REQUEST FOR STATEMENT



Hon. Speaker, Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 47(2)(c), I wish to request a Statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Labour and Social Welfare regarding the continued occupation of the Office of the County Secretary by Mr. Godfrey Akumali in an acting capacity and the implementation of the Judgment delivered by the High Court in Petition No. E480 of 2024.

Hon. Speaker, the High Court in its Judgment in Petition No. E480 of 2024, declared that the continued holding of the Office of County Secretary in an acting capacity exceeding six months and without compliance with the County Governments Act and approval by the County Assembly was unconstitutional and unlawful.

Hon. Speaker, despite the Court's determination public funds may have continued to be expended on salaries, allowances, and other benefits payable to the Acting County Secretary thereby raising concerns regarding compliance with the Court's orders, accountability in the management of public resources and respect for the rule of law.

Hon. Speaker, in the Statement, the Chairperson should inquire into and report on:

- i. The current status of the implementation of the High Court Judgment in Petition No. E480 of 2024 concerning the Office of the County Secretary;
- ii. A detailed report on why Mr. Godfrey Akumali continues to hold or perform the functions of the Office of County Secretary in an acting capacity and under what legal authority;
- iii. A comprehensive report on the total amount of public funds paid to Mr. Godfrey Akumali in salaries, allowances, benefits and any other emoluments while serving in the disputed acting position;
- iv. Whether any public officer has been held accountable for non-compliance with the Court Judgment and for any loss of public funds arising from the unlawful acting appointment; and
- v. The measures being undertaken by the County Executive to ensure that the Office of County Secretary is filled substantively and in full compliance with the Constitution, the County Governments Act and the requirements for approval by the County Assembly.
