2. *MOTION – HON. DANIEL NGENGI, MCA

Subject: Construction, installation and unveiling of a statue in honour of the late Kenneth Matiba

THAT, aware that Article 186 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, and paragraph 5 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provide for the functions and powers of County Government on County transport including county roads, street lighting, public road transport traffic and parking; **further aware** that the Country has since independence been honouring her eminent citizens who have had remarkable contribution to the development of the Republic by not only naming or renaming facilities or roads after them but also unveiling of statues that offer constant reminiscence and recollection of their unique attributes; **observing that** by honouring them in such a manner is a national expression of gratitude for their outstanding deeds; **appreciating that** the County Assembly has in recent times moved to invoke its legislative and representation mandates to pass Motions urging for the recognition of such distinguished and illustrious citizens; **Noting that** there are heroines and heroes who have not only roads/streets named or renamed after them, but also statues unveiled in an elevated act of honour for instance, Dedan Kimathi, Tom Mboya and most recently, Ronald Ngala; **acknowledging that** the late Hon. Kenneth Matiba was among conspicuous persons in the second liberation which culminated into Kenya becoming a multiparty state and the commencement the clamour of the current celebrated Constitution 2010 alongside



former Rt. Hon. Raila Odinga, the late Charles Rubia, the late Martin Shikuku and SC Paul Muite; **further acknowledging that** he has a remarkable record in industrial, hospitality and education sectors, and an accomplished public servant having served as the first indigenous African Permanent Secretary for Education in 1963; Permanent Secretary for Commerce; Chairperson of the Kenya Football Federation from 1974-78; a Member of Parliament for Kiharu constituency; Cabinet Minister for Health; Culture & Social Services; and Transport & Communications; **appreciating that** as a result of his distinguished stature in the society of Kenya, he was in 2021 honoured by Nairobi City County Assembly which passed a Motion to have Accra Road renamed after him; **recognizing** that heroes and heroines in whose honour statues have been installed and unveiled have their personalities, character, outstanding abilities and distinguished deeds more accentuated and memorized locally, this **Assembly urges** the County Executive in conjunction with the Nairobi Metropolitan Services to construct, install and unveil the statue of late Kenneth Matiba along the recently renamed Kenneth Matiba Road as an act of elevated honour of the locally and globally celebrated legend of inspirational of the young generation.

Subject: Adoption of the Report

***MOTION – HON. MILLICENT JAGERO, MCA**

Subject: Provide Adolescent and Youth Friendly Health Services

THAT, aware that Article 43 (1) of the Constitution provides that every person has the right to the highest attainable standards of health, which includes the right to health care services, including reproductive healthcare; further aware that Health Services including County Health facilities and primary health care have been devolved to the County Governments pursuant to paragraph 2 of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution; disturbed that the attainment of the foregoing objective remains a challenge given the dire shortage of health workers and equipment within the County; further disturbed that while access and use of high-quality and comprehensive sexual reproductive health services could prevent or mitigate many of the poor health outcomes experienced among adolescents and youth; noting that, a wide range of barriers including socio-cultural and structural barriers prevent young people from accessing these services; acknowledging that the National Government has developed the National Guidelines on Provision of Adolescents and Youth Friendly Services across the Country, this Assembly urges the County Executive in conjunction with the Nairobi Metropolitan Services to:-

1. develop the County Adolescent and Youth Reproductive Health Strategy Paper; and



2. domesticate the National Guidelines for Provision of Adolescents and Youth Friendly Services with necessary modifications to improve availability, accessibility, acceptability and use of quality sexual and reproductive health services by adolescents and youth seeking services in all the County Health facilities within the County.
