1. MOTION – HON. MARK MUGAMBI MACHARIA, MCA – MINORITY WHIP

Subject: *Renovation of Bus Station terminus*

THAT, aware that public transportation is a critical component of the County's economy and by extension, the Country's micro and macroeconomics since it facilitates the movement of people, goods and services. **NOTING THAT** the Fourth Schedule of Constitution of Kenya 2010 apportions public transport, parking, traffic management to County Government; **APPRECIATING THAT** in order to endeavor to bring order in public transport, parking and traffic management, the Assembly passed the Nairobi City County Transport Act, 2017 which is a progressive and transformative piece of legislation if implemented. **FURTHER APPRECIATING THAT** in the said Act, the County Government is required to designate termini for use by public transport vehicles operating within the County and long distance vehicles. In the Gazette Notice No. 4479 dated 12th May 2017 by the County Government, Bus Station, terminus was designated as a public transport facility (terminus) to be used by public service vehicles in specified within the County; **REGRETTING THAT** over time, bus station terminus has been in state of neglect and the facility has illegally been occupied by traders who have contributed to deterioration of its condition by erecting illegal and invasive structures; **ACKNOWLEDGING THAT** together with other public transport facilities, Bus Station terminus can immensely contribute to reduction of public transport disorder in the County if rehabilitated and properly ordered and that the County can benefit through optimized revenue collection that can be deployed to priority development areas. **DISTURBED THAT** should the County leave Bus Station terminus in the current state of despair without remedy, it will lose its significance of facilitating ease of movement of people, goods and services within the County. **NOW THEREFORE**, this Assembly resolves that:

- a) The County Executive closes down the Bus Station terminus for the purposes of carrying out comprehensive renovations and thereafter implement measures for orderly operations of public transportation;
- b) The County Executive to issue an adequate public notice notifying the planned closure for renovations and put in place temporary picking and drop off measures for public transport vehicles that are currently using the facility; and
- c) That upon completion of the rehabilitation exercise, the County Executive to ban all trading activities within the station so that it is exclusively for activities related to public transportation.

MOTION – HON. JOHN REX OMOLLEH, MCA

Subject: Operationalization of the Nairobi City County Outdoor Advertising and Signage Control and Regulation Act of 2018 and Development of Regulations to ban adverts on electricity poles, public walls across the County

THAT, aware that Part Two of the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for the functions of the County Governments which include control of air pollution, noise pollution, other public nuisances and outdoor advertising; further aware that the County Assembly passed the Nairobi City County Outdoor Advertising and Signage Control and Regulation Act, 2018 which provides for the regulation of outdoor advertisement and signage within the County; **concerned that** there are several adverts and posters erected in various public places such as electricity poles, streetlight poles, public walls and buildings, which has not only affected the aesthetics of the City but have not complied with the Nairobi City County Outdoor Advertising and Signage Control and Regulation Act, 2018; **further concerned** that the County Assembly passed the Nairobi City County Outdoor Advertising and Signage Control and Regulation Act, 2018 which has not been published, publicized and operationalized to date; noting that Section 7 (I) of the Nairobi City County Office of the County Attorney Act, 2017 provides that the County Attorney shall publish all legislation passed by the County Assembly, this Assembly resolves that:-

1. The County Attorney to publish the Nairobi City County Outdoor Advertising and Signage Control and Regulation Act, 2018 within fourteen (14) days after the adoption of this Motion; and
2. County Executive Committee Member responsible for Urban Planning to develop Regulations pursuant to the provisions of Section 27 of the said Act to provide for a ban on illegal adverts and posters erected in various public places such as electricity poles, streetlight poles, public walls and buildings across the County.

1. MOTION – HON. MARK MUGAMBI, MCA – MINORITY WHIP

Subject: Regulation of Temporary Street Businesses

THAT, aware that Nairobi City County being the Capital City is the major entry point to the country and a major regional hub for business and tourism and that it presents the first image to guests visiting the country; **APPRECIATING THAT** globally, conduct of business recognized avenue for improvement of quality of life and a major contributor to revenue governments so long as such business is compliant to the governing laws of the country and County; **ACKNOWLEDGING THAT** Nairobi City County is a home to very industrious citizens a majority of who earn a living through provision of services and sale of goods to others and that in doing so, the County benefits through collection of fees and levies that are used in provision of services and development in priority areas; **CONCERNED THAT** the continued permission and licensing of business owners operating on temporary basis, such as shoeshines, confectionary, eggs and smoky vendors, to operate at unauthorized areas such as pavements, walk ways and roundabouts cause inconvenience to movement of pedestrians and encourages disorder in the Central Business District; **NOW THEREFORE**, this Assembly resolves that the County Executive designates vending zones in the backstreets pursuant to the Nairobi City County Pop up Markets and Street Vendors Act, 2021 for operation of the said temporary businesses and gives a vacation order requiring them to operate only in the designated spaces within the Central Business District.
