

Report of the Sectoral Water & Sanitation on the Vetting of One (1) County Chief Officer Nominee - December,

1.0. FORWARD

Pursuant to Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012, **H.E. the Governor, Hon. Sakaja Arthur Johnson** nominated and forwarded the names of the following persons to the Assembly for vetting and approval for appointment as Chief Officers for various Departments.

The nomination of the thirty three (33) persons was conveyed to the Assembly vide a letter Ref. NCC/GOV/Legal/438/2022 dated 8th December, 2022. On Tuesday 13th December, 2022 and pursuant to Standing Order 45(1), the Honorable Speaker read the message from His Excellency the Governor to the Assembly communicating the names of the nominees. Pursuant to Standing Order 48 read together with Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 the names of the nominees were referred to the relevant Sectoral Committees for vetting and reporting to the Assembly within twenty-one (21) days.

Consequently, pursuant to Section 7(4) and 7 (5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the local dailies, specifically the Daily Nation and Standard Newspaper on Wednesday 14th December, 2022, inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (*sworn affidavits*) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominees in conformity with Article 196 (b) of the Public Participation Act. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Tuesday, 20th December, 2022.

Further, in the fulfilment of the provisions of Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assembles Approvals) Act, 2017, the Clerk notified the general public that the approval hearings of the nominees would be held on 22nd December, 2022.

Having conducted the approval hearing of the nominees pursuant to Article 179(2)(b) of the Constitution, Section 7(4) and 7 (5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 209(6)(f) the Committee recommends that the House-

 approves the nomination of Oscar Omoke Ocholla for appointment as County Chief Officer for Water and Sewerage by His Excellency the Governor.

May I take this opportunity to thank Members of the Committee for their input and valuable contributions during the deliberations and vetting exercise. The Committee also takes this opportunity to thank the Offices of the Speaker and of the Clerk of the County Assembly for the logistical support accorded to it during the vetting exercise. 2.0 PREFACE

2.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

- 1. Section 14 (3) of the County Governments Act, 2012 provides that when a County Assembly considers any appointment for which its approval is required under the Constitution, an Act of Parliament or county legislation, the appointment shall be considered first by a committee of the County Assembly.
- The Sectoral Committee on Water and Sanitation is established under Standing Order No. 209 (1). Its mandate pursuant to Standing Order 209 (6) is to:
 - a) investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;
 - b) study the programme and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
 - c) study and review all county legislation referred to it;
 - d) study, assess and analyse the relative success of the departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with its stated objectives;
 - e) investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;
 - f) vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 202(Committee on Appointments): and make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation
- 3. Section 10(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval)

 Act, 2017 (No. 5 of 2017) provides thus:-

"Where the nomination of a candidate is rejected by a County Assembly, the appointing authority may submit to the relevant County Assembly the name

of another candidate, and the procedure for approval specified in this Act shall apply accordingly."

3.0 BACKGROUND

3.1. Notification of Nominations

- 4. Section 45 (1) (a) and (b) of the County Governments Act, 2012, provides for the Governor's power to nominate Chief Officers, with the approval of the Assembly, from among persons who are not members of the County Assembly.
- 5. A letter from the Office of the Governor dated 8th December, 2022, addressed to the Speaker of the County Assembly indicated that pursuant to section 45 (1) (a) and (b) of the County Governments Act, 2012, H.E. the Governor, Hon. Sakaja Arthur Johnson had nominated thirty three (33) nominees to be considered for approval by the County Assembly for appointment as Chief Officers of the ten Sectors.
- 6. On Tuesday, 13th December, 2022, the Honourable Speaker in a Message to the Assembly informed the Assembly that his office had received the names of the thirty three (33) nominees, and directed that the names and curriculum vitae of the said nominees be referred to the various Select and Sectoral Committees for vetting and reporting to the Assembly pursuant to Standing Order 203 (6) (f) and Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017(No. 5 of 2017).

3.2 Notification to the House and referral to the Sectoral Committee on Water and Sanitation.

4. Pursuant to Standing Order 45(1), the Honorable Speaker informed the Assembly on 13th December, 2022 that he had received the notification of the nominations. The notification of nomination of the

nominee for Chief Officer responsible for **Water & Sewerage** sector were therefore referred to the Sectoral Committee on Water and Sanitation on 13th December, 2022 for vetting and reporting to the Assembly within 21 days in accordance with Section 9(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act").

