1. MOTION – HON. SOSPETER MUMBI, MCA

Subject: *Programme to train youth on repair of street lights*

THAT, aware that County transport including county roads, traffic and parking, street lighting, public road transport is the function of county government under Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution of Kenya 2010; **further aware that** the Nairobi City County Government has invested heavily in installing high mast lights in various parts of the County to improve security in the County; **concerned that** most of the installed high mast lights have been vandalized and some have failed to function thus leaving many parts of the County in darkness for long periods due to poor and/or slow repair and maintenance of the public/street lights; **cognizant that** Nairobi City faces a major insecurity threat due to high rate of youth unemployment; **acknowledging that** the County has plans to light the entire City and turn it into a 24 hour economy, this Assembly urges the County Executive to the develop a programme to identify and train youth in every Ward in repairing and maintenance of public/street lights within the County as a way of improving security and achieving a twenty-four (24) hour economy in the County.

1. MOTION – HON. DIANA KATILE MWANGANGI, MCA

Subject: *Preventive and mitigation measures against cancer lifestyle and other malignant diseases*

THAT aware that Article 43 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for among other matters, the right to the highest attainable standard of health which includes the right to affordable health care services; **further aware** that Paragraph 2 of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provide for the functions of the County Government which include County health services including promotion of primary health care; **cognizant that** lifestyle diseases such as cancer, diabetes, hypertension among other diseases have been on the rise within the County due to lack of proper and adequate preventive programmes and strategies; **noting that** primary prevention and screening for chronic diseases are considered as the best strategies to curtail the rise of these malignant diseases; **concerned that** a significant percentage of the residents of Nairobi City County are economically disadvantaged thus may not afford the cost of screening services; **further concerned that** continuous absence of preventive programmes and strategies is likely to transfer economic burden of the chronic diseases to an already financially constrained population or exacerbate the prevalence of the diseases; this Assembly urges the County Executive to:-

- i. Initiate an annual programme for screening of lifestyle chronic diseases such as cancer, diabetes, hypertension in all wards at affordable fees or at no cost; and
- ii. establish a prevention and mitigation programme against lifestyle chronic diseases including awareness campaigns, sensitization forums and other sustainable measures in all Wards.

MOTION – HON. ANTONY KIMEMIA GATHUMBI, MCA

Subject: *a special audit on the compliance and operations of the Built Environment and Urban Planning Sector to revamp the Sector*

THAT, aware that paragraph 8 of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for the functions of the County Governments which include Planning, Housing and land survey and mapping; **further aware** that the Nairobi City County Urban Planning and Housing Department has suffered critical management issues, organizational deficiencies and unfavorable socio-economic conditions that have led to poor urban planning and development; **concerned that** lack of efficient enforcement of building and planning legal framework has led to environmental degradation, haphazard physical developments, increased levels of pollution across Nairobi and disasters such as collapse of buildings; **further concerned** that the Sector of Lands, Urban planning, Urban



renewal, Housing and Projects Management is understaffed and the available officers are not adequately facilitated to undertake their duties which may have contributed to increasing disasters where Nairobi residents have lost their lives and property due unscrupulous, substandard buildings and construction works approved by the Sector; **noting** that even with such blatant failure, no one has been held responsible to date for the endless disasters that bedevil the City due to lack of accountability within the planning Department that fuels approval of substandard and illegal construction works except knee jerk reactions of interdictions and dismissals; realizing that if nothing is done urgently to revamp the Sector, the City risks continued avoidable loss of lives through disasters, this Assembly **resolves** that the County Executive in conjunction with the Office of the Auditor-General to conduct a special audit on the compliance and operations of the Built Environment and Urban Planning Sector with a view to establishing an effective, efficient and reliable department that can better plan and organize the City and report within six (6) months upon approval of this Motion.
