

1.0. PREFACE

1.1. Committee Mandates

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The Sectoral Committee on Labour and Social Welfare is established under Standing Order No. 209. Its mandate pursuant to Standing Order 209(6) is to:-

1.3. Committal of the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities (Amendment) Bill, 2023

1.3.1. Background

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities (Amendment) Bill, 2023, was read a First Time on Wednesday, 8th November, 2023, and thereafter committed to the Sectoral Committee on Labour and Social Services for consideration pursuant to Standing Order 135. The bill was sponsored by Hon. Chege Mwaura, MCA. The bill seeks to provide for a legal framework to amend the principal act, the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities Act, 2015, by establishing a fund to be used to support various programs, activities, and needs of persons with disabilities.

Mr. Speaker Sir,

Pursuant to Article 196(b) of the Constitution of Kenya and Standing Order 135(3), which require public participation in the legislative and other business of the Assembly and its Committees, the Committee placed a notice in the local dailies on **Wednesday**, 15th **November**, 2023, calling for any representations and amendments from the public on the bill.

Hon. Speaker,

Article 185 of Kenya's Constitution states that:

- 1) The legislative authority of a County is vested in and exercised by its County Assembly.
- 2) A County Assembly may make any laws that are necessary for or incidental to the effective performance of the functions and exercise of the powers of the County government under the Fourth Schedule; and
- 3) A County Assembly, while respecting the principle of separation of powers, may exercise oversight over the county executive committee and any other county executive organs.

Hon. Speaker,

Further, the County Governments Act, 2012, Sections 21(1) and (2) provide that:

1) A County Assembly shall exercise its legislative power through bills passed by the County Assembly and assented to by the Governor.

Report of the Sectoral Committee on Labour and Social Welfare on the consideration of the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities (Amendment) Bill, 2023 No. 7 of 2023 2) A bill may be introduced by any Member or Committee of the County Assembly, but a money bill may be introduced only in accordance with subsection (4).

Further, the Committee also identified key stakeholders in the subject matter of the bill and invited them to either submit their comments or attend a public participation meeting at Charter Hall or City Hall Buildings where they could give their views on the bill. Following the notice and the invitations, the Committee received written memoranda from the below-listed stakeholders.

- i) Gender and Inclusivity Sub-Sector;
- ii) Amka Africa Justice Initiative
- iii) University of Nairobi African Women Studies Centre;
- iv) Shining Hope for Communities Urban Network;
- v) Kenya National Association of the Deaf (KNAD)
- vi) Down Syndrome Society of Kenya;
- vii)Free a Girls World Network; and
- viii) AHADI Governance and Research Consultancy.

Hon. Speaker,

The Committee held three (3) meetings and a retreat to consider the bill and all representations received. The stakeholders who presented memoranda were in agreement with the bill, although they proposed amendments to various clauses.

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The Committee proposed amendments to the bill in Clauses 4 and 5. The amendments are aimed at ensuring that the enactment of the bill will occasion additional expenditures of public funds, which shall be provided for in the County Government estimates.

2.0. CONSIDERATION OF THE NCC PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2023

2.1. Introduction and Scrutiny of the Bill

Hon. Speaker

The Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities (Amendment) Bill, 2023, was read a First Time on Wednesday, 8th November, 2023, and thereafter committed to the Sectoral Committee on Labour and Social Welfare for consideration pursuant to Standing Order 135.

The proposed law seeks to provide for a legal framework to amend the principal Act, The Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities Act, 2015, by establishing a fund to be used to support various programs, activities, and needs of persons with disabilities.

The proposed law was referred to the Sectoral Committee on Labor and Social Welfare for consideration pursuant to Standing Order 135. The bill was sponsored by Hon. Chege Mwaura, MCA. The Committee held three (3) meetings and a workshop to consider the bill and all memoranda from the public.

Hon. Speaker,

The Committee was briefed on the bill, where Part I, preliminaries, provides for the short title, Part II provides for a new definition, provides for the objectives of the Fund, and provides for the sources of the Fund. Part V sets out the miscellaneous provisions. Whereas Part VI provides for amendment of the Principal Act and the Regulations that will guide the operation of the Fund.

Hon. Speaker

While examining the Bill, the Committee noted the following:

i) The principle objective of the bill is to amend the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities Act, 2015, to establish and administer the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities Fund. The enactment of the bill shall occasion additional expenditure of the public funds, which shall be provided for in the county government estimates.