3.3 Notification to the Public

- Section 7 (5) and (10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that-, "the committee shall, by notice in at least one newspaper of national circulation, notify the public of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven days prior to the hearing" and "any person may, prior to the approval hearing and by a written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".
- 6. Pursuant to the above provisions of the law, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the in the local dailies, specifically the Standard Newspaper and the Daily Nation Newspaper on Wednesday 14th December, 2022 inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (sworn affidavits) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominees. At the close of business on Tuesday 20th December, 2022, no memoranda contesting the suitability of the nominees for Chief Officers for Water & Sewerage had been received from the public.
- 7. In accordance with the provisions of Article 196 of the Constitution and section 7(5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, the general public was also notified in the local dailies by the Clerk of the County Assembly of the intention of the Sectoral Committee on Water and Sanitation to conduct the vetting and approval hearing of the nominees on **Thursday 22**nd **December, 2022.**

3.4 Notification to the Nominees.

8. On **Wednesday 14th December, 2022**, the Clerk invited the nominees through the print media, for the approval hearings in accordance with Section 7 (4) of the Public Appointments (County Assembles Approvals) Act, 2017.

3.5 Clearance and Compliance Requirements

- 9. To ensure compliance with the provisions of Chapter 6 of the Constitution, the nominee was requested to submit their clearance status with the following institutions for the vetting exercise
 - a) Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA)
 - b) Criminal Investigation Department (CID)
 - c) Higher Education Loans Board (HELB)
 - d) Credit Reference Bureau (CRB) and
 - e) The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC)
- 10. On 14th December, 2022, the Clerk wrote to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) requesting for reports with respect to the nominees on the following matters: -
 - (a) Ethics and integrity;
 - (b) Tax compliance; and
 - (c) Criminal records.
- 11. On the matters of ethics and integrity, the Clerk wrote to Ethics & Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) them vide letter ref NCCA/CCA/VET/12/(02) but no response was received.
- 12. The Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) through a letter DCI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL.XII/17 dated 20th December, 2022 stated that the Police Clearance Certificates issued to the one (1) nominee were genuinely issued and had negative results from both its nominal index and criminal database.

- 13. On the issue of tax compliance, the Clerk wrote to Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) vide letter ref NCCA/CCA/VET/12/(02) but no response was received.
- 14. The clearance by the foregoing institutions was primarily meant to provide information about the nominee on:
 - a) Matters touching on integrity;
 - b) Tax compliance;
 - c) Loan repayments; and
 - d) Presence or absence of criminal records

4.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS OF THE NOMINEE.

- 15. During its Sitting held on **Thursday**, **22**nd **December**, **2022**, at Assembly Committee Room 9, City Hall Buildings from 12:00pm, the Committee conducted face to face interviews of the nominee. The minutes of the vetting proceedings are attached to this report.
- 16. In conducting the approval hearing/vetting process, the Sectoral Committee on Water and Sanitation examined the nominee against the following criteria, amongst others, as set out in the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 5 of 2017
 - i. Academic qualifications.
 - ii. Employment record
 - iii. Professional associations.
 - iv. Potential conflict of interest.
 - v. Knowledge of the relevant subject.
 - vi. Overall suitability for the position.
 - vii. Tax compliance.
 - viii. Integrity.

4.2 MR. OSCAR OMOKE OCHOLLA - CHIEF OFFICER NOMINEE FOR THE WATER & SEWERAGE

17. Mr. Oscar Omoke Ocholla, the nominee for Water & Sewerage appeared before the Committee on Thursday 22nd December, 2022 and was vetted under oath. The Committee noted the following: -

Date and Place of Birth

18. The nominee is a male Kenyan born on 26th October, 1976 in Starehe, Nairobi County.

Academic and Professional Qualifications

19. He is currently pursuing a Master of Arts Political Science and Public Administration from University of Nairobi.

He holds a Bachelor of Arts, Political Science from the Maseno University.

Employment Record

20. He is currently the Managing Director, Cyclar Logistics – in charge of development and implement sustainable business. He previously worked with the National Health Insurance Fund (NHIF) in various capacities as Deputy Branch Manager, Nairobi Area, Head of Compliance, Nairobi Area and Inspector. He has also served as Board of Management at Ngeere High School.

Income and net worth

21. The nominee estimated his net worth to be **Kshs. 30 million** with the source of income being salary as the Managing Director Cylscar Logistics.

Potential Conflict of Interest

22. The nominee declared that he currently does not have any persons or matter that would present any potential conflict of interest should he assume the position of Chief Officer Water & Sewerage.

Probono/Charity Work

23. The nominee has undertaken a free medical camp, food stuff donations to children's home in Langata Constituency in 2017.

Integrity

24. The nominee has neither been charged in a court of law nor mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament, County Assembly or any Commission of inquiry in the last three (3) years. He has also never been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution.

