, walkways, and designated non-motorized transport lanes by motorcycles and other vehicles, compromises public safety, accessibility, and order within the city; **AGITATED THAT**, excessive hooting and the use of loud and modified mufflers by motor vehicles and motorcycles within the CBD has created noise pollution, causing nuisance and disruption to corporate offices, government institutions, learning

institutions, and other public spaces; **RECOGNIZING THAT**, the promotion of disciplined road usage, enforcement of traffic regulations, and reduction of noise pollution are critical components of a safe, orderly, and livable urban environment; **APPRECIATING THAT**, effective collaboration between the County Government, the National Government, and relevant agencies is essential in achieving sustainable road safety and urban mobility management; this **ASSEMBLY THEREFORE RESOLVES** that;-

- i) The County Government of Nairobi develops and implements a **comprehensive Road Safety and Urban Order Campaign**, with particular focus on the Central Business District, aimed at promoting safe and orderly coexistence among *Boda boda* motorcycle riders, Public Service Vehicle (PSV) operators, pedestrians and users of non-motorized transport;
- ii) The County Executive, in collaboration with the National Government and its agencies, enforces regulations to **ban unnecessary hooting** within the Central Business District, **Prohibit the use of loud and modified mufflers** by motor vehicles and motorcycles that contribute to excessive noise pollution and establish enforce acceptable noise level standards within urban areas;
- iii) The County Executive develops supportive infrastructure and systems, including; clearly demarcated pedestrian walkways and non-motorized transport lanes and installation of signage on “No Hooting Zones” and noise control areas within the CBD;
- iv) Enforce the 10KPH speed limit within the Central Business District;
- v) Develop more pedestrian crossing areas (Zebra Crossing) and enforce the use of them for the safety of road users; and
- vi) The County Executive to submit a **progress report within six (6) months** to the County Assembly detailing the implementation status of the road safety campaign, compliance levels among road users and reduction in accidents, encroachment cases, and noise pollution levels within the CBD.

- I. **NOTICE is given that the Chairperson of the Select Committee on Wards Development Fund intends to move the following amendments to the Nairobi City County Wards Development Programmes Bill, 2026 at the Committee Stage: -**

LONG TITLE

THAT, the Long Title of the Bill be amended as follows; -

- (i) By deleting the long title and substituting it thereof with a new long title to read as follows; -

“AN ACT of the County Assembly of Nairobi City to provide for a framework for the identification, financing, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of ward-based development projects; to promote equitable socio-economic development; and for connected purposes.”

CLAUSE 1

THAT, Clause 1 of the Bill be amended as follows; -

- (i) By inserting the words **“and shall come into operation upon publication in the gazette”** immediately after the figures ‘2026’

CLAUSE 2

THAT, Clause 2 of the bill be amended as follows: -

- a) By deleting the definition of the word **“Sub-County Administrator”** and replace it thereof with the following definition
“the office of Sub-County Administrator established under section 50 of the County Governments Act, 2012”

CLAUSE 11

THAT, Clause 11 of the bill be amended as follows;-

- a) By deleting the words **“section 21”** and replacing it thereof with the words **“sections 19 and 21**

CLAUSE 30

THAT, Clause 30 of the bill be amended as follows;-

- a) By deleting the numeric **“13”** and replacing it with the numeric **“129”** thereof
b) by deleting the words **“section 17”** and replacing with the words **“this Act”**

CLAUSE 31

THAT, Clause 31 of the Bill be amended as follows; -

- (i) In **Sub-clause (3)** by inserting a new sub-clause immediately after sub-clause (3) to read as follows;
 - (4) **“Procurement under this Act shall be undertaken in accordance with the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015 and any other applicable law.”**

CLAUSE 33

THAT, Clause 33 of the bill be amended as follows; -

- a) by deleting the word **“Select Committee”**

CLAUSE 34

THAT, Clause 34 of the Bill be amended as follows; -

- (i) By inserting a new clause before clause 34 to read as follows; -
 - “34. All monies under this Act shall be administered in accordance with the Public Finance Management Act, 2012”**

CLAUSE 41

THAT Clause 41 of the Bill be amended as follows; -

- (i) By deleting the words **“five years”** and substituting thereof with **“fifteen years”**
- (ii) By deleting the words **“five million”** and substituting thereof with **“fifteen million”**

II. The Assembly resolved on Wednesday, 17th February, 2026 as follows: -

- a) THAT,** each speech in a debate on **Bills** sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.
- b) THAT,** each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:-A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.
