THAT, this Assembly adopts THE 6TH REPORT OF THE SELECT COMMITTEE ON COUNTY FINANCE, BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS ON THE COUNTY INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2023-2027 AND THE COUNTY ANNUAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN FY 2023/2024, laid on the Table of the Assembly on Tuesday, 25th April 2023.

Subject: *Adoption of Committee Report*

THAT, this Assembly adopts THE 7TH REPORT OF THE SELECT COMMITTEE ON COUNTY FINANCE, BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS ON NAIROBI CITY COUNTY FISCAL STRATEGY PAPER AND THE DEBT MANAGEMENT STRATEGY PAPER FOR FY 2023/2024 AND OVER THE MEDIUM TERM, laid on the Table of the Assembly on Tuesday, 25th April 2023.

A. *MOTION – HON. PAUL KADOS, MCA – DEPUTY SPEAKER

Subject: *Allocation and Management of Loading Zones*

THAT, aware that Article 209 and 210 of the Constitution grants powers to County Governments to impose, vary or waiver taxes, fees, levies and other charges in order to raise revenues to fund both their recurrent and development programs; **FURTHER AWARE** that, Nairobi City County boasts of several revenue streams key among them being parking fees which include loading zones yet there has been gross underperformance as regards the county's annual revenue collection *vis a vis* its annual expenditure; **NOTING** that, in successive Financial Years, the County Government has continuously lost revenue from loading zones due to non-payment by entities using them i.e. both private and government institutions; **FURTHER NOTING** that, the County Treasury does not have information on the number, location and the designated users/beneficiaries of all loading zones in the City; **CONCERNED** that, the responsible County Government Officers fail to enforce measures aimed at collecting revenue from the loading zones due to compromise, corruption, negligence and a weak legal framework on loading zones;



RECOGNIZING that maximum revenue collection is one of the foundations needed to buttress sustainable economic growth; this Assembly **RESOLVES** that the County Government:-

- i) Identifies, automate and clearly mark all loading zones within the City and submit a comprehensive report on the identified loading zones to this Assembly within sixty (60) days of adoption of this Motion;
- ii) Repossess all loading zones with outstanding balances until the balances are cleared by concerned parties/beneficiaries;
- iii) Develops a legal frame work either in form of a legislative proposal or regulations on allocation and management of loading zones and submit the same to this Assembly for approval within sixty (60) days of adoption of this Motion; and
- iv) Suspend any allocation or renewal of allocated loading zones until the aforementioned legal framework is enacted and/or operationalized.

1. MOTION – HON. SOSPETER MUMBI, MCA

Subject: Programme to train youth on repair of street lights

THAT, aware that County transport including county roads, traffic and parking, street lighting, public road transport is the function of county government under Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution of Kenya 2010; **further aware that** the Nairobi City County Government has invested heavily in installing high mast lights in various parts of the County to improve security in the County; **concerned that** most of the installed high mast lights have been vandalized and some have failed to function thus leaving many parts of the County in darkness for long periods due to poor and/or slow repair and maintenance of the public/street lights; **cognizant that** Nairobi City faces a major insecurity threat due to high rate of youth unemployment; **acknowledging that** the County has plans to light the entire City and turn it into a 24 hour economy, this Assembly urges the County Executive to the develop a programme to identify and train youth in every Ward in repairing and maintenance of public/street lights within the County as a way of improving security and achieving a twenty-four (24) hour economy in the County.