Responses to general and sector specific questions to the nominee

25. The Committee posed several questions to the nominee on his knowledge of the Sector he had been nominated to and his conduct in public and private life. The nominee responded as follows: -

Relevance to the position nominated to

26. He has a track record having worked in a managerial position for over a decade, thereby has vast knowledge in policy formulation and development that would guide the development of Water and Sewerage strategies, guidelines, policies and procedures relevant to Nairobi residents.

Challenges in the Sub- Sector and how he would address those challenges if confirmed to the position

- 27. The nominee highlighted the challenges as follows; That,
 - Rising urban population growth in the City with strained water resource;

 (\cdot, \cdot, \cdot)

- ii. Lack of proper sewer drains within the City especially in low income settlements leading to affluence discharging off openly and in other instances to rivers nearby; and
- iii. Illegal water and sewerage connections.
- 28. He informed the Committee that he would address the challenges as follows;
 - To develop policies that would otherwise deter illegal connections of water pipes and sewer drains thereby enforcing legal mechanisms punishable by law;
 - ii. He would engage stakeholder in both the public and private sector to increase funding to the sub-sector to increase water and sewerage projects and service delivery;
 - iii. Further, the nominee stated that he would bring on board licensing of borehole drilling and ensure regulations of the said boreholes within Nairobi County.

On whether he understood what the sector he has been nominated to serve entails

29. The nominee confirmed that he was aware of the Sector's mandate and that the Sector is key in water distribution, regulation and marketing and sewerage services.

Regarding what experience he was bringing to the position

- 30. The nominee informed the committee as follows
 - i. Having held managerial positions for over 2 decades the nominee would bring on board his technical skills as well as other skills and knowledge achieve over 20 years to better the service delivery of safe water provision and sewerage services within the County.

What can Mwananchi expect to benefit from the above mentioned experience;

31. The nominee informed the committee as follows –

- i. That he would work closely the County Executive Committee Member for Water and Sewerage as well as Members of County Assembly to ensure that residents within Nairobi County get adequate water supply and proper sewer systems.
- ii. Engage stakeholders in both public and private to bring in funding that would enhance service delivery as lack of fund hinder achievement of set targets.
- iii. The nominee will work towards harmonizing various water entities within the County to reduce conflict of interest that otherwise act on overlap of roles.

Regarding navigating the relationship between the roles of the position nominated to and those of the County Executive Committee Members and other County Staff if appointed;

- 32. The nominee stated that he -
 - Stated that as Chief Officer he will be part of the team, responsible for day to day administration of the Water and Sewerage Sub-Sector; and
 - ii. Understands the vital role the County Assembly plays i.e. relationship between himself as a Chief Officer and County Assembly will be understood from the mandate drawn from the County Governments Act and conducting himself in a professional manner, using his expertise to develop a close working relationship with the Assembly.

Regarding handling pressure from family and friends seeking services and favors

- 33. The nominee stated that he
 - i. He would act professionally applying emotional intelligence and within the confines of the law in dealing with pressures. Accordingly, he will rely on due procedure in dealing with friends should such arise.

Regarding Past experiences to Nominees commitment to the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on Leadership and Integrity

- 34. The nominee stated that he
 - i. Has always been guided by integrity and good faith in his work and has never been investigated on any matters of corruption.

On rendering Community Service within the County

- 35. The nominee stated that he -
 - Organizes feeding programmes within low income settlements near his residents. Especially during holidays and more so Christmas holidays

What can residents of Nairobi expect from the Nominee should the Assembly approve his nomination

The nominee stated that he -

i. Committed to servant leadership and diligent.

4.1.1 Committee Observations on the suitability of the nominee

36. The Committee having considered the nominee filled Questionnaire pursuant to Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, his Curriculum Vitae and having heard his oral submission during the vetting exercise made the following observations: on his suitability for appointment as Chief Officer responsible for Water & Sanitation

THAT: -

- 1. The nominee satisfies the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya on leadership and integrity which is a requirement under section 35(3)(c) of the County Governments Act, 2012 in that:
 - i. The nominee has been cleared by the Ethics and Anti-Corruption-Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI),

Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Credit Reference Bureau (CRB).

- ii. The nominee has not been charged in a Court of Law.
- iii. The nominee does not exhibit a potential conflict of interest.
- 2. The nominee meets the requirements of Section 45(1) (a) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 since he:-
 - Exhibited impressive knowledge of topical issues touching on the sub- sector nominated to and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience.
 - ii. He was competently sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board.

5.0. RECOMMENDATIONS

Pursuant to Section 45 (1) (a) and (b) of the County Governments Act, 2012, Section 9 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, and Standing Order No. 209 (6) (f) of the Nairobi City County Assembly Standing Orders, the Committee recommends that the house:-

 approves the nomination of Oscar Omoke Ocholla for appointment as County Chief Officer for Water & Sewerage by His Excellency the Governor.
