### 2.0. PROCEEDINGS OF THE RETREAT

### 2.1. Presentations by the Facilitator.

The Facilitator took the Committee through an in-depth induction of the establishment, and mandate of the Committee as follows: -

### 2.1.1. Establishment and role of the Committee

Borrowing from the National Parliament experience, the formation of the committee was informed on the basis that before the establishment of the Committee, Members of Parliament had a lot of unresolved issues regarding services and facilities offered by Parliament to its Members this prompted the House leadership to create a platform through which members channel their views to the parliamentary service commission.

Concerning County Assemblies, Section 12(7) of the County Governments Act mandates the Nairobi City County Assembly Service Board with among other things, to provide services and facilities as are necessary for the efficient and effective functioning of the County Assembly. The County Assembly has a wide range of Members' facilities including but not limited to: buildings, parking bays, grounds, gymnasium, offices, office equipment (such as computers and photocopying facilities), office furniture and fittings, committee rooms and that the Nairobi City County Assembly Service Board has an enormous task of ensuring that the said facilities are not only well maintained but also well attended to.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 12(7) of the County Governments Act, the Board extends an array of services to Members such as cleaning services, telephone services, printing services, medical services, catering services, security services, ICT services, library services, catering services, mortgage and car loan facilities and therefore the Nairobi City County Assembly Service Board, again, has duty of ensuring the services are not only readily available but ensuring they are of a quality that the Members would expect.

The Committee recognizes that, for Members to be effective and efficient in their constitutional tasks, they must be equipped with the necessary facilities and services. It was therefore important for the Committee to undertake this workshop to

understand the mandate of the Committee and to know how the services and facilities in the County Assembly could be improved.

### 2.1.2. Nexus between the Committee on Members' Services and Facilities and the County Assembly Service Board.

The Nairobi City County Assembly Service Board is established pursuant to Section 12 of the County Government Act. Under Section 12(7), the Board is mandated among other things to; -


- a) Provide services and facilities to ensure the efficient and effective functioning of the county assembly;
- b) Constitute offices in the county assembly service, and appointing and supervising office holders;
- c) Prepare annual estimates of expenditure of the county assembly service and submitting them to the county assembly for approval, and exercising budgetary control over the service;
- d) Undertake, singly or jointly with other relevant organizations, programmes to promote the ideals of parliamentary democracy; and performing other functions.

The Committee was informed that the following were some of their entitlements; gratuity, insurance, mortgage & car loan facilities, medical services, ICT services including printing, ward liaison office, catering services and recreational services.

### 2.1.3. Reporting structure

Members were informed that the Committee has 2 two reporting structures;

- Resolutions that require the Speaker to make a communication or ruling can be directed to the Speaker directly;
- b) Reports that require the NCASB to make resolutions and implement on internally;
- c) Reporting by way of report through the County Assembly.



### 2.1.4. Canteen Management

The Chairperson mentioned that they do understand that catering as a service is very essential in facilitating Members of the County Assembly discharge the constitutional duties in an effective and efficient manner. Whilst it is a fact that the canteen in the Assembly has been in existence since 2017, the Committee was concerned that the provision of this service had continued to face challenges in areas such as quality of food, administrative malpractices, financial impropriety and lack of prudency in the management of the catering unit. In light of the above, the Committee set out to examine the extent of the challenges mentioned above with a view to making recommendations to the Assembly.

The Chairperson noted that the Board had resolved that the Committee holds a meeting with staff canteen management to synchronize and develop a framework on how to manage the Assembly canteen.

The Chairperson invited the former canteen management Members to expound how the canteen used to operate who responded as follows: -

i) The Staff canteen management had drafted a Board paper and it contained all the key aspects of managing the canteen.

- ii) The Management used to oversight all operations of the canteen.
- iii) The Chairperson of the canteen used her funds to kick start the canteen since there weren't available funds at that time.
- iv) Each staff canteen had a contract to expiring on 10th August, 2019. However, after the contracts expired, the Board didn't renew their contracts.
- v) On 1st July, 2020 a communication was done reverting the management of the canteen to the Assembly. However it's operation was hampered by the outbreak of Covid-19.
- vi) The Staff were paid as soon as the vouchers signed had been consolidated. The monies would be paid to the Staff Canteen Manager through a cheque via an account opened at Cooperative bank.

