#### 1.0. PREFACE

Mr. Speaker Sir, the signing of the Deed of Transfer of Functions in February 2020 heralded a new dawn for the County Government as it gave birth to the rolling out of the provisions of Section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 by bringing on board Kenya Revenue Authority as the principal revenue collection agent. The primary intention of this move was to bolster the internal revenue collection figures which have stagnated around the Kshs. 10billion despite various reforms in human resource, financial controls and the required physical infrastructure. Since that signing, the County Assembly has not been able to review the necessary financial laws necessary to fully roll out the desires of the Deed thereby making the agent handicapped in her efforts to achieve the targets set in the annual budgets. The Finance Bill, 2021 aims to correct the previous false starts by ensuring that there is dependable law that is alive to the prevailing dynamics across the County and the Country at large. Having made effort to enact most of the individual legislations on the various revenue streams, the Finance Bill would be focused on amending those legislations in line with the strategic fiscal direction for the current financial year.

Mr. Speaker Sir, the Constitution of Kenya 2010 which establishes the County Governments also grants them powers through Article 209 to impose property rates, entertainment taxes as well as charges for the services they provide. As an oversight entity on the County Executive, the County Assembly Finance, Budget and Appropriations Committee is mandated to ensure that County's revenue raising measures are consistent with the national finance laws while being tools for regulation, control and budget financing. Consideration of Finance Bills by the County Assembly is an activity during which the Committee confirms that the budget passed by the County Assembly has been fully funded but most importantly that budget financing does not limit the County's attractiveness as an investment destination, does not complicate ease of doing business and does not make Nairobians forego their basic needs to pay county dues.

The provisions of Standing Order 199 establish the Finance, Budget & Appropriations Committee with a specific mandate which is to:

a) Investigate, inquire into and report on all matters related to coordination,



control and monitoring of the of the county budget;

- b) Discuss and review the estimates and make recommendations to the County Assembly;
- c) Examine the County Fiscal Strategy Paper presented to the County Assembly;
- d) Examine Bills related to the county budget, including Appropriations Bills; and
- e) Evaluate tax estimates, economic and budgetary policies and programs with direct budget outlay

Mr. Speaker Sir, the County Executive Committee Member for Finance and Economic Planning on 24<sup>th</sup> June 2021 delivered the budget speech in which he pronounced new and enhanced revenue raising measures meant to seal leakages in the revenue chain and provide support to the contemporary systems of revenue collection. On the same date he submitted the draft Finance Bill 2021 which was subsequently drafted in proper format and read for the first time in the County Assembly on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2021, containing the taxation measures announced in the speech. The Bill illustrates the County Government's priorities, which include increasing revenue mobilization and improving service delivery by amending various fees, rates and charges for services, and for other revenue raising measures by the County Government.

Mr. Speaker Sir, this is the third time under the Second County Government that the Select Committee has had the opportunity to interrogate and indeed make recommendations on a Bill meant to influence the budget financing plans. It is noteworthy that the Finance Act, 2018 which was passed by the Committee was declared unconstitutional by the courts hence requiring that the County Governments retreats to the drawing board and re-enact the fees and charges contained therein while taking into account the specific pronouncements of the judgement. In scrutinizing this Bill, the Committee has been keen to ensure that the shortcomings of previous such legislations including the need for adequate public participation do not reoccur and affect the County's inflows going forward.

Mr. Speaker Sir, in the course of the deliberations on the Nairobi City County Finance Bill, 2021 the Committee held sittings with the Officers from the County Treasury led by the County Executive Committee Member for Finance, the Kenya Revenue Authority, the Nairobi Metropolitan Services who were given the opportunity to explain to the Committee the reasoning behind the proposed alterations. The Committee indeed received written submissions from the County Treasury on how best to roll out the revenue raising measures as contained in the budget speech delivered to the County Assembly in June 2021. To further understand some of the issues contained in the written memoranda, the

Committee held physical meetings with specific stakeholders on the Bill.

#### 2.1 KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF THE BILL

- Mr. Speaker Sir, the Committee reviewed the Finance Bill, 2021 together with the submissions from the County Executive Committee Member for Finance, the Nairobi Metropolitan Services, Kenya Revenue Authority, the various stakeholders and members of the public and came up with the following proposals on the respective sections of the Bill.
- 2. Mr. Speaker Sir, in summary the Bill proposes to achieve the following:
  - a) Part II of the Bill intends to amend specific provisions of the Nairobi City County

    Transport Act by harmonizing and updating various fees and charges related to

    parking fees for online taxis, private vehicles and public service vehicles;
  - b) Part III of the Bill intends to amend the Nairobi City County Revenue Act, 2015 with specific focus on fees and charges related to market services for CESS and introduction of fees for traders operating in the informal sector. Further, in line with the new valuation roll, the Bill intends to amend the land rates payable to the County Government. The Section also introduces additional charges related to public health services touching on various tests, water services, food handling and hygiene, Covid testing, research and internship costs, inspection costs, occupation certificates, laboratory costs as well as various certificates charged on food selling establishments;
  - c) Part IV of the Bill intends to introduce costs for transportation of building materials as well as various costs related to the use of the library.
  - d) Part V concerns itself with amendments to the Nairobi City County Trade Licensing Act, 2020 to increase level of compliance, make payment for trade licenses timely and predictable as well as introduce penalties for defaulters.
  - e) Part VI on amendments to the Nairobi City County Betting Lotteries and Gaming Act 2021 intends to update the various fees and charges related to betting and gaming while being alive to the roles of the National Government and the County Government as per the court ruling on the same.
  - f) Part VII of the Bill purposes to align the Nairobi City County Disaster Management Act, 2015 by sharpening it as a tool for revenue enhancement. In this regard there



is proposed amendment of various fees and charges related to fire for shops, plant industries, petroleum tankers, petrol stations, LPG Bulk storage and banking institutions.

- g) Part VIII contains various amendments on outdoor advertising including decorations, internal adverts in PSVs, message vetting, festive decorations among others.
- h) Part IX of the Bill introduces various for those who wish to engage the county team in the process of garbage collection as well as tipping charges at weighbridges, charges for CBOs and Private Service Providers.
