Subject: *Adoption of Report*

THAT, this Assembly adopts THE REPORT OF THE SECTORAL COMMITTEE ON LAND, PLANNING AND HOUSING ON INQUIRY ARISING FROM A STATEMENT REGARDING ILLEGAL DEMOLITION OF RESIDENTIAL HOME BUILT ON LAND LR. NO. 1870/111/46 AND IRREGULAR ACQUISITION OF THE SAME BY LARIAK PROPERTIES IN SCHOOL LANE, PARKLANDS HIGHRIDGE WARD, laid on the Table of the Assembly on Thursday, 15th June 2023.

Subject: *Building Plans to have adequate parkings for tenants*

THAT, aware that Article 186 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, and paragraph 5 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provide for the functions and powers of County Government on County transport including regulation of county roads, street lighting, public road transport traffic and parking; further aware that Paragraph 8 of part two of the Forth Schedule of the Constitution, 2010 provides for county planning and development including housing as a County function; acknowledging that recent years have witnessed increased development of residential apartments within the County and more so in informal areas; concerned that most residential buildings were built with inadequate parking spaces for the tenants; further concerned that most tenants have opted to parking their vehicles on the road reserves and pavements thus blocking other motorists, this has contributed to increased traffic snarl up in some residential areas in the County especially during rush hours, this Assembly urges the County Executive to develop regulations to provide for all building plans for residential buildings to have adequate parking spaces for tenants.

1. MOTION – HON. SOSPETER MUMBI, MCA

Subject: *Establishment Waste Collection and Management Saccos*

THAT, aware that Article 42 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for the right of every person to a clean and healthy environment; **FURTHER AWARE** that solid waste management which is a function of the County Government remains a serious challenge to the Nairobi City County Government and residents; **CONCERNED** that the implementation of waste management faces numerous challenges ranging from inadequate capacity to handle the challenge, corruption within and beyond the County Government, cartels and lethargic nature of County staff and citizenry faced with apathy and collective irresponsibility for waste management; **ACKNOWLEDGING** that solid waste is an emerging health threat to both levels of government and underscoring its effect on the lives of the people living in Nairobi, the environment and well-being of the city; **FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGING** that the County Government enacted the Nairobi City County Solid Waste Management Act, 2015 whose operationalization has not been realized, this **Assembly urges** the County Executive to urgently develop the Solid Waste Management Regulations pursuant to Section 38 of the Nairobi City County Solid Waste Management Act, 2015 to provide for establishment of Waste Collection and Management Saccos in every Ward in order for them to be registered and authorized to collect garbage in an organized manner across the City.