In a rejoinder, the facilitator highlighted three methods in which the Committee could implement the operationalization of the canteen: -

a) Creation of a catering fund which shall be managed by a catering committee. The Committee shall recommend use of any monies in the fund. The officer in charge will be accountable for the fund and manage proper of book of accounts.

He mentioned that the fund would ensure that the canteen staff are paid and also improve smooth transition of signatories through the office of the Clerk.

The committee was informed that the fund would boost the operations of the Canteen before it stabilizes to operate on its own.

- b) Outsourcing from various venders who would offer services similar to what the canteen was offering.
- c) Utilizing the (catering, beverages, hospitality and accommodation vote) on the County Assembly budget to purchase supplies and then paying them through the vouchers raised.

### 2.1.5. Members observations/plenary

During plenary, Members made the following observations: -

- i) The Committee rooms require adequate chairs to accommodate Members of the County Assembly, staff and the members of the Public attending committee meetings.
- ii) The library/resource center lacks the necessary resource materials that would be useful for Members and lacks enough space to accommodate readers and research persons.
- iii) That some facilities in the County Assembly are not accessible to persons with disabilities and hence the building does not comply with the requirements of the Nairobi City County Assembly Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.
- iv) There are broken down furniture that are lying in Charter Hall Foyer hence a disaster and wastage in value.
- v) The County Assembly has not set up a lactating mother's station/ crèche. Noting that most of the Assembly Members and staff are of childbearing age.
- vi) The County Assembly has not set up a gymnasium for the Members and staff, which is a very important health facility.
- vii) That the allowances (millage, car grant and mortgage) do not take cognizant of the prevailing market rates.
- viii) The lack of a specific budget for the catering unit may be a cause for the delay in repairs and upgrading of the infrastructure in the canteen.

### 3.0. RECOMMENDATIONS

Following the retreat presentations and plenary session, the Committee made the following recommendations: -

- 1. The NCASB to establish a catering fund, which shall be managed by a catering committee. (see attached proposed Catering Fund Regulation)
- 2. The NCASB to ensure prompt implementation of the House resolutions relating to Members' Services and Facilities.
- 3. The NCASB to consider setting up a gymnasium for both Members and staff.
- The NCASB to extend the Assembly ICT services that includes basic internet research and hardware maintenance through its ICT office to the Ward officers;

- they should also control the access of sites to limit the same to relevant sites only.
- 5. The NCASB to consider engaging the medical service provider in relation the member's views on the capping of the medical cover.
- 6. The existing Committee Rooms to be fitted with extra chairs.
- 7. The NCASB to direct the Directorate Human Resources Office in collaboration with the Directorate of Finance and Accounting Services, the Ward Liaison Office to facilitate members in managing constituency offices by developing guidelines on Member entitlements, sample employment/appointment letter, support staff payroll forms and support staff contract forms.
- 8. The NCASB to consider installing a Catering Information Management to enhance internal controls and boost efficiency in the Catering unit.
- 9. The NCASB to consider employing a Public Health Specialist to be advising on food safety, hygiene and general cleanliness in the Catering unit.
- 10. The NCASB to consider constructing ramps and other equipment for use by persons with disability within County Assembly Buildings in line with the requirements of the Nairobi City County Assembly Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.
- 11. The NCASB to consider an integrated ICT system that tracks members' activities and contributions at Committees and Chambers.
- 12. The NCASB to consider an Integrated Management Security System within County Assembly to facilitate security and safety measures.
- 13. The NCASB to formulate a policy on asset disposal based on the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act No. 33 of 2015 to ensure that any asset not in use is disposed.
- 14. That the NCASB to engage the Salaries and Remuneration Commission on the members' millage allowance, car grant, salaries and allowances of members.
- 15. That the NCASB to consider establishing a lactating mothers station/crèche with adequate facilities and to be manned by a matron with relevant qualifications.