- Part'I of the bill sets out the preliminary matters with respect to the bill. Preliminaries provide for the short title and commencement. This Act may be cited as the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities (Amendment) Act, 2023.
- iii) Part II: Contains amendments to Section 2 of the Persons with Disabilities Act, 2015. The Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities Act 2015, referred to as the "principal act," is amended in Section 2 by inserting the following new definitions in their proper alphabetical sequence:
 - "Fund" means the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities Fund.
- iv) Part III of the Bill provides that Part VI of the Principal Act be amended in the heading by deleting the entire title and substituting with "Establishment of the Fund" tenure, functions, remuneration, and meetings of the Zonal Climate Changed Sub-Committee
- v) Part IV: Provides for the establishment of the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities Fund. It has proposed a law that contains the establishment of the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities Fund.

The Committee interrogated and made its resolutions to the submissions from the respective stakeholders as contained in the attached matrix.

NOTICE is given that the Chairperson of the Sectorial Committee on Labour and Social Welfare intends to move the following amendments to the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities (Amendment) Bill 2023, at the Committee Stage.

CLAUSE 4

THAT Clause 4 of the Bill be amended as follows; -

- (i) By amending the new Clause 22A Sub- clause (2) paragraph (a) by inserting the words 'People with disabilities' to appear immediately before the word 'board' and deleting the words 'with the approval of the Executive Committee Member for the time being responsible for matters relating to persons with disabilities'
- (ii) By amending the new Clause 22A Sub- clause (2) paragraph (b) by deleting the words 'Chief Officer in charge of' and replacing therefor with the words 'Chief Executive Officer of the board'

CLAUSE 5

THAT Clause 5 of the Bill be amended as follows; -

- (i) By amending the new Clause 22B Sub- clause (1) paragraph (a) subparagraph (iii) by deleting it and replacing it therefor with a new subparagraph (iii) as follows:
 - (iii) Provide vocational and therapy services for persons with disabilities.
- (ii) By amending the new Clause 22B Sub- clause (1) paragraph (a) by inserting a new subparagraph immediately after subparagraph (iv) as follows; -
 - (iv) Improve the existing county owned therapy centers for persons with disabilities.
- (iii) By amending the new Clause 22B Sub-clause (1) paragraph (c) by inserting **new** paragraphs immediately after paragraph (c) as follows; -
 - (ca) Provide infrastructure and equipment support to government learning institutions of persons with disabilities.

(cb) Facilitate economic empowerment through grants that enable persons with disabilities to engage in self-employment.

MIN.022/SC – L&SW/JUNE/2024: ADOPTION OF THE COMMITTEE REPORT ON THE CONSIDERATION OF THE NAIROBI CITY COUNTY PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2023.

The Chairperson took Members through the Committee report on the consideration of the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities (Amendment) Bill, 2023. While considering the Bill, the Committee proposed amendments as follows;

CLAUSE 4

THAT Clause 4 of the Bill be amended as follows: -

- (i) By amending the new Clause 22A Sub- clause (2) paragraph (a) by inserting the words 'People with disabilities' to appear immediately before the word 'board' and deleting the words 'with the approval of the Executive Committee Member for the time being responsible for matters relating to persons with disabilities'
- (ii) By amending the new Clause 22A Sub-clause (2) paragraph (b) by deleting the words 'Chief Officer in charge of and replacing therefor with the words 'Chief Executive Officer of the board'

CLAUSE 5

THAT Clause 5 of the Bill be amended as follows; -

- (i) By amending the new Clause 22B Sub- clause (1) paragraph (a) subparagraph (iii) by deleting it and replacing it therefor with a new subparagraph (iii) as follows:
- (iii) Provide vocational and therapy services for persons with disabilities.

- (ii) By amending the new Clause 22B Sub- clause (1) paragraph (a) by inserting a new subparagraph immediately after subparagraph (iv) as follows; -
- (iv) Improve the existing county owned therapy centers for persons with disabilities.
 - (iii) By amending the new Clause 22B Sub-clause (1) paragraph (c) by inserting new paragraphs immediately after paragraph (c) as follows; -
- (ca) Provide infrastructure and equipment support to government learning institutions of persons with disabilities.
- (cb) Facilitate economic empowerment through grants that enable persons with disabilities to engage in self-employment.

However, the Committee adopted the report on the consideration of the Nairobi City County Persons with Disabilities (Amendment) Bill, 2023 for tabling as proposed by Hon. Joyce Kamau, MCA, and seconded by Hon. Evans Nyangicha, MCA.
