#### 1. \* MOTION – HON. PERPETUA MPONJIWA, MCA

Subject: Regulation of Airbnb Services within the County

THAT, aware that paragraph 8 of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for County planning and development including housing as a function of the County Government; further aware that paragraph 7 of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for trade development and regulation including local tourism as a function of the County Government; acknowledging that recent years have witnessed increase of housing services as Airbnb which hosts rent on a short term basis to travellers such as tourists within the County; concerned that recent months have witnessed cases of surging femicide in Airbnbs across the Country especially in Nairobi City County with scanty information on the perpetrators made available to the relevant authorities; further concerned that Airbnb properties which were originally designed for family vacations and accommodations similar to hotels, are being exploited for criminal activities and parties amongst other vices. This has put the lives of young women especially college and university students at risk; noting that the increasing cases of femicide in Airbnbs has vast negative impact in the society and hinders promotion of local tourism within the County; further noting that the National Government through the Ministry of Tourism is in the process of regulating the operations of Airbnbs across the Country, this Assembly urges the County Executive in liaison with the Ministry of Tourism to develop rules and guidelines on establishment, licensing, operations and management of Airbnb properties within the County.

# 1. MOTION – HON. KENNEDY SWAKA, MCA

Subject: School Busing Program for Children in informal Settlements

**THAT,** aware that Article 26 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides that every person has the right to life; **further** aware that Article 53 (2) of the Constitution



states that a child's best interests are of paramount importance in every matter concerning the child; concerned that many school children especially in informal settlements travel longer distances to access the few available educational facilities that are affordable; further concerned that there is increased rate of road accidents involving school going children in Nairobi City County especially those in public schools; cognizant of the vulnerability of unaccompanied school children crisscrossing Nairobi highways and busy roads to access the few affordable educational institutions which endangers their lives; acknowledging that the National Transport and Safety Authority (NTSA) has put in place measures to ensure road safety performance in line with international best practice; noting that Section 62 of the Children Act, 2022 provides that the County Government may in consultation with the National Children Council, establish welfare schemes to provide or facilitate the provision of childcare facilities and programmes for children including children with disabilities, this Assembly urges the County Executive in conjunction with the Ministry of Education, Community-based organizations other relevant stakeholders to develop a School Busing program to provide an all-inclusive transport services to children from informal settlements to access Government schools and to reduce road accidents.
