MOTION – HON. WAITHERA CHEGE, MCA

Subject: *Amendment of Urban Housing Renewal and Regeneration Policy*

THAT, aware that Article 43(1) (b) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides for the right of every person to accessible and adequate housing and to reasonable standards of sanitation; **further aware** that paragraph 8 of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides for the functions of County planning and development including housing are vested in the County Government; noting that Nairobi City County Government owns various estates in various parts of the County such as Jamhuri in Woodley, Ngara, Huruma, Jericho amongst others; **concerned that** most these estates are in dilapidated conditions and are lacking clear management framework; **acknowledging that** the County has initiated the urban renewal program aimed at developing decent affordable housing units particularly in the County owned estates; **further acknowledging** that the County developed the County Urban Housing Renewal and Regeneration Policy which provides for general promotion of housing, this Assembly urges the County Executive to amend the existing County Urban Housing Renewal and Regeneration Policy to provide for the management of County Government owned estates including maintaining best practices in Estate Management, maintain and update a comprehensive County Government Housing inventory and protect County Government ownership its properties.

***MOTION – HON. HELLEN AWUOR OKELLO, MCA**

Subject: *Regulation of Borehole Water Vendors*

THAT, aware that Article 43 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for the right of every person to access clean and safe water in adequate quantities;



further aware that paragraph 11 (b) of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provides for County public works and services including water and sanitation services as a function of the County Government; **Cognizant** that Nairobi City County Government regulates the operations of the Nairobi City Water & Sewerage Company Limited in provision of clean and accessible water to its residents; **concerned** that the water supplied by the Nairobi City Water and Sewerage Company Limited is not sufficient to serve the ever growing demand by the Nairobi residents; **further concerned** that there are private borehole water vendors that supply water to the City residents without any clear legal framework for their operations; **disturbed** that majority of borehole water vendors sell untreated water from illegal boreholes in some estates which is a health hazard thus exposing residents to several diseases such as typhoid and cholera, this Assembly resolves **THAT:-**

1. The County Executive Committee Member in charge of Water & Sanitation through the relevant authority commence the process of registration of all borehole water vendors in Nairobi City County and forward a detailed database for each Ward to this Assembly within sixty (60) days from the date of adoption of this Motion; and
2. The County Executive Committee Member in charge of Water & Sanitation develops a policy to guide the operationalization of borehole water vendors within Nairobi City County.

MOTION – HON. SOSPETER MUMBI, MCA

Subject: *Provision of free clean drinking water in hotels and restaurants and other public areas*

THAT, aware that Article 43 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for the right of every person to access clean and safe water in adequate quantities; **further aware** that paragraph 11 (b) of Part Two of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution provides for County public works and services including water and sanitation services as a function of the County Government; **cognizant** that the County has various public areas that were designed to provide free clean drinking water to residents within the County; **concerned** that such designated areas stalled and are no longer in operation the word “Nairobi” which comes from the Maasai phrase ‘Enkare Nyrobi’, which translates to “cool water”; **further concerned** that most hotels and restaurants do not provide free clean, drinking water to their customers; **acknowledging** that County water and sanitation services includes county-specific water and sanitation asset development, asset management and related water supply and sanitation service provision for the realization of the human right to water and reasonable sanitation standards in the County, this Assembly urges the County Executive to:-

1. Rehabilitate the existing stalled public points designed to provide free and clean drinking water to the residents of Nairobi City County; and



2. Develop regulations compelling hotels and restaurants across the County to provide free and clean drinking water to clients at their premises.
