8. *. **MOTION** – (Hon. Caroline Muga, MCA)

THAT, aware that the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), is the most complete statement of children’s rights ever produced and is the most widely-ratified international human rights treaty in history, ratification which Kenya is party to; noting that the Convention has 54 articles that cover all aspects of a child’s life and set out the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights that all children everywhere are entitled to and also explains how adults and governments must work together to make sure all children enjoy all their rights; deeply concerned that ensuring child rights in Kenya is still a challenge, 26 years after ratification of the treaty, and efforts by the State to enforce these rights has not been sufficient as evidenced by rampant cases of abuse and neglect; Children Act, 2001 states that it is the duty of local authority, in this case the County Government, to safeguard and promote the right and welfare of children within its jurisdiction; recognizing that if County Governments do not supplement efforts to address Child Rights

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by National Government the implementation of the UNCRC charter will remain a mirage; Considering the huge mandate that the Nairobi City County has in respect to the Children, this Assembly urges that the Nairobi City County Executive Committee and Nairobi City County Public Service Board to move with speed and establish a full-fledged Children's Department to work hand in hand with National Government agencies in ensuring the protection of Child rights and related concerns within Nairobi City County.

9. *. MOTION – (Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Agriculture, Environment & Natural Resources)

THAT, this Assembly adopts **THE REPORT OF THE SECTORAL COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE, ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES ON THE STATUS OF WASTE MANAGEMENT WITHIN NAIROBI CITY COUNTY**, laid on the Table of the Assembly on Wednesday 10th February, 2016.

10. *. MOTION – (Hon. Alex Otieno, MCA)

THAT, aware that the Nairobi City County has the potential to collect revenue upwards of Kshs 4 billion per month as demonstrated by the Governor during a recent breakfast meeting with Members of the County Assembly; noting that the Nairobi County e-payment system, the first cash-light system for a county government in Kenya, is yet to make significant impact due to man-made leakages at collection points; deeply concerned that the continued revenue leakage at various collection points is mostly through theft or inaction by County Employees charged with overseeing collection at those points; recognizing that some employees within the revenue collection chain have overstayed their deployment at specific postings, thus possibly building cartel like networks that protect and promote the leakage and wastage; this Assembly urges the County Executive to transfer with immediate effect employees in the revenue collection chain who have stayed at a posting for at least three years and adopt such practice going forward to prevent the formation of cartel like revenue leakage avenues by County employees.

NOTICES**I. Assembly resolved on Wednesday, February 10, 2016 as follows:-**

THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 94(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:- A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Sectoral Committee, in that Order.

II. Assembly resolved on Wednesday, February 10, 2016 as follows:-

THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 94(4), this Assembly orders that, each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, a Sessional Paper or any other Report submitted to the Assembly, be limited as follows: - A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.
