#### 2017/2018 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

This program based budget has been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Public Finance Management (PFM) Act, 2012 and the County Governments Act, 2012. Section 12(7)(c) puts the responsibility to prepare annual financial estimates for County Assemblies on the County Assembly Service Board (CASB). This responsibility has further been delegated to the Clerk of the County Assembly under Section 129(3) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012. These Financial Estimates were discussed and approved by the Nairobi City County Assembly on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2017.

Clause 12 of the second schedule of the PFM Act, 2012 requires that effective 2014/2015 financial year all budgets of the County Governments shall be program based. The concept of Program Based Budgets (PBB) requires expenditures to be based on specific outputs, outcomes and performance indicators based on the core mandate of the particular institution preparing the estimates. The Nairobi City County Assembly's key mandate is primarily Legislation, Oversight and Representation. This mandate forms the key program of the County Assembly out of which several sub-programs, outputs and key performance indicators have been derived.

To better inform the activities planned for the financial year 2017/2018, we have aligned ourselves with the overall vision and the mission statement of the County Assembly as well as its goals, objectives and core values.

#### KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2016/2017 FINANCIAL ESTIMATES

The financial estimates have been prepared in consideration of the expenditure ceilings provided under the County Fiscal Strategy Paper (CSFP) for financial year 2017/2018. The CFSP proposed an expenditure ceiling of Ksh.1.614B for the County Assembly being recurrent of Ksh.1.293B and Ksh.321M for Capital and development.

The total Budget for the County Assembly is Ksh.1,614,185,918 comprising staff emoluments of Ksh.697,300,335, cost of goods and services of Ksh.596,126,583 capital and development of Ksh.320,759,000.

#### A summary of this expenditure has been provided below.

It is noted that the total budget is decreasing by Ksh.87.9M or 5% compared to that of the current financial year, 2016/2017. This is mainly due to a reduction in because the County Assembly is not making any transfers to County Assembly Funds in the coming Financial Year. Further the Commission on Revenue Allocation recommended a reduced revenue allocation for the County Assembly for Financial Year 2017/2018. The reason for reduction was given as reduced earnings for the new Members of the next County Assembly. This reduction cut across all County Assemblies in the Country. There is however a slight increase in Development budget. The increase is occasioned by roll over some activities for conversion of the basement area into committee rooms.

#### Specific Highlights

Some of the Specific Programs that the County Assembly will be undertaking in Financial Year 2017/2018 include;

- 1. Acquisition of Official Residence of the Honourable Speaker.
- 2. Acquisition of a Fire Suppression System for the County Assembly Chambers
- 3. Replacement of the Mace for the new Chamber
- 4. Installation of Ipads in the Chamber for use by Members during sessions
- 5. Rollover projects for Conversion of Basement into Committee Rooms
- 6. Inductions for the new Members of the Second County Assembly.

#### 3. WAY FORWARD

The end of 2016/2017 will mark end of four years since commencement of budgeting under the devolved system of government under the Constitution of Kenya 2010. 2017/2018 will mark the beginning of the fifth year in devolution. Needless to say, devolution has been faced with a myriad of challenges but now the systems have been put in place to ensure that the challenges so far experienced have been addressed. It is therefore expected that Financial Year 2017/2018 will be the beginning of a period when the challenges experienced in the past will be no more and effective service delivery will be made to the benefit of the citizens of Nairobi.

#### **Back Ground**

The Nairobi City County Assembly is established pursuant to section 176 of the Constitution of Kenya. Section 12 (1) of the County Governments Acts establishes the County Assembly Service Board with the responsibility of among others, to prepare annual estimates of expenditure of the County Assembly services and submitting them to the County Assembly for approval and exercising budgetary control over the service.

In doing this the Nairobi City County Assembly has developed its vision and mission statement in order to guide its operations. The 2016/2017 financial estimates have been prepared to achieve the vision and hence the core mandate of the County Assembly.

#### A. Vision

To be the most efficient and effective legislature in promoting good governance

#### B. Mission

To advance economic, social, cultural and political aspirations of the people of Nairobi City County through robust legislation, prudent oversight and responsive representation

#### C. Mandate

To facilitate the Members of the County Assembly to efficiently and effectively fulfill their constitutional mandate in a representative system of government by upholding and ensuring the autonomy of the County Assembly in its corporate relationship with the County Executive and other stakeholders.

#### D. Context of Budgeting Intervention

The County Assembly Service Board's objective is to "facilitate the Members of County Assembly to efficiently and effectively fulfill their constitutional functions in a representative system of government by upholding and ensuring the autonomous status of the County Assembly in its corporate relationship with the County Executive and other stakeholders is maintained". The 2016/2017 financial estimates will focus on the continued legislative, oversight and representation functions.


