5. STATEMENTS - PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER NO. 47 (2) (C).

The following Statement was requested: -

The Hon. Thuo Fiunifiu, MCA requested for a Statement from the Chairperson of the Sectoral Committee on Transport and Public Works regarding the flood menace in the County, and specifically in parts of Runda, Evergreen, Mimosa, Gigiri, Muringa, United Nations Avenue and Runda Garden Estate within Karura Ward.

6. MOTION – SCHOOL BUSINESS PROGRAMME FOR CHILDREN IN INFORMAL SETTLEMENTS

Motion Made and Question Proposed;

THAT, aware that Article 26 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides that every person has the right to life; **FURTHER AWARE THAT** Article 53 (2) of the Constitution states that a child's best interests are of paramount importance in every matter concerning the child; **CONCERNED THAT** many school children especially in informal settlements travel longer distances to access the few available educational facilities that are affordable; **FURTHER CONCERNED THAT** there is increased rate of road accidents involving school going children in Nairobi City County especially those in public schools; **COGNIZANT** of the vulnerability of unaccompanied school children crisscrossing Nairobi highways and busy roads to access the few affordable educational institutions which endangers their lives; **ACKNOWLEDGING THAT** the National Transport and Safety Authority (NTSA) has put in place measures to ensure road safety performance in line with international best practice; noting that Section 62 of the Children Act, 2022 provides that the County Government may in consultation with the National Children Council, establish welfare schemes to provide or facilitate the provision of childcare facilities and programmes for children including children with disabilities; **THIS ASSEMBLY URGES** the County Executive in conjunction with the Ministry of Education, community based organizations other relevant stakeholders to develop a School Busing program to provide an all-inclusive transport services to children from informal settlements to access Government schools and to reduce road accidents.
